X. COMMITTEE REPORTS

1. Curriculum & Technology Committee

Mrs. Anes reported that the committee met on August 18, 2011.

In attendance were: Deborah A. Anes, Veena Iyer, Dr. Frank Heelan, Gene I. Macroff, Margaret DeLuca and Richard O'Malley, Ed.D.

Items Discussed:

- Pre-K through 5 – Dr. O'Malley reported that the training for Journeys has continued for new teachers and teachers returning from leave. The October 26th in-service day will be devoted to Journeys training. Training will continue throughout the year with a presenter provided by the publisher visiting at least two times a month and coaches assisting teachers in the classroom on an individual basis. Dr. O'Malley added that 99% of second grade teachers were asked to pilot the program so we are actually running the Journeys program from grades 2 through 5.
- NWEA – Ms. DeLuca reported that the principals, CRTs, supervisors and assistant principals for the three schools (Lindeneau Elementary, Thomas Jefferson and John Adams Middle Schools) piloting the NWEA had been trained. The first testing period will be September 17th through October 7th. A timeline was shared with the committee outlining faculty training and parent communications.
- Middle School Issues – Ms. DeLuca reported that Edison has been accepted into Rutgers *NJ Partnership for Excellence in Middle School Mathematics*. The program is funded by Rutgers and a grant from the National Science Foundation, the goal of which is to improve math instruction at the middle school level. With the acceptance of our application, Edison will be able to recommend four teachers to the two year program. Teachers take seven courses in Rutgers Graduate School of Education specific to middle school math. These are at no cost to the District or the staff. During the summer of 2012 and 2013, the teachers will receive a \$4800 stipend from Rutgers to take the summer classes. During year two of the program, Rutgers will also provide three professional development days to all middle school math teachers on instructional strategies. The District must agree to provide leadership opportunities for the teachers selected into the program. We also must provide our NJASK data, without student names so Rutgers may measure the success of the program. It was recommended by the committee that we select two teachers from two buildings to provide a chance for them to collaborate rather than a single teacher in each building. We will meet with the program coordinator during the week of August 29th to discuss the selection process.

- High School Issues – The CTC reviewed the Executive Summaries for six newly written or revised curricula documents. These included the two new AP science courses, Physics and Chemistry. Environmental Science and Calculus were both revised. World History for grades 6 and 7 was also revised.
- A financial summary of the District's summer school program was reviewed with the CTC. Income/Loss for the Summer Enrichment, Sports Camps, Summer Activity Camp, Camp Invention and the Middle and High School Summer School for credit recovery was reviewed. Overall the District gained \$17,000 from its many summer programs. The Middle-High School Program which was run for tuition for the first time showed a loss. The number of students projected to enroll was higher than the actual number of students. Additionally, the number of students qualifying for free tuition based on family income was higher than projected. The Accelerated Geometry was an overwhelming success and the CTC agreed that the District should look to expand this type of course moving forward.
- The September 12th press conference for the Algebra 1 i-pad initiative is proceeding on schedule. On Friday, August 26th a live test will be run from Edison High School to the publisher's office in California. Skype capabilities will be tested as will the i-pad cart.
- Standards Solutions has been hired to provide instructional assistance in language arts and mathematics at Edison High School and for special education math classes at John P. Stevens High School. The Edison High School project will include all 11th grade Level 2 English and Math classes while the John P. Stevens High School project will include grades 9 through 11 special education math. A meeting was held with the consultant, supervisors of math and language arts and building administrators to select dates. The project involves professional development for teachers, demonstration lessons, reviews of student work and access to the website which contains lessons and resources to assist teachers in better preparing students for HSPA. A portion of the program will also involve working with the senior students that will be retaking the HSPA in October.
- AVID, a program designed to improve students' critical thinking, reading and writing abilities to prepare students to succeed in challenging courses and post secondary success will be undertaking for Edison High School. The 2011-2012 school year is a year of preparation. Dr. Allison Crerar, the Supervisor of Guidance at Edison High School will be the District Coordinator and will begin to attend training sessions this fall. The program is designed to take the "middle" level student who will work with specially trained teachers to challenge themselves. There is an AVID course which participating students will have in their high school schedule. The program will start with one 9th grade class.
- ACT Suite of Assessments will be added for our 9th and 10th grade students. The ACT, which tests for English, Math, Reading and Science, has become widely accepted. The Engage and Explore Assessments are designed for 8th and 9th grade students and the Plan is for 10th grade students. All provide teachers, parents and students a wide range of information on students which will help them better plan for college readiness. A career possibility indicator is included which is developed based on the students strengths.
- PSATs will again be offered to ALL 10th and 11th grade students at both high schools. This will be administered on Wednesday, October 12th. This was the District practice until the 2010-2011 school year, when it was ended for budget reasons. It resulted in far fewer students taking the test, a good preparation tool for the SATs and National Merit Scholar basis for 11th grade students.
- The Honor Society induction at both high schools will be moved to the fall. Steps will also be put in place to assure consistency of selection between both schools. A rubric will be developed which will be shared with eligible students so they may prepare their application to showcase their strengths.

