

I. CALL TO ORDER/FLAG SALUTE

The September 26, 2016 Public Meeting of the Edison Board of Education was called to order by Board President, Dr. Frank Heelan, at 7:00 P.M. at Woodrow Wilson Middle School, 50 Woodrow Wilson Drive, Edison, NJ.

Woodrow Wilson Middle School student, Madison Gesualdo, led the Pledge of Allegiance.

III. OPENING STATEMENT

Dr. Heelan read the following opening statement:

"The New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this act, the Edison Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time and place thereof posted in the Board of Education Administrative Offices. Copies of these notices were sent to the Home News and Tribune and the Star Ledger on January 7, 2016.

The Public may participate at regular meetings in accordance with the By-Laws and the applicable State regulations.

IV. RECOGNITION – WOODROW WILSON MIDDLE SCHOOL – PATRICIA COTOIA, PRINCIPAL

Ms. Cotoia welcomed everyone to Woodrow Wilson Middle School and thanked Dr. O'Malley and the Board of Education for this opportunity to showcase her school.

Ms. Cotoia reported that the Woodrow "brand" is one of high achievement and excellence. Not a week passes where she doesn't receive a call or email about how to apply for admission to Woodrow Wilson Middle School. Many of these inquiries come from within the United States, and some even come from Canada, England or India. We have become of international interest thanks to the strength of our teaching staff, extremely satisfied parents and competitive programs such as Odyssey of the Mind or the Math Competition Team.

However, she explained, the school strives to balance rigor in the classroom with activities for social development, such as dances and Battle of the Classes; clubs for enrichment, such as computer coding or debate; and competitive, as well as intramural athletics. So, the Woodrow Wilson brand is deeper than academics...it's about developing well rounded children. And this is why she selected Madison Gesualdo to lead the Pledge of Allegiance. Madison takes full advantage of everything Woodrow offers. She embodies the Woodrow brand in excelling in the classroom, on the soccer field, as a peer leader, on the stage, and in art class. Madison rises to every challenge, embracing each activity with an open mind and heart. Ms. Cotoia thanked Madison for being a role model in the school community.

Ms. Cotoia also highlighted one of Woodrow Wilson Middle School's strongest programs that often does not get public recognition, the Visual Arts program. Under the guidance and direction of teachers Melissa Molnar and Brian Romeo, the students grow and blossom. The talent expressed through art work surpasses what she has seen in high schools from neighboring towns. Beyond the beautiful displays in the school, the students have created and painted a mural in the community, which hangs on the Valvoline oil change building on Parsonage Road; and they've had a community art show at the Edison Municipal Building. She presented a short video to give everyone some additional insight about the Visual Arts program.

Ms. Cotoia then invited Mrs. Molnar and Mr. Romeo to the podium. She explained that at Woodrow Wilson, art is a program that ignites passion, and for some students, it may be the one class where they feel freedom to be themselves. American writer, publisher, artist, and philosopher, Elbert Hubbard, once said, "Art is not a thing, it is a way." These two teachers have made art "a way" by facilitating a dynamic program and by continually inspiring their students. In conclusion, Ms. Cotoia proudly announced that the Woodrow Wilson community and she would like to express their gratitude and appreciation for all that Mrs. Molnar and Mr. Romeo do and for making the Woodrow brand even greater.

XI. COMMITTEES

1. Finance & Facilities Committee

Mr. Errico reported that the Finance and Facilities Committee met on August 22, 2016 at the Education Center.

In attendance were: Mr. Ralph Errico, Dr. Frank Heelan, Mrs. Deborah A. Anes, Mrs. Beth Moroney, Dr. Richard O'Malley, Mr. Daniel P. Michaud, Mr. Kenneth Stromsland, Mr. Ken Karle (LAN Associates), Mr. Tony Taluto (EPIC), Messrs. Al and Joe Mauti (M&M Construction)

Discussion:

- Menlo Park School – The construction project is in two distinct phases. M&M Construction representatives gave the following status report: The eight classroom addition will be ready for the opening day of school on 9/6/16. The teachers can set up their rooms as of 9/1/16. The gymnasium addition is currently scheduled to be ready by mid-November.
- James Monroe School – The construction project is currently scheduled to be completed by 10/20/16 with a TCO by 9/28/16. The kitchen equipment and technology still has to be scheduled to be moved from St. Cecelia's to the new James Monroe School. The District's current plan is to have the students transferred to the new school by 1/3/17.
- Woodbrook School - The construction project's bid had to be postponed from 8/16/16 to 9/8/16 due to a contractor's claim that they did not receive a specification addendum in the required time prior to the bid opening.
- Mr. Stromsland provided an update of the summer projects, most of which are completed.

