# IX. COMMITTEE REPORTS

## Finance/Facilities Committee

Dr. Heelan reported that the Committee met on July 17, 2012 at the Education Center.

In attendance were: Mrs. Veena Iyer, Mrs. Theresa A. Ward, Dr. Frank Heelan, Dr. Richard O'Malley, and Mr. Daniel P. Michaud.

## Discussion:

Cost estimates for the Edison Primary School are being developed by District's Construction Manager, Thomas Rienzi, and hope has been expressed that the town will give us the keys in the not-to-distant future.

John P. Stevens High School's boiler upgrades are on target for completion by October 2012.

The gymnasium partitions at the five designated schools are in progress.

The Lindeneau drainage system will commence when approved by the Town Construction Code Official, Lisa Larue.

Interior alterations at Herbert Hoover Middle School and John Marshall Elementary School are scheduled for completion prior to the opening of school.

Drainage work for the synthetic turf field at Edison High School is well underway and we are awaiting approval from the Department of Environmental Protection to proceed with the turf field at John P. Stevens High School.

The interior alterations at Lincoln Elementary School will provide for the 800 sq. ft. library, three small group rooms and air conditioning for the entire unit.

USA Architects is currently updating the Long Range Facility Plan (LRFP) that will be completed by the end of the summer. The new science wing at Edison High School will be bid in September, awarded in October and finished by September 1, 2013.

Round cafeteria tables (8 students at each table) have been ordered and will be set up this summer in the four middle schools.

Summer capital projects being worked on by the Edison maintenance crew include: (1) roof replacements at Edison and John P. Stevens High Schools and John Adams Middle School; (2) cement site work at eight schools; (3) Thomas Jefferson Middle School lockers; (4) John P. Stevens High School gym floor; (5) John P. Steven High School tennis courts (August); (6) James Monroe Elementary School ceiling replacements; (7) Lincoln Elementary School urinal replacements; and (8) library renovations at Benjamin Franklin, Lindeneau and Martin Luther King Elementary Schools and John P. Stevens High School.

- A rationale was given for employing the Sundance Associates to conduct a demographic study for a cost of \$20,900. Beyond the basic services of enrollment projections based on the 2010 census, Geographic Information Systems (GIS) software will apply student databases to alternate solutions for redistricting, school capacity analysis, and searches for sites for potential new elementary school on the north side of town.
- Adjustments to the salaries of specific administrators were mandated by the County Superintendent, Dr. Samuel Stewart.

The next meeting the Finance/Facilities Committee will be held on Thursday, August 16<sup>th</sup> at 9:30 A.M. at the Education Center.

2. Curriculum Committee

Mrs. Anes reported that the Curriculum Committee met on July 17, 2012 at the Education Center.

Discussion:

- District Wide - Teacher Evaluation Pilot Update Ms. DeLuca reported that the principals, supervisors and teacher leadership team from WWMS and JAMS received professional development on June 25<sup>th</sup> and 29<sup>th</sup>. She and the building principals have just completed a list of sample evidence for each level of teacher proficiency. This will be emailed to the group which will reconvene on August 21<sup>st</sup> to finalize the DRAFT. The rubric will be ready for distribution to teachers at both middle schools at the opening of school. Mrs. Anes asked that the final rubric be shared with the CTC.
- Elementary - Report Card Indicators for World Language. Mrs. Griffin-Ussak shared the newly developed section of the Elementary report card for Grades 1 thru 5 which will be included to reflect the addition of Spanish in the Elementary Schools. Students will be assessed each marking period by the World Language Teachers.
- Secondary 6-12 - Middle States Process Ms. DeLuca reviewed the Middle States AFG process which will begin in September in preparation for a visitation for accreditation in December, 2013. The AFG protocol was selected because it focuses on student achievement. Both principals have appointed internal coordinators and will be creating a Planning Team of 15 to 20 members to lead the process. A Board member is needed on each team. Mrs. Anes volunteered to be part of the JPSHS Team. The first requirement is to develop a Mission Statement, Statement of Beliefs and a Profile of a Graduate. This will be the same for both schools and will be presented to the Board when the final drafts are complete. On-line surveys containing questions on the 12 MSA standards are required and will be administered to students, staff and the general public. The Planning team will evaluate results of the survey, detailed student data and develop school specific objectives on student performance (2 – 4 required) and organizational capacity. Actions Plans must then be developed following MSA format detailing what will be put in place to achieve the objectives over the next seven years. The visitation in December 2013, will review our process and documentation. The visitation team reports to MSA and a recommendation for accreditation will then be made. The schools will require an annual review, after which goals and/or action plans may be modified and are reported to MSA.
- Foods and Nutrition – MS to support consistency across the four middle schools a book has been selected that contains age and nutrition appropriate recipes and information. This will replace the few remaining classroom copies of a book that is more than 15 years old.



