

Last week, the School held many functions to celebrate the contributions of the Class of 2019. At one event, I was intrigued to hear the cohort referred to as a play – there were many different roles, but everyone played his part.

In the past, I have used a similar analogy in Harlin House; not only to highlight the various roles each individual has to play, but also the annual cycle as boys join the community and progress through the year groups. This analogy is most appropriate at this time of year, as Year 11 boys acquire significant roles of responsibility within the residential community.

On Sunday evening, we began our 2020 planning with the Year 11 boys. My vision for leadership in the boarding community is that it is provided by the whole senior cohort. I have made it a priority to meet with them all on a weekly basis – challenging them to grow as leaders while reminding them of the importance of their roles.

I shared with the boys an article from *Lights Out*, the periodical of the Australian Boarding Schools' Association, written by Ryan Fowler, a Boarding Assistant Housemaster at The Scots College in Sydney. His eloquent synopsis of leadership identifies the qualities required to be an effective boarding captain – a topic relevant to all senior BGS boarders.



In small groups, we used Fowler's article to brainstorm the actions required by our Class of 2020 boarders to lead with authenticity. The feedback from boys was excellent, with insightful analysis about what has and has not worked well in the past. Our conversations and discussions often led back to the theme of integrity, and the expectation to do the right thing when nobody is watching.

We will now synthesise the feedback and formulate our own framework of how to lead with authenticity.

We have also been working with our 2020 Harlin House Captain, Vice Captain and Prefects to prepare for next year's Boarding Induction program. Traditionally, new boarders have only spent one evening with us before starting school. The new weekend-long program offers a range of activities – from team building games to exploring Brisbane and Moogerah – to assist new boarders with transitioning to residential life at BGS. My aspiration is to ensure our new boarders are prepared as best as possible to begin their Brisbane Grammar School journey.

Thank you to the 2020 seniors for the way they have taken up the mantle of leadership, and to the Captains and Prefects who have already contributed so much, setting the tone for next year. I look forward to working with this group of young men who have a clear and well-defined focus.

2020 ACER Scholarship Test | Applications Open

Brisbane Grammar School has a long and proud tradition of offering scholarships and bursaries to boys who have demonstrated they have the potential to derive great benefit from a BGS education.

Trustees' Scholarships are awarded based on demonstrated academic excellence of boys **commencing Year 7 in 2021**. Applicants are assessed on their performance on the annual Australian Council for Educational Research Scholarship Test and their willingness to contribute to the wider school program.

The ACER Scholarship Test will be held at BGS on **Saturday 29 February 2020**. Registration is only available **online here** and will incur a cost of \$130. Registration will close at midnight AEDST **Monday 10 February 2020**.

10E returned to Moogerah last week to complete their expedition. The class was sent home earlier in the term due to the smoke hazard from bushfires. The boys arrived, organised their gear, made a navigation plan and went into the field straight away for their overnight expedition.

Tom Strooper and Will Jessup were both excellent navigators. They stepped up into leadership roles and managed their groups with confidence. Josh Goh and Christopher Spencer were also strong leaders. They showed empathy and understanding when leading the group on the expedition to the summit of Mt Alford.

The decision was made to send the class home on Thursday afternoon to avoid the fire risks, poor air quality and Friday's 40-degree heat.

Elijah Wong was a standout leader, with the group looking to him for decision making during the expedition. Elijah proved to be hardworking and well respected in his peer group. Andrew Bond fully engaged in the program, taking on every challenge with commitment and a positive attitude. He was hard working and always polite to teachers and his peers.

Walter Nedov and Manish Naiker were engaged in decision making and planning. They proved to be valuable group members and willing to put the needs of others first.





BGS Cricket Camp 2020

These days will focus on technical, tactical and team organisation. Days will be split into two sessions:




