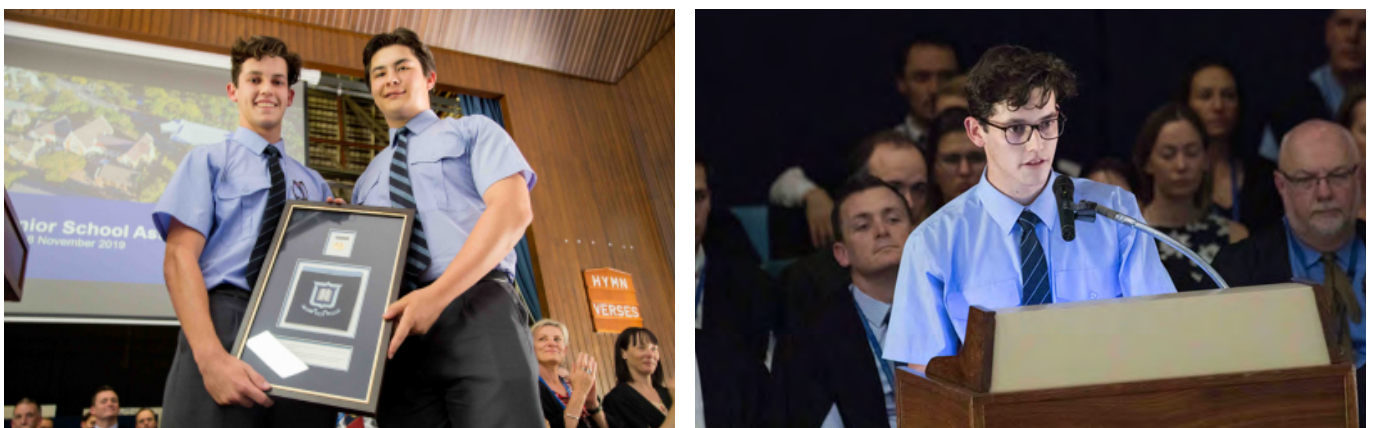

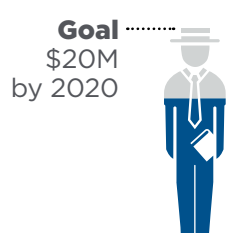
I wish the Class of 2019 good luck for their last week of school and well in life beyond BGS.

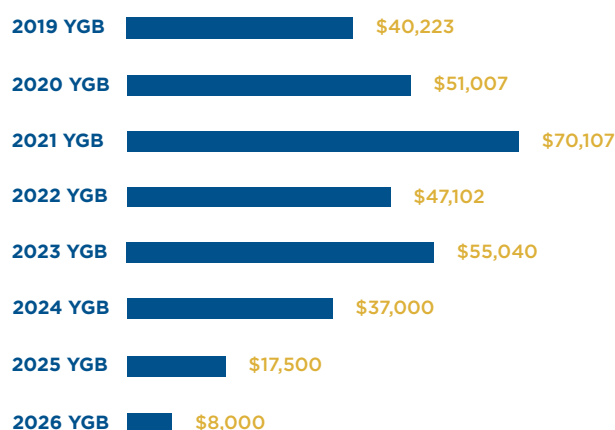

Sincere thanks to our generous sponsors, P&F Auxiliary volunteers and the Advancement and Community Relations team for their contribution to a hugely successful day.

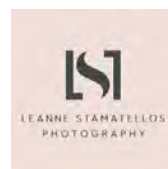

# National History Challenge Winners

Many BGS boys recently competed in the National History Challenge. In this premier competition of the History Teachers' Association of Australia, students work as historians to research world history or examine Australia's past. This year's theme was *People and Power*. Congratulations to the many boys and their teachers, whose tremendous efforts have been rewarded with an impressive range of accolades.

A special mention to Year 10 student Angus Duncan, who received the Queensland Premier's Young Historian Award for best entry in the state across all age groups. Angus was commended for his rigour, expression and originality of thought in his essay *The People had Spoken* – an exploration of the role of Australians and key individuals during the Freedom Rides of the 1960s. The overall national winner will be announced on Monday 2 December during a ceremony at Parliament House in Canberra.

The Year 10 team of Rohin Bagga, Vijay Hari Kannan, Tom McCarthy-James and Patrick Moore was the national winner of the Australian Wartime Experiences special category. In their winning entry, the boys presented a forum discussion titled *Australian History Channel - People and Power - Periods and Perspectives*. They discussed *People and Power* in World War II, concentrating on Australia's relations with Britain, America and Japan while exploring how key individuals used their power positively or abused it. The boys will be presented their awards at the national presentation ceremony in Canberra by The Honourable Dan Tehan, Minister for Education and Training.

Year 6 student Anson Qiu-Tang was the overall winner in the Queensland Years 5 and 6 category. Anson produced a multi-modal presentation about an Australian soldier Thomas Currie Derrick. He connected Derrick's achievements to the theme *People and Power* by emphasising how an everyday Australian can have the power to influence others through positivity.

This year, I have the pleasure of announcing that Year 12 student Thomas Meutermans recently achieved his Gold Award, the highest achievement of the International Award.