2. Finance & Facilities Committee

Mr. Errico reported that the Finance and Facilities Committee met on September 21, 2016 at the Education Center.

In attendance were: Mr. Ralph Errico, Dr. Frank Heelan, Mrs. Deborah A. Anes, Mrs. Theresa E. Ward, Dr. Richard O'Malley, Mr. Daniel P. Michaud and Mr. Kenneth Stromsland

Discussion:

- Woodbrook School – The construction project’s bid substantially exceeded the anticipated budget. The estimated construction cost, with the larger gymnasium revision, was \$8,500,000. The lowest bid received, of the 14 bidders, was \$10,920,000. The 2016-2017 budget included an appropriation for the Woodbrook addition of \$6,500,000.
 - The Committee discussed three possible options:
 1. Do nothing – don’t build the addition at all.
 2. Reduce the scope of the construction project to meet the \$8,500,000 construction cost estimate.
 3. Seek short term financing to allow the Board to award the project to the lowest bidder.
- Discussion ensued regarding the 639 new students that Edison realized for the 2016-17 school year and the severe overcrowding problem that is happening throughout the district.
- The Committee decided that the need for this addition is critical and therefore, short term financing was the best choice.
- The Administration had investigated the possibility of short term financing in the amount of \$5,000,000 in case the Board decided to proceed in that direction.
- The Administration is recommending McManimon, Scotland & Baumann as bond counsel at \$20,000 and the Hunterdon County Educational Services Commission as the financial advisor at \$3,250.
- The Board will be asked to approve the bond counsel and financial advisor at their 9/26/16 meeting.
- Following their approval, the bond counsel and financial advisor will begin the process of arranging the required public hearing, submitting for NJDOE approval and the specifications for the financing bid.

3. Township Liaison Committee

Dr. Heelan reported that the Township Liaison Committee met on August 25, 2016 at the Edison Municipal Complex.

In attendance were: Mayor Tom Lankey, Melissa Perilstein, Councilmen Michael Lombardi and Leonard Sendelsky, Superintendent Dr. Richard O’Malley, Board Members Frank Heelan, Beth Moroney, Shivi Prasad-Madhukar and Ralph Errico and Business Administrator/Board Secretary Daniel P. Michaud

Discussion:

- The Board gave thanks to the Township officials for the paving projects recently completed in town.
- The Board was requesting consideration to upgrade the current Latchkey program to include an educational opportunity to the participants that is not offered currently.
- The Township officials reported the current State COAH requirements that Edison must comply with and discussions ensued about the impact to the schools.
- The Township officials reported the latest information about the Amboy Avenue redevelopment project and the possible impact to the schools.
- The Board presented a copy of a resolution that was passed on 8/22/16 supporting the implementation of the current state aid formula to all districts equally. Edison has been receiving substantially less state aid per student than most districts in New Jersey. The Township officials agreed that Edison should receive more State assistance and will consider passing a similar resolution.
- The Committee discussed the current school capacities and current student enrollment and the overcrowding problems that get worse every year.
- The Board discussed the anticipated date for the ribbon-cutting ceremony for the new James Monroe School.

XII. BOARD MEMBERS – OPEN DISCUSSION

Mrs. Moroney spoke about the Edison High School Fall craft flea market and the PTSO Color Fun Run.

Mrs. Anes questioned the Amboy Avenue reconstruction impact on the schools.

Mr. Shi reported that single houses would be demolished and numerous houses built and questioned the number of families allowed to live in single family homes.

XIII. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Angie Mullin, resident, questioned the latchkey changes.

Two students who will be moving out of Edison asked if they could continue attending John P. Stevens High School.

Ellen Turano, resident, questioned if the the Latchkey changes would affect the employees.

XIV. ADJOURNMENT

There being no further questions or comments forthcoming, Dr. Heelan asked for a motion to adjourn September 26, 2016 public meeting of the Edison Board of Education at 7:34 P.M. Mrs. Bonderowitz made the motion, seconded by Mr. Errico and approved by all members present.