- Textbook Approval

- o Prego: An Invitation to Italian
- o Integrated Chinese
- o Essentials of Anatomy & Physiology
- o Conceptual Physics
- o Forensic Science – Fundamentals & Investigations

All of these books are for new courses added at both high schools.

- Homework/Class Participation - In an effort to address grade inflation that results from an over reliance on Homework/Class Participation as part of the marking period grade, Ms. DeLuca recommends that they be factored into grades at no more than 10%. This also addresses the student who though demonstrating proficiency on tests and quizzes, receives a lower grade because he/she does not complete homework. Dr. O'Malley and Mr. Maeroff expressed concern that if homework carries too low a weight, students will choose not to do it, regardless of its merit. Both said they would prefer to see any limits introduced on a smaller scale so the impact can be measured before it is introduced on a broad basis. No decision was made and Ms. DeLuca will continue discussions with the building principals and content supervisors.

- STARS – Pre-Post Test Data Ms. DeLuca shared the data with the CTC. She stated that the true measure will be the students' NJASK results when compared to their results from the previous year. There was some drop in the reading scores, but in an effort to expose students to both, the pre-test was narrative and the post-test was expository so it was not an appropriate comparison. There was some decline in the grade 8 math for which the teachers could not identify any pattern. However, the principals and teachers both shared anecdotal stories from discussion with students in which they stated they felt better prepared than in prior years for what they found on the NJASK. The principals want to continue the program next year, but start it earlier than January to allow time to better focus instruction.

- Middlesex Community College Meeting

- o Dual Credit and 2 + 2 Opportunities

For many years our students have been able to obtain MCC credit for courses taught at EHS and JPSHS by paying a fee of \$100. Many students take advantage of this but while it provides college credit, it does not provide college experience. We are beginning discussion with MCC to have our students take actual college courses on their campus for which we will provide high school credit. By exposing our students to the requirements of college work they can gain confidence and be better prepared to be successful in college upon graduation. We are scheduling a meeting with the Dean and community coordinator in early August. This would be an option in addition to the current practice.

- Technology - Update – Installations Mr. McSorley updated the CTC with regard to technology installations and improvements. The installation of 211 Promethean Boards in the middle schools and some elementary schools is complete along with 300 PCs. On August 13th installation of 300 desktop computers will begin at EHS. This summer a total of 820 computers will be installed in EHS, JPS, Ben Franklin, Lindeneau, Washington, JAMS and HHMS. These have been in computer labs and media centers. The two music technology labs at the high schools are almost complete. A new vendor has been engaged for the wireless installation at JPS, WWMS and HHMS. Infrastructure upgrades continue. There has been no unplanned downtime since the initial phase was completed this spring. The transition to a new e-mail system is in the final testing phase. The District is moving to a Google platform which is more user friendly. The move to the cloud also continues. The Destiny program used by our media center has been complete. The SPAM filter is also in the cloud. A new anti-virus system has been installed. We have also readied hundreds of new iPads to support the FUSE math application at the middle schools and both high schools, in addition to one cart added to each elementary school. Mr. McSorley will send Mr. Maeroff a summary of the technology progress to include in a future newsletter.

X. BOARD MEMBERS – OPEN DISCUSSION

Mr. Maeroff welcomed the new ETEA leadership and congratulated Emil Ferlicchi for 43 years of service to Edison.

Dr. Heelan discussed the new law regarding text messaging while driving, which now carries a reckless driving charge.

Mrs. Ward mentioned that she received an email from a parent, regarding the cost of school pictures.

XI. PUBLIC COMMENTS


Emil Ferlicchi, out-going ETEA President, stated that he accomplished a lot during his tenure as President of the ETEA.
