

I. CALL TO ORDER/FLAG SALUTE

The September 24, 2012 Public Meeting of the Edison Board of Education was called to order by Board President, Mr. Gene I. Maeroff, at 7:00 P.M. at Woodrow Wilson Middle School, 50 Woodrow Wilson Drive, Edison, NJ.

IV. WOODROW WILSON MIDDLE SCHOOL PRESENTATION – PATRICIA COTOIA

Mrs. Cotoia, Principal of Woodrow Wilson Middle School, recognized grade 6 science teacher, Mr. Akhtar Nasser, for fully integrating technology in the classroom. He created his own computer lab by rebuilding donated machines. He is one of 24 science teachers in the state selected to attend a week long sustainable energy institute that explored opportunities for students to “go green” and participate in STEM activities. He contributes to the school community beyond the classroom and serves as a promethean support group leader, advisor of two clubs (robotics and technology homework help club) and supports the technology education of district employees by regularly teaching computer workshops to teachers, paraprofessionals and secretaries.

IX. COMMITTEE REPORTS

1. Finance/Facilities Committee

Dr. Heelan reported that the Committee met on September 4, 2012 at the Education Center.

In attendance were: Mrs. Veena Iyer, Mrs. Theresa A. Ward, Dr. Frank Heelan, Dr. Richard O'Malley, Mr. Daniel P. Michaud, Mr. Thomas Rienzi, Architect and Mr. Peter Campisano from USA Architects, along with an Associate.

Discussion:

- The science lab addition proposed for Edison High School was a two-story addition estimated to be 20,000 sq. ft. The initial cost estimate was placed at \$250 per sq. ft. or \$5 million, with another half million for site costs.
- The overall size of the proposed science lab addition grew in area and was larger than initially estimated and, as a result, the cost estimate ballooned to \$7 million, not the original \$5.5 million estimate.
- With the cost of the lease purchase still to be budgeted for John P. Stevens High School science labs until the 2014-15 budget, the \$7 million project was deemed cost prohibitive by the Finance and Facilities Committee, and would have to be scaled back to more modest, affordable proportions.
- Two solutions were proposed. The first solution is a one story, six lab addition with an open canopy for an estimated cost of \$3.9 million, including "soft" costs. The second solution is a two story, six lab addition with a connecting corridor at the second floor for an estimated cost of \$4.5 million.
- Both additions are scheduled to be bid at the end of October/beginning of November 2012, and the Board can decide the preferred addition based on the proposed bids.
- Construction will commence in January/February 2013, depending on weather conditions. The one story addition, if approved, is estimated to be completed by August 2013. The two story addition is estimated to be finished by October 2013.
- General discussion ensued on summer projects and concern was expressed about the completion of the locker installation at the Thomas Jefferson Middle School.

The next meeting the Finance/Facilities Committee will be held on Tuesday, October 2, 2012 at 1:00 P.M. at the Education Center.

2. Curriculum Committee

Mrs. Anes reported that the Curriculum Committee met on September 24, 2012 at the Education Center.

In attendance were Richard O'Malley, Ed.D., Ms. Margaret DeLuca, Mrs. AnnMarie Griffin-Ussak, Mr. Gene I. Maeroff, Mrs. Veena Iyer, Mrs. Margot Harris and Mrs. Deborah A. Anes.

Discussion:

- Mrs. Griffin-Ussak presented improvements to the second grade social studies unit pertaining to Edison. The district will be taking advantage of all of the history right here in Edison. All of the changes and additions will be followed in each elementary school.
- Mrs. Griffin-Ussak then updated the committee regarding the new Spanish program, G&T and Math in Focus (in kindergarten and at James Monroe Elementary School). All programs are up and running and feedback has been very positive thus far.
- Ms. DeLuca updated the committee on details of the changes to the Physical Education program at the middle schools and high schools. Fitness days have been eliminated based on student input at the four schools where the committee has met with them. Instead, fitness is being incorporated into the program on a daily basis, relating to the activity the students are performing.
- The Edison Board of Education is beginning to plan a partnership with Middlesex County College in which students at both high schools will be able to take courses at the college and receive credit. More details will follow in the coming months.
- PSAT's will be taken by all juniors at both high schools on October 17<sup>th</sup>. This is at no cost to the parents. Sophomores will take the PLAN, which is an ACT product used last year. Ninth and twelfth graders will have a delayed opening that day and buses will be provided for all.
- The Committee reviewed a summary of AP test results from last spring. In total, 921 students took at least one AP test, with a total of 1742 tests taken in 28 different subjects.
- Mr. Charles Ross, Edison High School Principal, joined the meeting to discuss the Edison High School pilot of having no homeroom. This appears to be working well, as students understand the importance of being on-time as learning begins at 7:40 A.M. On one sample date, comparing this year to last year, the number of students tardy to school was almost 50% less this year.
- The Committee briefly discussed NWEA testing, which is currently being administered in all middle schools, as planned.
- Regarding technology, Dr. O'Malley informed the Committee that all of the updates are on schedule. The Promethean tables will arrive at the middle schools on October 4<sup>th</sup>. The science and social studies curriculum will be loaded on these, adding another dimension to those subjects. Edison will be the first district in this country to have these tables.

The meeting adjourned at 12:00 noon.

3. Policy Committee

Ms. Shah reported that the Policy Committee met on September 19, 2012 at the Education Center.

Mrs. Bonderowitz mentioned that her children attended Woodrow Wilson Middle School and that Fran DeFranzo was a great math teacher.

Dr. Heelan attended the POW/MIA Remembrance in Edison and commended the Edison High School Choir for their performance at the event. He also discussed an article regarding sugar consumption.

Mrs. Iyer talked about the C.A.R.E. food and wine tasting and C.A.R.E. Walk events coming up in October.

Mr. Maeroff read the four board goals for the record and read an article on dual enrollment. He also said that there will be a zoning board hearing on 10/16/12 in the town hall regarding a 43 2-bedroom apartment complex proposed near Middlesex County College.

XI. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Andy Hibell, Resident, suggested that a one floor addition with a second floor empty shell be added to Edison High School. In the event that a second floor would be needed, the shell would already be there.

A Senior Student from John P. Stevens High School, President of the Key Club, mentioned that the club is to be cut because the Club Advisor, Mr. Andruzzi needs a co-advisor.


The Board committed to continue the Key Club at John P. Stevens High School.