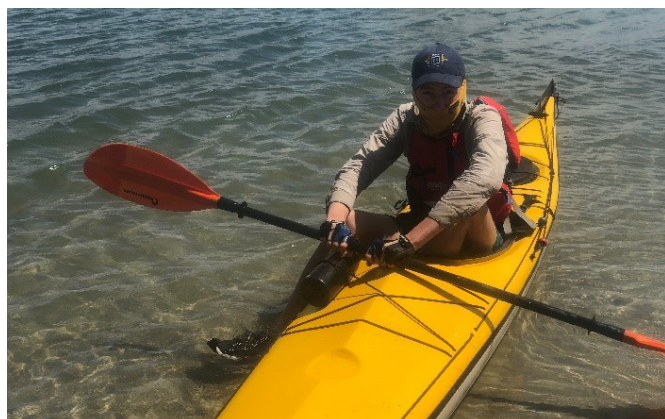

# FTC Robotics State Final

On the weekend, two combined BGS and BGGS Robotics teams competed at the FIRST Tech Challenge State Robotics Competition. With 25 team members, we had the largest number of student participants and a strong contingent of BGS/BGGS parents supporting in the crowd and the pits.

This season's challenge is called SKYSTONE®. FTC have partnered up with Star Wars, Lucas Films to create a very challenging competition. In SKYSTONE®, our mission is to create a structure that 'pushes into the skies' to represent our team alliance. Our robots help us overcome obstacles that stand in our path to 'building a superstructure of the future.'

Queensland has the largest competition in the country, with over 40 teams competing to earn a place at the national finals. Our teams faced technical challenges on competition day, but both robots improved throughout the day and found some success.

Our two teams #14579 Bin Chickens and #16337 Grammaroos have been invited to compete at the FTC National finals at Macquarie University, Sydney, in the first week of the school holidays.

Teams have started the work required to raise our robots to the next level, and we wish them all the best for the upcoming National competition.

# Deputy Head – Co-Curriculum

Three team performances last week were noteworthy examples of individuals working together for a common cause:

- Our 10 – 12 year old athletes represented the School at the Junior GPS Track and Field Championships on Thursday;
- The *Trick or Treat* cast and crew treated audiences to a fantastic production; and
- The senior Track and Field team contested the 2019 GPS championship at QSAC on Saturday, placing fifth.

Across these three different co-curricular teams, there were many outstanding performances which contributed to collective success.

I commend the boys involved for their dedication, commitment and leadership. I also thank the many staff involved in leading these boys to help them achieve their best.

## Co-Curricular Sport Leadership

At the end of 2019, Director of Sport Ron Cochrane will retire after many years of dedicated service. This week, we honoured Mr Cochrane on assembly; it was a moving occasion.

To position the School to meet strategic imperatives within the Co-Curriculum Sport and Activities domains, the current leadership structure has been reviewed. Several changes will occur in 2020.

The role of Director of Sport has evolved. I am pleased to advise that Mr John Clancy has been appointed as the Director of PE, Sport and Activities from 1 January 2020.

Mr Clancy will continue as Head of Physical Education, leading his dedicated team of Physical Education teachers, while also leading BGS Sport and Activities.

The Athletic Development Program (ADP) will also evolve. In 2020, this program will be known as Performance Development, taking a comprehensive approach to optimal, longitudinal preparation of our students for intelligent sporting performance.

The ADP will operate under the leadership of a Physical Education teacher, in collaboration with a strength and conditioning specialist who can support the preparation of students towards flagship and championship teams, within our educational setting.

To support and enable the duality of the Director of PE, Sport and Activities role, develop existing staff and align BGS Sports and Activities from Years 5 to 12, additional appointments will be made in the coming weeks.

Selection processes are currently underway for the following roles:

- Assistant Head of Physical Education - to support the curriculum leadership of the Director of PE, Sport and Activities in the whole-school Physical Education department.
- Assistant Director of Sport – to focus on aligning and mentoring Co-Curriculum Sport program leaders (MiCs and Directors) and to lead the development of program curriculum across Years 5 to 12.
- Head of Activities – to work with the Director of PE, Sport and Activities and the Head of Middle School to lead initial engagement in Co-Curricular sport and other activities. This role will oversee all Activities (Co-Curricular clubs and special interest groups across Years 5 to 12), as well as student-centred activities and events within the Middle School.

These changes are the result of the work of many over several years. They will embed a leadership structure which rigorously aligns Physical Education, Sport, Activities and Performance Development.

I look forward to announcing future appointments and to the work ahead of us all, for the benefit of your sons.

# Cricket

The BGS Cricket pre-season is in full swing, and our Senior squad has been preparing for their Tri-Grammar tour in January with internal matches and Twenty20 games against Marist Ashgrove College.

Last Friday, the team played at Chelmer. It was a very tight fixture, but the BGS boys prevailed on the last ball of the match to defend their total of 134.

BGS batted first on a slow wicket, and Hayden Spencer (28) and Hugh Couper (49) added 63 before the loss of the first wicket. Despite our fast start, quick wickets in the middle overs slowed our run rate significantly. Superb late innings hitting from Angus Tolhurst (16 from 13) and Angus Pearn (18 from 12) resulted in BGS finishing with a respectable total of 5 for 132 after 20 overs.

After a slightly below-par score, the boys knew we needed to start strong in the field. The opening bowling pair of Hugh Weibgen and Charlie Thomas worked well in tandem, placing pressure on the opposing batsmen, leading to an early wicket.

With more pressure built through the middle overs, Dan Skoien was rewarded with a much-needed wicket, breaking their second wicket partnership of 39 in the eighth over. Dan took another wicket in his next over, however lapses in concentration from bowlers through the middle overs allowed Marist to cruise at the required run rate.

Griff Adams stood in Marist's way, with a brilliant spell at the death where he finished with 2/17 off 4 overs, including keeping Marist to four runs off the final over when they needed seven to win.

In the final over, there were two run-outs where BGS remained calm under pressure.
