

I. CALL TO ORDER/FLAG SALUTE

The September 24, 2018 Public Meeting of the Edison Board of Education was called to order by Board President, Mr. Jingwei (Jerry) Shi, at 6:00 P.M. at the Education Center, 312 Pierson Avenue, Edison, NJ 08837.

Mrs. Contaldi reported that the Violence and Vandalism Report for the 2017-18 School Year has been submitted to the State Department of Education utilizing the New Jersey Department of Education web-based electronic reporting system. This report indicates the number of violence and vandalism incidents reported by each of our schools. Under the federal *No Child Left Behind Act*, the New Jersey Department of Education utilizes the most current data available from the Electronic Violence and Vandalism Reporting System to identify persistently dangerous schools on or before July 31st of each year.

A summary report of incidents of violence, vandalism and substance abuse for the 2017-18 school year, which have been reported to the New Jersey Department of Education is annexed hereto. This is the twelfth year in which incidents and suspensions have been reported utilizing the web-based electronic reporting system.

2. On Line Educational Services Agreement – Monmouth-Ocean Educational Services Commission

WHEREAS, the Edison Township Board of Education and the Monmouth-Ocean Educational Services Commission, 900 Hope Road, Tinton Falls, NJ 07712 hereto agree as follows:

1.a. MOESC shall provide online instructional services through the New Jersey Virtual School™ to High School students of the Edison School District.

1. b. MOESC will provide online instruction from September 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019.

1. c. MOESC shall provide to Edison School District such online educational services, such as online instructors, course planning and materials.

1. d. MOESC agrees to provide the services of highly qualified New Jersey Certified Teachers who will provide instruction, using curriculum that has been approved for New Jersey Standards and adopted by the MOESC Board of Directors.

2. Edison School District agrees that during the term of this Agreement, Edison School District shall be responsible for performing the following functions and complying with the following obligations:

- a. Edison School District shall be responsible to enter all data required by MOESC for registration of the student.
 - b. Edison School District shall cooperate with MOESC to monitor the student attendance.
 - c. Edison School District shall provide appropriate space and electronic equipment and other means to meet the requirements of a “virtual” or online learning system.
 - d. Edison School District shall arrange for the appropriate computer equipment and Internet access necessary to fully participate for the online, virtual instruction during the contractually designated time.
 - e. Edison School District students will be in the custody of appropriate supervisory personnel provided by Edison School District.
 - f. Edison School District students will comply with all rules and regulations for participation in this program, as Edison School District may establish.
3. This Agreement shall be in effect beginning September 1, 2018 through June 30, 2019. Either MOESC or Edison School District may terminate this Agreement upon sixty (60) days’ written notice.
4. MOESC shall invoice Edison School District for the services on a monthly basis based on the advertised tuition of NJVS™ course and registration fees. (See Fee Schedule) Payment shall be made to MOESC within 30 days from Edison School District’s receipt of the invoice.
5. The MOESC is a state authorized agency pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:6-51, et seq. All positions will be advertised to meet the requirements of an equal opportunity employer. The training and supervision of the online virtual instruction staff will be the responsibility of the MOESC which will also be responsible for any required workers’ compensation, unemployment insurance, tax withholding, contributions, benefits and performance evaluations of its staff.
6. This Agreement supersedes any prior negotiations, discussion or communications between the MOESC and Edison School District.
7. Neither party may sell, assign, transfer, nor otherwise dispose of, its obligations as set forth herein without the other party’s prior written consent.
8. This Agreement contains the entire agreement of the parties and no representations, inducements, promises or agreements, oral or otherwise, including descriptive brochures, which are not embodied herein, shall not be of any force or effect and shall not be modified except by the written agreement of the parties.

9. MOESC shall provide the Edison School District with a valid original Certificate of Insurance as evidence of insurance coverage in accordance with the foregoing provisions.

10. MOESC and Edison School District shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the other and its employees from and against any and all claims, demands, suits, actions, recoveries, judgments and costs, and expenses in connection therewith on account of the loss of life, property or injury or damages to the person, body or property of any person or persons, whatsoever, which shall arise from or result directly or indirectly from (1) the work, service or materials provided under this Agreement; or (2) any failure to perform the obligations under the Agreement.

11. In the event any claims or disputes arises involving services provided under this Agreement, then such remedy shall be limited to the replacement of the services disputed. In the event of an MOESC breach or violation of this Agreement, MOESC shall be provided with ten (10) school days' notice to make the correction. Further, in the event any claims or disputes arise involving the provision of services by MOESC under this Agreement, Edison School District shall promptly (1) notify MOESC when it becomes aware of any such claim or dispute; (2) specifically identify the exact nature of the claim or dispute; and (3) cooperate with MOESC in attempting to resolve any third party claims or disputes, including, but not limited to, attending, participating and joining in meetings, conferences, hearings and dispute resolution proceedings.

12. Any controversy or claim arising out of or relating to this Agreement or its breach, which is unable to be resolved by the parties, shall confidentially be resolved by non-binding mediation. If the controversy is not resolved by mediation, then the controversy or claim shall be brought to a retired Superior Court Judge, who shall arbitrate any such dispute. The judge shall be mutually selected by the parties. The arbitrator shall decide the allocation of costs, expenses and fees.

3. Joint Transportation Agreement – Morris County Educational Services Commission

WHEREAS,

the Edison Township Board of Education (hereinafter referred to as the "Board" or the "District"), and the Board of directors of Educational Services Commission of Morris County whose post office address is Box 1944, Morristown, NJ 07962 (hereinafter referred to as the "Commission"), hereto agree as follows:

1. the Commission agrees to transport public, nonpublic and special education pupils on established routes as assigned in writing by the Board, for each day that school is in session during the 2018-2019 school year;

2. In consideration of the performance of paragraph 1, the Board agrees to pay the Commission the total sum of estimated costs, including administrative fees in accordance with the provisions of the payment policy established by the Board of Directors (5% surcharge with the exception of Public In District contracts which will be a 2% surcharge) and distributed to every Board:

- Advance payment of 10% of the previous year's final special education cost by August 30th and monthly payments in full for actual transportation costs incurred from September through June. Any credit balance due to the district will be refunded;

3. It is understood that any change in the number of children being transported on each route or changes in mileage during the course of the year will necessitate a reapportionment and adjustment of costs. Apportioned costs also include an aide, if assigned to the vehicle. A personal or health aide will be billed to the district placing the request;

4. The Commission accepts no responsibility for assuring a pupil's use of arranged transportation or attendance on an established route. Once assigned to a route, the monthly billings for the pupil's reserved seat will continue until the Commission is otherwise notified, in writing, to delete the pupil from the assigned route;

5. The board agrees that all requests sent to the Commission are for the purpose of making arrangements for the transportation of the pupil(s) referred, and not for the purpose of obtaining pricing information. If the Board or its administrators wishes to obtain pricing information, it must be so identified, in writing, thirty (30) days prior to the date that the requested transportation is to start;

6. The Commission agrees to process private School Transportation applications for aid in lieu of transportation for those nonpublic school pupils who are unable to be placed on established or competitively bid routes. This process includes bi-annual certification of pupil attendance and preparation of payment vouchers. Such payments are to be made by the Board directly to the parents of eligible pupils. The Board agrees to pay the Commission an administrative fee for processing aid in lieu of transportation payment vouchers in accordance with the rates established by the Board of Directors of the Commission;

7. It is understood and agreed by the parties hereto that this agreement shall be without force and effect until such time it has been approved by the Superintendent of Schools of the County of Morris.

4. Nonpublic Nursing Aid – 2018-2019 - REVISED

RESOLVED: that this agreement shall be for a ten month period from September 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined it to be in the best interests of the District to enter into a settlement agreement with M&M, the terms of which have been negotiated between the Board’s counsel, Methfessel & Werbel, P.C., and M&M Construction and/or its authorized representative.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED: that the Board authorizes the President to execute the resultant aforementioned settlement agreement in the above-captioned case.

XIII. COMMITTEES

1. Curriculum and Technology Committee

Mrs. Prasad-Madhukar reported that the Curriculum and Technology Committee met at 12:00 P.M. on August 21, 2018 in the Education Center.

Items Discussed:

- Curriculum Updates – Summer Writing and Revisions
 - * The Committee reviewed the curriculum, which were updated during the summer months. These included Math K-5, Math 6, Algebra I, AP US History, AP Government and Politics, Environmental Science, Chemistry, Biology, Physics, Elementary Spanish, Middle School Physical Education and College Composition and Literature. One key change is weaving 21st Century learning standards throughout the curriculum. 21st Century learning standard focuses on collaboration and conflict resolution, among others.
 - * Additionally, the Elementary Science, Math and ELA/Social Studies curriculum were updated with the Social Emotional Competencies, and Phonics First was added to the Kindergarten curriculum.
 - * Technology at the Elementary Level: The Committee discussed reducing emphasis on technology at the elementary level. As a first step, Kindergarten will no longer be taking iPads home. Starting this year, first through fifth grades are also not mandated to take their devices home and will be taking it only on an “as needed” basis.

- Summer School Summary
 - * The Committee reviewed the success of the summer programs for elementary students through Summer Enrichment Programs and Secondary Programs. Hundreds of children participated in enrichment programs and sports programs at John P. Stevens High School. At the secondary schools, students participated in our Credit Completion Program, Failure Makeup Program, Middle School Transition Programs, Programming and more than 180 students participated in the SAT Prep Class, which was a four week program that cost \$200 and reviewed for the math and verbal exams.

- Textbooks
 - * AP Government and AP U.S. History have new textbooks this year.
 - * The Committee spoke briefly about the inventory of textbooks and online access for the textbooks. Supervisors are reviewing all accounts so that piloting plans can be prioritized for the fall and spring, and develop a plan to purchase appropriate texts in secondary math, science, social studies courses and elementary language arts.
 - * A five-year plan for textbook purchases and curriculum revisions is in the planning stage.

- Linkit!
 - * Linkit! has been purchased for the 2018-2019 school year, which will provide a more robust way of looking at data. The program stores all assessment data so that teachers can look at the achievement levels of their students and make instructional decisions. Principals and supervisors will review data in order to plan for support, intervention activities and curriculum updates.

- PSAT 8/9 Proposal
 - * The Committee reviewed the PSAT 8/9, a paper and pencil assessment that is highly correlated with the SAT. This assessment will be given to all grade 8 students in the 2018-2019 school year and be used as one of the criteria for grouping procedures and for acceptance into the STEM Academy, replacing iReady and the CoGat tests. The PSAT 8/9 is a nationally normal text and can be administered in one morning, allowing for less disruption to the school day than the administration of the iReady diagnostics, which required multiple days of missed instruction.

- High School Transcript Update
 - * The format of the High School Transcript has been updated to a one page document and will be available for the Class of 2019.

The meeting adjourned at 1:15 P.M.

2. Finance & Facilities Committee

Mr. Brescher reported that the Finance and Facilities Committee met at 1:00 P.M. on September 20, 2018 in the Education Center.

In attendance were: Richard Brescher, Jingwei “Jerry” Shi, Beth Moroney, Paul Saxton, Daniel P. Michaud, Richard Pepe, Debra Gulick, Baninder Mahabir, Christopher Conklin, Margaret Contaldi and Ken Taylor

Items Discussed:

- The District’s Roofing Architect, Thomas Rienzi, gave the Committee an update of the conditions of the roofs on the schools. He indicated that sections of several schools were in need of replacement. Mr. Rienzi stated that he would prepare a priority list for next year’s capital outlay budget, along with estimated costs and that he would begin preparing bid specifications for the needed roof replacements.
- The Committee reviewed two proposals from SSP Architects and USA Architects for preparation of the District’s Long Range Facilities Plan. The Committee decided to award the project to SSP Architects for their proposed price of \$75,000. USA Architects proposed price was \$84,000.
- The Committee reviewed a status report from USA Architects regarding the modular classroom project for the FDR School. The plans are being prepared for submittal to the NJDOE for approval. The proposed date of completion is late spring in 2019.
- The Committee reviewed proposals submitted by LAN Associates for air conditioning in the high school auditoriums. The Committee requested that the district seek additional competitive proposals.
- Mrs. Gulick and Mrs. Mahabir presented proposals for hiring additional elementary assistant principals. They provided comparative student to administrator ratios that show that Edison far exceeds the ratios of neighboring comparable school districts. The Committee is in agreement that additional administrative help is needed in the elementary schools.
- The Committee discussed the need to increase the maintenance staff by adding an electrician, plumber, HVAC Technician and Electrician Helper. The District has been hiring outside vendors to complete many of the outstanding work orders due to lack of personnel.
- The Committee reviewed the proposed shared services agreement with the Township for the hiring of Class III police officers. The Board’s attorney will contact the Township’s attorney to discuss the terms.

