

I. CALL TO ORDER/FLAG SALUTE

The September 30, 2013 Public Meeting of the Edison Board of Education was called to order by Board President, Mr. Gene I. Maeroff, at 7:00 P.M. at the Woodbrook Elementary School, 15 Robin Road, Edison, NJ.

II. ROLL CALL

Mr. Michaud took the roll, and the following members were present:

Also in attendance were Richard O'Malley, Ed.D, Superintendent, Mr. Daniel P. Michaud, Business Administrator/Board Secretary, and Mr. Jonathan Busch, Board Attorney.

III. OPENING STATEMENT

Mr. Maeroff read the following opening statement:

“The New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this act, the Edison Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time and place thereof posted in the Board of Education Administrative Offices. Copies of these notices were sent to the Home News and Tribune and the Star Ledger on April 25, 2013.

The Public may participate at regular meetings in accordance with the By-Laws and the applicable State regulations.

IV. WOODBROOK ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PRESENTATION – NICOLE CIRILLO, PRINCIPAL

Mrs. Cirillo reported that there is always something exciting going on at Woodbrook. They have recently undergone the renovation of the beautiful new library/media center and are standing in the newly refurbished multipurpose room for this meeting. Both rooms are bright, child friendly and welcoming to children and their families.

She asked everyone if they noticed the new electronic sign outside, stating that this was a welcomed gift from the PTA. Always working to improve communication for all of our families, Mrs. Cirillo stated that the PTA President and Executive Board dedicate their precious time for the benefit of all of the families at Woodbrook. They have donated ActivSlates for each classroom, allowing students and teachers to manipulate the interactive whiteboard from anywhere in the classroom and ActivWands were donated so our smallest learners could write on the interactive whiteboards.

Mrs. Cirillo announced that there are beautiful murals in the hallways, created by the staff members and maintained over the years, as well as the new versions created by the Art Murals Club. This is one of the many after school clubs offered. Over four hundred students participate in clubs each week at Woodbrook. One of the greatest accomplishments is the Math Club, which is run by the school's parents. Each week approximately one hundred fifty third, fourth and fifth grade students come back at night with parent volunteers and work on problem solving skills just for the fun of it. They compete for bragging rights in international contests and have received meritorious awards for their scores each and every year.

The teachers at Woodbrook are always thinking about what they can do next. This includes two iPad only paperless classrooms and the start of a Bring Your Own Device initiative in grades three through five, with parental support and input. Mrs. Cirillo mentioned that last week she met with representatives from an assortment of grades on a Saturday morning at a workshop called “Whole Brain Teaching.” The morning was spent learning how to better engage our learners and ensure their comprehension and collaboration in some very unorthodox ways.

Third grade teachers will present instructional planning workshops for parents, once again this year, in order to help them to better understand the standardized tests their children will take for the first time and the Curriculum Resource Teacher will help parents in grades three, four and five better understand how to help their children in writing. Mrs. Cirillo stated that her favorite part of the workshop is giving parents the hints and feedback for improvement on actual student work.

Apart from academics, each year at Woodbrook, individual teachers help the children to think about others who could benefit from their generosity. Teachers hold fundraisers for Autism Awareness, Breast Cancer Awareness, Special Olympics, St. Baldrick’s Fight Against Cancer and Jump Rope for Heart, just to name a few. The Student Council holds collections for UNICEF, Toys for Tots, the children at JFK; and they visit senior citizens for the holidays to bring some cheer. Each year, staff members arrange for donations and collections to our soldiers abroad and to communities near and far who suffered losses. Important activities are an everyday part of Woodbrook because of the caring people in the school.

What makes a school spectacular? Mrs. Cirillo answered this complicated question. Simple answers are test scores, or sports ranking, or admission to specific universities. But a school is only as good as the people who breathe life into it each and every day. Woodbrook is spectacular because of its staff of caring, intelligent adults who are passionate about teaching and helping children to learn. Woodbrook is spectacular because it is a community of families that support their children and the school by encouraging students to apply themselves in all that they do. Most of all, Woodbrook is spectacular because of the dedicated, disciplined, kind and intelligent children who respect education and what education represents.

