# Headmaster

## 2020 Mobile Usage Policy Change

Thank you to all families who provided valuable feedback regarding mobile phone usage of senior students.

I have reviewed feedback with Student Wellbeing Team, and the following changes will be implemented at the start of 2020 Term 1.

Years 9 to 12 students can bring phones to school, but cannot carry phones on them during the school day. All phones are to be placed in lockers before Tutor Group each day. Students can check phones at their locker during break times, but phones are not permitted in the playground.

Following these changes, earphones will also not be permitted during the school day. Boys can continue to use earphones while travelling to and from school.

Boys were informed of these upcoming changes earlier in the term, but it is important that you are also aware of the changing expectations.

Thank you for supporting Brisbane Grammar School in 2019. The partnership between the School, parents and the community continues to be a significant aspect of the success of BGS.

## Year 5 Health and Wellbeing Expo

During recent student wellbeing lessons, Year 5 boys created a Health and Wellbeing Expo to explore the role of food in a healthy lifestyle and how food affects physical and mental wellbeing.

Working in pairs, boys researched a topic before displaying their findings on the gallery walk – a learning display set up in the classroom for the expo. The event culminated in a high-energy and competitive quiz on health and wellbeing, which included key questions from each display.



## Public Purpose | Christmas Giving

In recent weeks, the Middle School Public Purpose program has had a Christmas focus.

Our annual St Vincent de Paul Christmas hamper drive was successful once again, with students filling 26 hampers to support refugee families in Brisbane this Christmas. An assortment of food and gifts were donated, as well as soaps made by boys in the Year 7 Learn to Lead program. This initiative continues the School's long-standing relationship with St Vincent de Paul, with the support of our generous community.



The Middle School community also extended their support to Moogerah farmers, who are currently struggling with the recent bushfires and drought. Christmas hampers travelled with the Year 6 boys on their way to Moogerah last week, before Outdoor Education staff delivered them to the Boonah Ambulance Station and the Salvation Army tent at the Boonah Showgrounds Critical Response Centre. The hampers will be distributed to local families in need.

Year 5 boys also showed their appreciation for rural farmers in support of Rural Aid's annual Christmas Card Farmer Mailout. Boys created Christmas cards to wish farmers and their families a Merry Christmas and to express gratitude for everything they do for their communities. 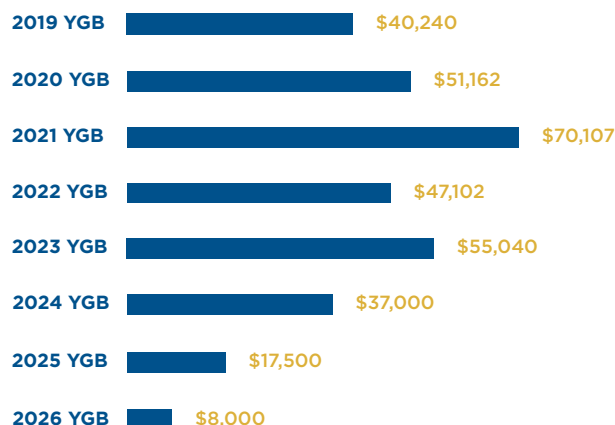

# Co-Curricular Cricket

## BGS First XI v Wanderers

The annual game between the BGS First XI squad and the Wanderers was played at Northgate on Wednesday.

The toss was won by the Wanderers, who chose to bat first on a good deck. They scored 8/269 from 50 overs.

Will Sheedy produced the best bowling results for BGS, with 2/35 from eight overs. Other commendable figures were Hugh Weibgen with 1/46 from eight overs; and Toby Matthews and Angus Tolhurst, who both had 1/21 from four overs.

Some good fielding was mixed with dropped catches, which enabled the Wanderers to accrue their score.

After lunch, the BGS team went about their batting in pursuit of the 270 total. With some good strike rotation and three solid partnerships (66, 77, 43) at the top of the order, the First XI squad were going well at the second drinks break, with 2/165 off 34 overs.

A tighter line of bowling saw the team struggle to maintain the previous run rate. While batting the 50 overs out, we finished the innings at 9/238 – 32 runs short.

Matthew Lockhart opened the innings and scored an impressive 122 from 140 balls. Handy contributions at the top of the order came from Connor Nowlan, 24 from 36; Hugh Couper, 24 from 47 and Robbie Sanders, 21 from 38.

The Cricket program will now take a break over the holiday period and return for the Tri-Grammar Festival in Sydney from Sunday 12 to Saturday 18 January 2020. This tournament will see the First XI squad playing games against Sydney and Melbourne Grammar Schools, accompanied by our Senior Development Squad.

## Monday 20 January and Tuesday 21 January | Skills

These days will focus on technical, tactical and team organisation. Days will be split into two sessions:
