

General Information for EC Extended Day and Auxiliary Programming

ABOUT THIS DOCUMENT

This catalog is designed to allow families in the Early Childhood Grades (Pre-Kindergarten, Junior Kindergarten & Kindergarten) to be aware of all of the Extended Day and Auxiliary Programs available for their children. Additionally, this catalog provides families with extensive information regarding the pilot of our new Early Childhood Enrichment Program for the 2019-2020 school year. Details about all options for families in the Early Childhood Program outside of the regular school day and school calendar are found within. Any questions should be directed to ECenrichment@whschool.org.

EARLY CHILDHOOD ENRICHMENT PACKAGE

The New Early Childhood Enrichment Program includes enrichment classes for students in Pre-Kindergarten, Junior Kindergarten and Kindergarten Mondays through Thursdays. *In the Winter & Spring, an add-on class is also available for Fridays. This program is all inclusive with a fee of \$2,500 for the year or \$900 for the season. Classes will change by season (Fall, Winter & Spring). Students in the Early Childhood Program benefit from programming specifically tailored to their age and developmental needs. Registration can be completed at whschool.org/ECafterschool. Class paths are filled on a first-come, first-served basis. In order to assure appropriate student-teacher ratio, classes are capped with a minimum of 3 students and a maximum of 12.

BEFORE CARE

Before School Care is an option for students on an as needed basis. Please inquire with Mrs. Kathy Marikakis in the Lower School Office regarding Early Care.

EXPLORERS PROGRAM

The Explorers after-school program is for students in grades Pre-Kindergarten, Junior Kindergarten and Kindergarten. Explorers offers a variety of activities including music, art, story time, hands-on science and technology, and outdoor play in our facilities which are especially designed for our youngest children. A healthy snack is provided for students daily. The program runs from **2:45pm** (Early Childhood Dismissal) **until 5:00pm**. Children who need to extend the day beyond 5:00pm will be taken to the Encore program. The Explorers Program is free to all Early Childhood students at Wardlaw+Hartridge.

Registration can be completed at whschool.org/explorers. This form serves as registration <u>and</u> our emergency contact form for the Explorers Program.

ENCORE PROGRAM

The Encore program is open every school day from 3:00pm until 6:30pm. The program is for students in Grades 1 through 8. Any Explorers students who remain after 5:00pm will join the Encore program. Encore provides a safe, healthy and developmentally appropriate program for those students who remain at school after regular dismissal. There is scheduled time to do homework, have a snack and have indoor/outdoor play. All students are provided with a snack, yet they may bring an additional snack if they are staying through to 6:30pm (no peanuts, please). The Director of the Encore Program also plans regular activities for Encore students. The fee for the Encore program is \$5.00 per half hour. Children should be signed up in advance, whenever possible, so that adequate staffing needs can be planned. Any students enrolled in the Early Childhood Enrichment Package are provided with Encore care as a part of their registration. Late fees apply after 6:30pm at \$1 per minute.

Registration can be completed at whschool.org/encore. This form serves as registration <u>and</u> our emergency contact form for the Encore Program. The Encore Room is next to the entrance by the Lower School playground. All students must be signed out by an adult on the list of approved adults (indicated on the registration form.)

*It is <u>strongly</u> recommended that ALL families complete an Encore Registration Form in the case of an emergency and your child needs to stay.

SPRING BREAK CAMP

During Spring Break, a minicamp is run during the first week of break for students in Grades K through 5. Hours of the minicamp are 8:00am through 4:00pm. Every day campers do art projects, science projects, cooking activities, play games and recreational sportsChildren also have time for free play and time to socialize with friends. The fee for Spring Break Camp is \$90 per day (Monday – Thursday) and \$100 for Friday or \$450 for the entire week.

CONFERENCE DAYS

Two Parent-Teacher Conference Days are scheduled each year – in December and in March. Classes are not in session on these days; however, Encore provides care during individual Parent-Teacher Conferences.