When new students walk through the door, there are hopes and expectations from all constituents. A principal and a teacher hope the child will be a role model for others in citizenship and academic achievement. A parent hopes that the school will provide a safe, nurturing atmosphere in which the child will thrive socially and academically. A student hopes they will be befriended by kind students and recognized for their contributions and talents by their teacher and peers.

Mrs. Cirillo believes all hopes and expectations were realized the day they welcomed a very special student, Brendan Tang, into Woodbrook Elementary School. She remembered the day she met Brendan Tang and his mother. They had heard about Woodbrook School and were considering a transfer from a private school which he had been attending. Brendan and his mother sat in on a Woodbrook tradition, a Positive Behavior Support ceremony, which highlights the very best Woodbrook behavior, as well as their musical talents. As luck would have it, Brendan was very much enthused by the ceremony, which included student musicians that day, as Brendan Tang has been recognized as an outstanding pianist at multiple New York Music Competitions throughout his childhood. Brendan proved to be a wonderful, hard-working and dedicated student.

Always participating in charitable campaigns and school functions, Brendan was interested in more than earning his grades, but also in giving back to his school. When Woodbrook suffered a terrible loss to our school family, Brendan approached Mrs. Cirillo. He had been teaching himself at home to play a song on his trumpet and he hoped that he could honor the memory of a teacher who had a profound impact on his life by playing Amazing Grace for his family at a memorial at Woodbrook School.

Brendan eagerly joined the after school chorus club not only participating as a member of the chorus, but accompanying the chorus on the piano for the two years he was a student at Woodbrook. His commitment to the Woodbrook chorus continued after his promotion from Woodbrook to Woodrow Wilson Middle School. Each and every Thursday throughout the year and for each of the concerts that the chorus club attends, Brendan Tang leaves his busy middle school schedule to assist Ms. Tomasella and the chorus club. Brendan does not ask for recognition or community service hours for his volunteer work. It does not fulfill any requirement; he does it just for the sake of giving.

His teachers state that he is truly a “gifted” student in heart, mind and body. Always thinking of others, he secretly placed a stuffed rabbit on his teacher’s desk to make her smile after her mother passed away. In addition to his musical abilities, he was also a competitive swimmer and his artwork graced the cover of the 2012 Woodbrook Yearbook.

While Brendan Tang has been recognized for his musical talents at Carnegie Hall and many other musical venues, tonight, he is recognized for his pure selfless dedication to Woodbrook School.

V. DEDICATION OF EDISON HIGH SCHOOL WING

Resolution Naming the Edison High School Science Wing in Honor of Former Principal Leo Scanlon

WHEREAS, the Edison Township Board of Education (“Board”) is in the process of completing a new Science Wing at Edison High School, which is expected to be completed in October 2013; and

WHEREAS, Board Policy 7250 provides that a school facility may be named to memorialize the outstanding service of a school district employee or officer; and

WHEREAS, the Board has designated a committee to consider the contributions of former Edison High School Principal Leo Scanlon and where a new Science Wing should be dedicated in Mr. Scanlon’s name; and

WHEREAS, having thoroughly considered the issue, the committee has recommended that the Board name the new Science Wing after Mr. Scanlon out of admiration and respect for this remarkable Board employee; and

WHEREAS, upon determining that the new Science Wing should be named after Mr. Scanlon, the committee has raised sufficient private funds to cover the costs associated with a plaque formally dedicating the new Science Wing to Mr. Scanlon.

NOW, THEREFORE,
BE IT RESOLVED: that in consideration of Mr. Scanlon’s contribution to the Edison Township School District, the Board hereby approves the naming of the new Science Wing at Edison High School in honor of former Principal Leo Scanlon; and

BE IT FURTHER
RESOLVED: that a plaque dedicating the new Science Wing to Mr. Scanlon be placed in the Science Wing so that present and future students and employees may recognize Mr. Scanlon’s extraordinary contribution to and impact on the Edison Township School District community.

XI. COMMITTEE REPORTS

1. Finance & Facilities Committee

Dr. Heelan reported that the Committee met on September 20, 2013 at the Education Center.