- The Read 180 Program will not be offered at Edison High School. The 9th grade students assigned to that class will instead receive traditional English Level 2 instruction using the Success Maker program as a supplement. The teachers will receive training on September 13th in the program. The teachers have been informed and the classroom has been modified to a traditional high school program.
- TECHNOLOGY UPDATES
- Dr. O'Malley reported on the various technology initiatives. They fall into two broad categories, classroom instruction and community outreach.
- Related to classroom instruction it was reported that over 300 Promethean Boards have been installed over the summer. Netbook carts have added 100 computers to each of the four middle schools. They have also received 30 new PCs for each of their media centers. Edison High School has received 40 new PCs for their media center.
- Both John Adams and Thomas Jefferson Middle Schools have become wireless campuses. Smart tables will be purchased so that there will be one in each elementary school for use in the kindergarten classrooms.
- Parent/Community communication will also be improved. All teachers of grade 6 through 12 will use the on-line gradebook feature of Genesis. This will allow us to open the Parent Portal, giving parents access to their students' progress 24/7. Teachers will receive training at the beginning of the school year. Communication will go out to parents on how they can sign up for access. We will have people available at Back to School Nights to help parents register as well.
- Dr. O'Malley has worked with Blackboard to develop a My Edison APP. This will be launched in October and will give anyone with a Smartphone instant access to any information on our website. The i-dashboard on the website currently contains enrollment and some demographic data. This will be expanded throughout the year to include other items such as test data.

2. Finance Committee

Dr. Heelan reported that the committee met August 18, 2011 from 9:45 A.M. at Education Center.

Discussion:

- The "local school tax" break out on tax bills was discussed and more information had to be gathered to establish the reason for this tax.
- Selection of a School District Architect was reviewed and sentiment was expressed to secure a "design and build" architect by issuing a RFP for proposals.
- The district board goal of constructing more classrooms for Edison High School was analyzed briefly and the decision was made to form a group to meet with Principal, Charles Ross, tour the Edison High School facility and delineate the number and types of classrooms required.
- The board awaits action by the Mayor's Office to hand over the deed in September for the Kilmer building. The preliminary floor plans have been completed by Architect, Thomas Rienzi.
- Summer projects, such as the Menlo Park Elementary School parking lot and the Woodrow Wilson Middle School boiler installation, were updated.
- The next meeting of the Finance & Facilities Committee has been scheduled for Thursday, September 15, 2011 at 8:30 A.M. in the Education Center.

3. Policy Committee

Dr. O'Malley reported that the committee discussed the following items:

- Bylaw #0142 – Board Member Qualifications, Prohibited Acts and Code of Ethics

Mrs. Anes congratulated Mrs. AnnMarie Griffin-Ussak and Mrs. Joan Valentine on their new positions.

Mrs. Iyer discussed building of the administrative team and said this would be an exciting beginning of school.

Dr. O'Malley recapped the 2011-2012 school year, mentioning there are 14,600 students enrolled. He mentioned that the district fared very well following the recent earthquake and hurricane. He also commended the work of the custodial staff, especially Harry Maxwell from Lindeneau School, for their diligent work in the clean-up after Hurricane Irene.