CAMP FUNSHINE

Camp Funshine provides a safe, nurturing environment for Early Childhood children. The program encourages the growth of social skills, logical thinking, and creativity by engaging students in crafts, indoor and outdoor play, swimming, music, STEM, reading and interactive play. The weekly themes are an extensive study of topics with various activities to support learning throughout the day, resulting in an exceptional experience they will not soon forget! Camp Funshine 2019 ran from **June 24 through August 9** (closed July 4 & 5). Families can choose which weeks to attend. See page **8** for additional information including registration and fees.

EARLY CHILDHOOD ENRICHMENT PACKAGE

The New Early Childhood Enrichment Program includes enrichment classes for students in Pre-Kindergarten, Junior Kindergarten and Kindergarten Mondays through Thursdays. This program is all inclusive with a fee of \$2,500 for the year or \$900 for the season. Classes change by season (Fall, Winter & Spring).

Students in the Early Childhood Program benefit from programming specifically tailored to their age and developmental needs. Courses are chosen based on interest and availability of instructors. Each season, classes are paired with one physically active class and one cognitively stimulating class. This pairing is created with the developmental needs for Early Childhood students in mind.

Students <u>should</u> be enrolled in the Early Childhood Enrichment Package ahead of time. Drop-ins, after the first week of classes, are not permitted. Instructors need sufficient time and information to prepare their class based on their rosters.

Students enrolled in the Early Childhood Enrichment Package are enrolled in <u>both</u> classes for the six-week season session within Option A or Option B. If students are absent from school, they have an excused absence from the Enrichment class. Student absences will not be made up by the instructor. Days off of school will be made up and are built into the calendar.

Yoga is known to be a powerful mechanism for children and adults to help with focus, self-control, physical health and mindful behavior. This yoga class for the youngest students is designed with the Early Childhood age group in mind. Yoga is also a great way to channel that boundless energy. Yoga for the littlest ones is designed specifically with poses, music and breathing techniques that children can recall and do at home as well. Mats and other materials will be provided.

Cooking can be fun and safe for even the youngest chefs. Cooking and baking are really just science experiments that you can eat. Students will have weekly opportunities to become chef-scientists by learning how to follow a recipe, how to take careful measurements, and tasting the fruits of their hard work. Recipes chosen for this class also have a fun element in the "chemical reactions" which students can see live and in-person.

The Chess at Three/Story Time Chess curriculum has been featured in news outlets as an effective program for teaching three, four- and five-year-olds the game and art of chess. It is fun and the story-based curriculum allows students to understand the complexity of the game. At the end of the course, students will know how each piece moves, what each piece likes to do, pieces relationship to one another and the beginnings of playing a game.

Children will laugh and play as they explore the amazing things their bodies can do. We will engage in a variety of creative movement games designed to stimulate a child's imagination and develop and practice gross motor skills. We'll practice balancing, moving to different tempos, and moving through space in novel ways. Children will groove to multicultural rhythms, new and old school jams, and play simple rhythmic instruments. This is a feel good, upbeat class to let the wiggles out!

In this class students will learn about everything that goes into a staged production. They will explore the world of theatre through drama games and activities as well as rehearse to prepare for their very own mini-show! The course will end with a performance for family and friends. We are excited to offer this opportunity to our youngest of students in order to introduce and nurture a love of all aspects of theatre.

Students in Pre-Kindergarten, Junior Kindergarten and Kindergarten just love to learn more about their creepy, crawly "friends." In this science-play class, children will explore the insect world through science activities, singing songs, listening to read-alouds and even raising some of their own bugs! Don't worry parents, our home-grown insects will be safely released into their home habitats – they won't go home with you!

Children will explore open-ended and expressive play with their very own KIBO robot. These robots are specifically designed to suit the developmental needs of children from 4-7 years old. Classes will operate with physical robots and lots of movement, NOT SCREENS! Students will engage with the robots as active producers and not passive consumers. They will build skills in sequencing, pattern recognition, problem-solving, debugging and computational thinking.

