So, we talked to the administrators and Friday evening was a good time to do it. It was near the end of the week and people were a bit more relaxed.

Friday night was always a buffet meal, so people were really relaxed coming in and even more relaxed afterwards so it was the perfect night.

How was El Monte Slim inspired?

So, it's really just been a character that was an amalgamation of a thousand characters that have rolled around in my head over time and have just evolved into El Monte Slim.

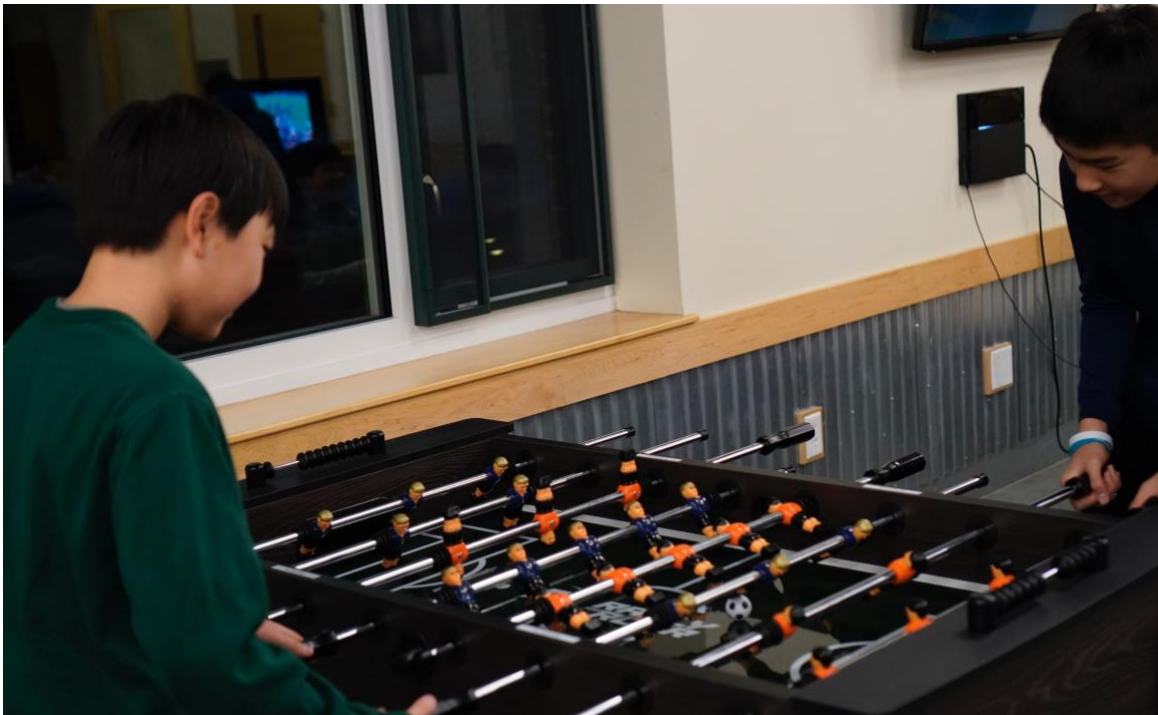
“It took me about a half hour to get dressed for hockey, but it was still fun.” -*Michael Tansey*
