29. Participation in Coordinated Transportation – MRESC

WHEREAS, the Edison Board of Education desires to transport special education, non-public, public and vocational school students to specific destinations; and

WHEREAS, the Middlesex Regional Educational Services Commission, hereinafter referred to as the MRESC, offers coordinated transportation services; and

WHEREAS, the MRESC will organize and schedule routes to achieve the maximum cost effectiveness;

NOW, THEREFORE,
IT IS AGREED: that in consideration of pro-rated contract costs, plus an administration fee of 2% or 4% for member districts, or of 6% for non-member districts, as presented to the Edison Board of Education as calculated by the billing formula adopted by the MRESC's Board of Education. Said formula shall be based on a route cost divided by the number of students allocated to each participating district. The total amount to be charged to districts will be adjusted based on actual costs.

1. The MRESC will provide the following services:
 - a. routes coordinated with other districts to achieve a maximum cost reduction while maintaining a realistic capacity and travel time;
 - b. monthly billing and invoices;
 - c. computer print-outs of student lists for all routes coordinated by MRESC;
 - d. all necessary interaction and communication between the sending district, receiving school, and the respective transportation contractors;
 - e. constant review and revision of routes; provide transportation within three days or sooner after receipt of the formal written request; and

IT IS FURTHER
AGREED:

that the Edison Board of Education will provide the MRESC with the following:

- a. requests for special transportation on approved forms to be provided by the MRESC, completed in full and signed by previously authorized district personnel;
 - b. withdrawal for any transportation must be provided in writing and signed by authorized district personnel; no billing adjustments will be made without this completed form and will become effective on the date the form is received;
- II. Additional Cost – all additional costs generated by unique requests such as mid-day runs or early dismissals will be borne by the district. All such costs must first be approved by the Edison Board of Education.
- III. Length of Agreement – this agreement and obligations and requirements therein shall be in effect between July 1, 2014 and June 30, 2015.
- IV. Entire Agreement – this agreement constitutes the entire and only agreement between the parties and may be amended by an instrument in writing over authorized signature.

XI. COMMITTEE REPORTS

1. Finance & Facilities Committee

Dr. Heelan reported that the Finance and Facilities Committee met on June 10, 2014 at the Education Center.

In attendance were: Mrs. Deborah A. Anes, Mrs. Jerry Shi, Mrs. Theresa E. Ward, Dr. Frank Heelan, Dr. Richard O'Malley, Mr. Daniel P. Michaud, Mr. Kenneth Stromsland, Architects Tom Rienzi and Architect Ken Karle from LAN Associates.

Discussion:

- LAN Architect Mr. Karle presented a basic rendering of the new James Monroe Elementary School and responded to questions on the floor plans. To be constructed for 600 students, the discussion revolved around the three kindergarten classrooms, a dedicated instrumental music room, cafeteria and kitchen (requirements to be proposed by Chartwells), amount of parking spaces needed, back-up generator for the community space, drainage problems, sunscreens for the south and west areas, toilets and HVAC controls. The soil engineer will commence test pits on July 11th.
- Mr. Rienzi and Mr. Stromsland analyzed the capital improvements being worked on for St. Cecilia School: roofing and ceiling repairs, retubing and installing motors for the boilers, plumbing lines and broken toilet fixtures repaired, installing 360 window units, electric and cabling work, and stripping the terrazzo floors.
- The purchase of two instructional trailers from Middlesex County College was recommended for \$269,000 for use of the expanding instrumental music programs at the James Madison Intermediate School.
- If the insurance company approves the \$684,000 for transporting the James Monroe students, the District will consider the purchase of eight 54-passenger buses to diminish our leasing transportation costs.
- The exempt employees' salaries were reviewed and increases were recommended to the full board for approval.
- The Committee had been given a presentation and tour of the Edison Towne Corporate Center (Revlon building) as a potential school site. After careful consideration, the Committee rejected the site as a possibility for reasons of environmental factors, costs and limited space. The Industrial Realty Group was notified of this decision.
- The next meeting will convene on Wednesday, July 23, 2014 at 9:00 A.M. in the Education Center.

2. Curriculum & Technology Committee

Mrs. Anes reported that the Curriculum & Technology Committee met on July 14, 2014 at the Education Center.

In attendance were: Mrs. Deborah A. Anes, Mrs. Veena Iyer, Mrs. Jerry Shi, Mrs. Margot Harris, Ms. Margaret DeLuca and Mrs. Tara Beams.

Discussion:

- The committee discussed plans for potential parent workshops and tentative dates. The administration is planning these workshops in order to help parents understand some of the new programs and recent curriculum changes so that they can better understand and be involved in their children's education at home. Potential workshop topics include Common Core and PARCC for both elementary and secondary levels, as well as Math in Focus and Chromebooks for elementary parents.
- Ms. Beams shared ongoing elementary curriculum updates that are occurring during the summer. An extra effort is being made to assure curriculum is standardized district wide. Ms. Beams and her team are also evaluating and streamlining assessments and developing curriculum calendars by grade level to make sure they are also standardized across the district.
- We had a general discussion and review of current grouping procedures.
- We reviewed preliminary AP scores for both high schools.
- We reviewed a new textbook to be used for both AP Physics 1 and 2.
- Lastly, Ms. DeLuca shared enrollment data for the freshman students entering the Science and Engineering Academy at EHS in September. We also reviewed AP Biology results for the students who just completed their freshman year in the program which were phenomenal, with 93% achieving a score of three or higher. Remember that unlike the other high school students who take AP Biology after a full year of Level I Biology, these Academy students began with AP Biology after only a four week summer Bio prep class. These students are now taking a four week Chemistry prep session to prepare them for AP Chemistry in September. In-coming freshman are taking the same Bio prep this summer. Congratulations to the students and their teachers for achieving such success.