This class is focused on getting out those wiggles while children learn about the BEST elements of dance (Body, Energy, Space & Time). Students participate in activities with fun, upbeat music from all around the world to refine gross motor skills like hopping, skipping, jumping and running (carefully!) Lessons will be based in the Laban method, giving students an opportunity to explore and combine new ways of moving expressively. The joy of song and movement that students learn in our music classes during the school day is expanded in after-school enrichment.

Bollywood is a modern form of Indian dance set to lively music. Tiny dancers in this class will learn how to do coordinated steps and hand work to musical rhythm and a catchy beat. This class will also teach students how to build community and teamwork through dance. Children will learn a short, choreographed routine that they will perform in costume at the end of the class. The performance will be recorded and shared with families to enjoy.

In this class, the youngest learners will get to play with numbers and geometry. Students will make projects, do activities and play games all designed to reinforce their knowledge and help students become facile with mathematics. The best part about math is that it is everywhere! Children will get to experience many things from art to science to construction. All that is done in this class will help children be more comfortable with math: through their play.

American Sign Language is the fourth most commonly used language in the United States, and many new parents are teaching their babies ASL as a vehicle for communication before they can even speak! Research shows that learning ASL signs helps early childhood students with spelling and supports their burgeoning vocabulary development. In this class, children will learn the signs for the alphabet and numbers as well as basic vocabulary and simple sentences.

Pre-Kindergarten, Junior Kindergarten and Kindergarten students will enjoy this active class where they learn and practice the fundamentals of basketball. They will learn how to dribble, pass, shoot and score in individual, partnered and team activities. Children will also learn new basketball-based games and drills they can do at home to practice their gross motor and hand-eye coordination. This class will be high-energy and appropriate footwear is required.

Early Childhood Extended Day and Auxiliary Programming Procedures, Policies & Registration Information

PROCEDURES & POLICIES FOR THE FARLY CHILDHOOD ENRICHMENT PROGRAM

PICK UP AND DROP OFF

All Early Childhood Enrichment Courses are held from 3:15pm to 4:00pm. At the end of the school day for Early Childhood students (2:45pm), children in Pre-Kindergarten, Junior Kindergarten and Kindergarten who are enrolled for the Early Childhood Enrichment Package will be picked up from their classrooms by Explorers Staff. At 3:10pm, children will be picked up by the instructor of the Enrichment course. Once the Enrichment class ends for the day, children will return to Explorers for pickup at any point through to 5:00pm. Any students who need to stay later than 5:00pm will join Encore as described in the General Information page.

HOLIDAYS, SCHOOL CANCELLATION & MAKEUPS

On days where school is not in session due to a holiday or inclement weather, the makeup class(es) will be held during the Make Up Week following the close of the seasonal session.

REGISTRATION DATES & TIMES

The Early Childhood Enrichment Program registration begins Tuesday, June 3rd. All registration is completed online at whschool.org/ECenrichment. Classes are filled on a first come, first served basis, and are time stamped as such. Once registration is completed, you will receive a confirmation of enrollment within two business days.

SNACKS

All students will have a healthy snack while in Explorers and use the restrooms before Enrichment classes begin.

ATTIRE & MATERIALS

The Early Childhood uniform is designed as such so students are able to be active and participate in most activities without needing a change of clothing. However, in some classes such as yoga, basketball and soccer, the sweatpants/shorts uniform would be a better fit. Additionally, appropriate footwear may be necessary. Instructors will confirm these needs and it is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to assure children have appropriate attire the day of classes. Any additional materials or supplies are the responsibility of the school/instructor to have available for students.