In attendance were: Mrs. Deborah A. Anes, Mrs. Lori A. Bonderowitz, Mrs. Theresa E. Ward, Dr. Richard O'Malley, Mrs. Daniel P. Michaud, Mr. Kenneth Stromsland and Architects Tom Rienzi and Frank Messineo.

Discussion:

- Mr. Messineo reviewed several summer projects that were not completed according to the time specifications and might subject the contractors to potential liquidated damages. The toilet room upgrades at Washington and Lincoln Schools, as well as the nurse's suite at Woodbrook School exceeded substantially the completion date in the contract. Similarly, the home economics rooms at Edison and John P. Stevens High Schools took much longer than the contract completion dates. Mr. Messineo recommended that the school district bid the summer projects in February to get a head start in planning collaboratively with the contractors.
- Mr. Rienzi reported on the completion of the J.P. Stevens High School turf field on a timely basis. The Edison High School Science Wing is currently ahead of schedule, but has one problem to resolve-water pressure. American Water Company has conducted water flow tests and proposes the school district might require a vertical pumping system to be installed near Preston Avenue at an approximate cost of \$50,000.
- The committee for dedicating the Edison High School Science Wing in honor of former Principal and teacher, Leo Scanlon, met at Edison High School on September 12th, investigated the placement of a plaque for the new science wing and set the potential date for the ribbon-cutting and dedication for November 21st. A motion to dedicate the EHS Science Wing in honor of Mr. Scanlon will be placed on the action agenda meeting this month.
- The Kilmer Project, with the town offering the school district 2.3 acres with a 30,000 square foot building, was reviewed. Other possible options to relieve student overcrowding in the north end of Edison were considered. Acreage at some schools in this section of town include: Woodbrook– 21.5 acres; M.L. King–13 acres; J. Madison Intermediate–32.7 acres; W. Wilson Middle School–40 acres; J. Adams Middle School–42 acres; and J.P. Stevens High School–56 acres.

1. Curriculum & Technology Committee

Mrs. Anes reported that the Committee met on September 20, 2013 at the Education Center.

In attendance were: Dr. Richard O'Malley, Ms. Margaret DeLuca, Mrs. Annmarie Griffin-Ussak, Mr. Gene I. Maeroff, Mrs. Veena Iyer, Mrs. Deborah A. Anes and Mrs. Theresa E. Ward

Discussion:

- Mrs. Griffin-Ussak shared the Curriculum Revisions for Elementary Spanish, which makes small adjustments to last year's program, and Elementary Instrumental Music, which is growing rapidly and schools are having space issues for practice sessions.
- The Committee reviewed the enrollment numbers by school and grade for the gifted and talented program.
- The Committee discussed the opening of the Edison High School Science and Engineering Academy and the plans in place to assemble next year's class.
- The Committee discussed the summer reading program that just concluded and the many positive comments that were received by parents, especially at the middle school level.
- The Committee talked about the Middle States Accreditation and preparation for the Middle States team to visit both high schools in December. Both schools are on schedule and will submit the balance of the required paperwork prior to the deadline.
- In order to align with the Common Core Standards, the Committee reviewed curriculum revisions to the following courses: (1) World History – Grades 6 & 7; (2) The American Citizen – Grade 8; (3) Science – Grade 7; (4) Middle School Spanish; (5) Middle School French; (6) World History-High School; (7) AP Chemistry; (8) Algebra 2; (9) AP Chinese; (10) Italian II; (11) Guitar II; (12) Music Technology II; (13) Ceramics; (14) Accounting; (15) Macro and Micro Economics; (16) Marketing and Advertising; (17) Introduction to Engineering; (18) English – Grades 6-8 and (19) English – 9-12.
- The Committee briefly discussed the high school final exams and discussed the current status of the AVID Program and the plans for expansion to grades 8, 9 and 10 this year.
- The Administration gave a quick update to the new teacher evaluation model.
- Ms. DeLuca explained the status of the upcoming QSAC visit. Edison is one of the districts chosen to be reviewed this year.