The meeting adjourned at 4:05 P.M.

3. Security Committee

Mr. Shi reported that the Security Committee met at 4:00 P.M. on September 13, 2018 in the Education Center.

Items Discussed – School Security Specialist (SSS):

- Christopher Conklin was introduced as the District’s SSS.
- Mr. Conklin distributed the following handouts which he received at the 5-day summer training for SSS:

 - * Site visit and Inspection of Facilities review sheet
 - * School Safety and Security Plan review sheet

 - * New Jersey School Security Task Force Report and Recommendations
 - * School Safety and Security Plan Review Checklist
- Mr. Conklin also shared that there is a possible new position being considered for school districts – “School Liaison Officer”.
- Discussion ensued on how best to utilize these resources with the addition of a Director of School Safety and Security as proposed by Paul Saxton.
- Mr. Saxton distributed the draft job description which was reviewed and modified by all present.
- It was agreed to advertise for the Director of School Safety and Security position in the Star Ledger in the employment opportunities section on September 16th and September 23rd. The posting would be available on-line and on the District website for 30 days.
- The group discussed qualifications, desirable work experience, as well as salary and benefits parameters.
- Mr. Saxton noted that the future work of the Director of School Safety and Security would be to assist the Committee with a review and revision of the current District Security Plan.
- The group deliberated over when security guards and/or police presence is needed at school events and determined by administration.
- Police Coverage of District events was discussed, as well as the fee schedule for athletic events. Mr. Michaud sought guidance as to how to address the large increase requested from police for their presence at such events (from \$125 to \$220) - \$50/hour minimum of 4 hours plus \$5 administrative fee is the new rate.

XV. BOARD MEMBERS – OPEN DISCUSSION

Mrs. Moroney congratulated Edison High School for their recent Band Competition and noted that John P. Stevens High School's Band Competition will be held on October 7th. She discussed a newspaper article regarding "Real questions you should be asking your teachers" at parent back-to-school night. Mrs. Moroney also spoke about the Wingman Program, announcing that John Marshall Elementary School will be the first school in New Jersey to start this program..

Mrs. Prasad-Madhukar discussed the PTO's Parent Circle Software, which is a form of fund raising, the Parent Portal issues and the need for the parents to read and complete all documents and the need to have bus passes sent out in the middle of August.

Mr. Shi reported that the Parent Portal was shut down for the summer and suggested a staggered approach in the future and discussed subscription busing. Mr. Shi reported that Halal foods will be available at Edison High School this year as a pilot program. He reported on a World Cup Cricket presentation held in September and congratulated John P. Stevens High School senior, Pranav Krisna, for receiving a Gold Medal at the International Linguistics competition, representing JPS in the Czech Republic.

XVI. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Two John P. Stevens High School students discussed the overcrowding issues and delays in exiting the school for emergencies.

A parent discussed the safety issues in the schools.

A resident spoke about early dismissal due to heat and asked that the schools be air conditioned.

A resident asked for the PTA/PTO's to support school activities.

Dr. Frank Heelan, resident, congratulated the "State-Aid Committee" and asked if there was any plan for a bond referendum.

A resident questioned the current school calendar showing holy days on the wrong days.

Joseph Johnson, resident, questioned diversity education and African American history.

Keith Hahn questioned a racial flyer sent out in the last election.

Anthony DeAmorin, resident, asked Mr. Shi to step down as President until current issues are settled.

Elizabeth Conway, resident, questioned the air conditioning power issues. She asked parents to complete forms early and spoke about how the PTA/PTOs are less effective in schools, no more voting. She also questioned the racial flyers.

Amy Donner, resident, questioned enrollment and asked when a census report will be taken in Edison and spoke about the importance of air conditioning in the schools.
