# MR C C MULLER-HEAD

Like everyone in the audience this Tuesday evening, I was spellbound by the speech Lady Grenfell-Baines gave us. Both tragic and inspiring, at the age of 90 she spoke fluently about her experience as one of the 669 children saved by the extraordinary actions of Nicholas Winton during the Second World War.

As I am sure you are all aware, Nicholas Winton began in 1938 the rescue of hundreds of Jewish children from the Nazi Holocaust in an operation later known as the Czech Kindertransport. He secretly arranged for these children to be taken out of Czechoslovakia to Britain and in the process helped the children to find new families to look after them.

Lady Melina Grenfell-Baines was one of those children. She and the hundreds of others owe their lives to the actions of Winton. Her account was of hope and love during the most awful moment in human history.

And yet for me the most surprising (and no less remarkable for that) feature of the Winton story is that for 50 years it was unknown. A humble and unassuming man, who possessed a steely resolve and uncommon courage, Winton had told no one about what he had done. It was only once his wife Grete found the pictures and documents of all the children he had saved that his actions were slowly revealed to an amazed public: do watch the 'That's Life' programme on YouTube about the Life of Sir Nicholas Winton; it is one of the finest and most moving moments in television history

Winton had given the gift of life without expectation of return. His was a gift based on unconditionality: he did not even talk about what he had done to those most close to him. In Matthew 6:1-14 Jesus expresses the belief that gifts should be given in secret. It should be hidden from the eyes of the world. Winton's actions had remained hidden for half a

It was once said that

"to live by love is to live "without why""

Winton acted out of a love for humanity. He did not do it for some good in return to him personally; nor did he act for money and certainly not for fame. He acted out of love for humanity and because it was fundamentally the right thing to do; he did the thing even when no one was looking

At SWPS we call this integrity. Winton's integrity demanded and he responded.

We held our annual Senior Awards on Friday 15 November to celebrate the achievements of the Class of 2019 during their time at SWPS and to present their A Level certificates.



Upon leaving SWPS, students become Perkonians and to illustrate the importance of taking the skills and values they've learned at SWPS with them into their futures, we invited Perkonian Rachel Farago, an Opera Singer, actor and musician, back for the Address and presentation of prizes. 


# Year 7 & 8 achievements in Technology



Book of the Week



Behind the most famous movie ever made is a tale of love, magic and one incredible woman.

Hollywood, 1938: As soon as she learns that MGM is adapting her late husband's masterpiece, *The Wonderful Wizard of Oz*, Maud Gage Baum sets about trying to visit the set. Nineteen years after Frank's passing, Maud is the only person who can help the producers stay true to the spirit of the book - because she's the only one left who knows its secrets...


But the moment she hears Judy Garland rehearsing the first notes of Over the Rainbow', Maud recognizes the yearning that defined her own life story, from her rebellious youth as a suffragette's daughter to her coming of age as one of the first women in the Ivy League, from her blossoming romance with Frank to the hardscrabble prairie years that inspired his famous work. With the young actress under pressure from the studio as well as her ambitious stage mother, Maud resolves to protect her - the way she tried so hard to protect the real Dorothy.

This richly imagined novel tells the story behind *The Wonderful Wizard* of *Oz* through the eyes of L. Frank Baum's intrepid wife, Maud.

Mr Dan Jones, a historian, a journalist and a bestselling author, visited SWPS last Wednesday to give a lecture to our 6th Form students.

He spoke about his latest book, "Crusaders"; he outlined Crusades as events that shook the medieval world, and yet their echo still shapes the events of today; he explained his desire to write about history, showing it through the eyes of those who witnessed it, to make it more engaging and relatable; he talked about his writing process and gave some tips about studying History.

Both, students and staff greatly enjoyed his colourful anecdotes and appreciated his unusual way of talking about history.