PAYMENTS

Payments for the Early Childhood Enrichment Program will be billed through the Business Office as a part of monthly billing. Those registered for the full year will be billed as a part of the 10-month billing program; those registered for one or two seasons will be billed at one time, just prior to the start of the classes. Once the registration is processed, families will be emailed an enrollment confirmation to be signed and returned to the school. At the time of the signed enrollment paperwork, students are committed to the program.

WITHDRAWALS & REFUNDS

We will offer a full refund for any Early Childhood Enrichment Classes which are dropped within the first week of the season. <u>Once the second week begins, there will be no refunds.</u> Notification of withdrawal must be made in writing and emailed to ECenrichment@whschool.org.

PROCEDURES & POLICIES FOR CAMP FUNSHINE

REGISTRATION AND IMPORTANT INFORMATION

STAFF

Our staff consists of a qualified, mature and dedicated group of professionals, teachers, camp counselors, and experienced and certified lifeguards. Students and campers will be given individual attention. Background checks are done on all employees.

CAMPERS

The campers are grouped according to grade levels. Each group has approximately 15 campers and a minimum of two counselors. For all camp trips, the counselor to camper ratio will be 1:5 or less.

PICK-UP and DROP-OFF

Instructions for pick-up and drop-off will be sent to you at registration. Please use the designated areas only for the safety of your child and security control.

EXTENDED CARE

Extended care is available for all campers/students who are in camp or classes from 8:30am through 3:00pm and in grades Pre-Kindergarten through 10th Grade.

Before Care: 7:30am – 8:30am must pre-register \$10 per morning. Before Care will take place in the gym.

After Care: 3:00pm – 6:00pm pre-registration is not necessary. The cost is \$5.00 for each half hour or part of the half hour. Campers and students will be signed into after care if they are on campus beginning at 3:15pm. After care children will be in our Encore Room and/or playground. Children are to be picked up at the entrance by the playground. For safety reasons, all other Summer Scholar students must leave school grounds within 15 minutes of his/her class.

LUNCH and SNACKS

<u>Please be sure the nurse is aware of all food allergies.</u> Hot lunch is provided for Camp Funshine, Adventure Camp, Teen Leadership, Sewing, Drama, Sports Camps, Brain Boosters and Summer Scholar students who are enrolled in afternoon electives. All meals will be served a choice of milk, water, juice drink. Fruit and vegetarian options will be available daily. Campers may bring their own lunches if preferred (financial credit is not provided for not participating in camp lunches).

<u>Campers will need to bring their own morning snacks.</u> An afternoon snack will be provided for all campers before they leave at 3:00pm. Summer Scholars may bring a snack or purchase a snack during their morning break (cash only.) Lunch is only provided to those students staying for the afternoon enrichment classes.

MEDICAL INFORMATION FORM

It is state regulation that the confidential Medical Information Form be completed for each camper and student. This form will be kept with our camp nurse and trip director. Applications cannot be processed without a medical form. This form does not need to be filled out by doctor, but a list of immunizations from the doctor must accompany the medical form. A new form needs to be filled out each year.

DRESS CODE

Campers and students should dress in casual, comfortable but appropriate clothing. Please avoid clothing that is distracting or distasteful (as determined by the Summer Programs Director.) All Funshine, Adventure, Teen Leadership, and Sports campers must wear sneakers or sandals with covered toes and back straps. Footwear and clothing must be suitable for running, jumping, and active play. If girls wear sundresses, they must wear shorts underneath them. All campers will be given a camp shirt for the season on the first week of attendance. Camp shirts must be worn on all camp trips. If a camper does not have their camp t-shirt on trip day, they will be billed for an additional shirt to wear on the trip. Additional shirts may be purchased for \$10 per shirt. Campers should label all clothing, towels, camp shirts and swimsuits. Wearing excessive jewelry is not recommended. The camp is not responsible for lost personal items.

