I was privileged to attend the Valedictory Assembly in the Great Hall, which mirrored the boys' first assembly when they joined BGS. It was also a privilege to welcome Mr Mark Brusasco to the Valedictory Assembly to mark his inclusion on the Old Boys' Association Distinguished Service Honour Board – a rare honour. In his absence, we also acknowledged the inclusion of former Headmaster Mr Brian Short on the Honour Board. I had the privilege of working with both men for nearly 40 years and can attest that their contributions to the School as staff members and Old Boys were significant, and their interest and care for the School authentic.

Finally, last night we celebrated a wonderful aspect of the culture at BGS – the true partnership between families and the School as we contribute to your son's education and wellbeing. Over 700 guests joined us at the Royal Convention Centre at the Valedictory Dinner to celebrate this partnership and to wish the boys well as they start their journey beyond the gates of Brisbane Grammar School.



On Wednesday, Harlin House farewelled the 2019 senior boarding cohort at the Year 12 Borders Leavers Evening. There were mixed emotions as the boys enjoyed their final dinner together before walking across the bridge for one last time as students.

Before boys said their final goodbyes, we gathered in the Great Hall to reflect on their final year. Below is an excerpt from my address to the Year 12 graduates:

Last week, one of our current Year 12 boarders shared his English presentation with me. When I say shared, I mean he emailed it to me, and not for my ability to spot grammatical or syntax errors, but for my printing services. That said, he did pay a price – I had a chance to read his excellent speech.

His slides told the story of how his parents threatened to send him to boarding school, and then followed through on their threat; how he struggled, but eventually made headway to enjoy the boarding experience.

Boarding is certainly a journey that ebbs and flows, and we occasionally forget the need to allow ourselves to grow accustomed to our new surroundings. That said, boarding can be difficult on occasions – no matter how short or long the journey.

A phrase I found myself using with some frequency in the end of year testimonials, was how well the boys had handled the challenges of boarding. Living with 85 other boys sounds fun – and for the most part it is that, and a whole lot more – but it can also be hard. Having to conform to expectations is not straightforward; living in a regimented manner and eating dinner at 5.30pm each night is not the most flexible arrangement and getting permission to go home is far from ideal in the eyes of any young adult.

Boarding is many things. It is fun, it is character building, it teaches you how to live with other people, it breeds confidence, it inculcates independence – but it can be tough.

In an unofficial appraisal with Year 12 boarder Mitch Snodgrass, we concluded that our seniors had made immense progress over their time in Harlin House. I mentioned how much I would miss the occasional challenge, but also the great privilege of guiding a group of young men who as individuals, and a cohort, have kicked many goals.

I will miss the opportunity to support them in their myriad of efforts. Travel well, and remember to make the most of what life offers you.

Moogerah has taught me to see the joy and humour in every moment. Moogerah has also taught me that I can achieve things that seem daunting and even impossible."

Wellbeing Curriculum | Removing Mental Health Stigmas

Adolescence is a crucial period for developing and maintaining social and emotional habits essential for mental wellbeing. Half of all mental disorders emerge by the age of 14 and three quarters by the age of 25, highlighting the importance of this issue.

To help raise awareness about mental health, boys in Years 9 and 10 recently attended a presentation by Batyr – an organisation that educates and empowers young people to reach out for support when they need it.



Old Boy Sean Tran '14 is one of Batyr's young speakers, and he shared his lived experience with mental health issues. Sean's story was powerful and helped to break the stigma often attached to mental health. He also informed boys of the services available to them.

A range of age-related mental health topics are explored during Student Wellbeing lessons.