DISCIPLINE

The Wardlaw+Hartridge School is a place where all children feel welcome and safe. Therefore, we reserve the right to dismiss any child from our programs who is disruptive, exhibits any behavior that intimidates or threatens the camp or school experience of any other camper/student, is destructive to school property and grounds and/or for any other reason deemed by any of the Summer Programs Directors. Please direct any issues or concerns directly to the Director or to the Summer Programs Assistant. We will always make time to meet with you.

REGISTRATION

All registrations are done online at whschool.org/summer. A separate application needs to be filled out for each child. Applications are processed in the order that they are received. No application will be processed without a medical form or the appropriate fees. Registration is ongoing and continues throughout the summer as long as space is available. We reserve the right to cancel or combine a class if we do not have sufficient enrollment for that course. After the application has been received, approved and processed, a confirmation will be sent by email. Registration for additional weeks of camp must be made by the prior Saturday. If you need assistance with the online registration, please visit our Summer Programs Office, and we can assist you.

FEE EXCEPTIONS

<u>Registration Fee Waiver</u> – If your application, medical form, and full payment are received by **April 15**th, we will waive the registration fees for Funshine, Adventure, Teen Leadership Camp, Summer Scholars and Brain Boosters. We will also waive the registration fee if you attend and register at any Open House Dates (all required payments and forms apply.)

<u>Summer Scholars Early Bird Bonus</u> – If your application, medical form, and full payment are received by **April 1**st, you will receive a <u>\$100 discount per student</u>. Student must be registered for a credit course or at least two sessions.

New Family Referral Bonus – If you have attended W+H Summer Programs in a previous summer and refer a new Funshine, Adventure, or Teen Leadership Camper who signs up for at least two full weeks, or a Summer Scholar student that takes at least two, 60-hour classes, you will receive a \$50 bonus check at the end of the summer for each valid referral. The new camper/student or any member of their family must not have attended any of The Wardlaw+Hartridge School Summer Programs previously. A referral form is required. Please see Debbie Ostrowski in the Summer Programs Office.

<u>Sibling Discount</u> – A 5% discount will be given for any sibling enrolled in the same programs. The discount will be applied to the lesser amount. The siblings must reside in the same household and be paid for by the same parent. Birth certificate may be requested.

<u>W+H Student Advantage</u> – Any camper/student that is fully enrolled to attend Wardlaw+Hartridge for the 2019-2020 school year <u>at the time of registration</u> will have the registration fees waived.

REFUNDS

For Funshine, Adventure, Teen Leadership, Sewing and Drama Camps – Withdrawal from camp must be made at least two weeks prior to the registered week for a refund. There are no refunds for the 7-week special for Teen Leadership Camp after June 20th. During any given camp week, refunds will be given only if your child is absent for three consecutive days due to illness and a dated doctor's note is submitted. Registration fees and withdrawal fees are not refundable. If payments were made by credit card, 3% will be deducted for transaction fees for refunds. All refunds are made by check and take at least two weeks to process.

For Academic Summer Classes and Brain Boosters -

Withdrawals any time before May 1st – all but \$200 of the school fees will be refunded.

Withdrawals between May 2nd and June 1st – 50% of school fees will be refunded.

Withdrawals after June 1st – no refunds are provided.

Please note that the registration fees are not refundable and not part of the school fees. If payments were made by credit card, 3% will be deducted for transaction fees for all refunds. Cancellations due to insufficient class size will be refunded at 100% including registration fees. All refunds are made by check and take at least two weeks to process.

PAYMENTS

Payments are accepted by credit card or check. Payment in full is due at the time of registration. (Payment plans can be made with all payments due by June 8th for students and two weeks prior to the camp week for campers.) <u>Payments by credit card</u> must be done online with the registration. <u>Payments by check</u> can be made by mail or in person in the Summer Programs Office. Make all checks payable to: *The Wardlaw+Hartridge School* and please write the names of your children in the memo section of the check.

*A special note to W+H parents: please do not combine camp fees with regular school payments, as they are separate accounts.
