Construction for 2018 bond-funded projects continue to make strides in Northshore School District

Bothell, Wash. – Elementary #21's exterior continues to make progress. Ninety percent of the metal panels have been installed on the exterior of the building. An asphalt-treated base has been placed on the school's east parking lot and the turf athletic field installation is 95% complete.

Metal roofing on the Large On-Site Sewage System (LOSS) building was completed this month. Inside, equipment such as the control units and pumps are being installed.

The school's interior is also taking shape. Many of the rooms are painted and some of the cabinets have been installed. During October, certain sections of the building had partitions, plumbing fixtures and sinks installed in the bathrooms.

The planning principal, Cathi Davis and the Capital Projects team are in the process of selecting furniture for the school. The school is on schedule to open fall 2020.

The naming process for the school is ongoing. [The Elementary #21 Naming Committee](#) carefully reviewed the ideas and School Board policy and narrowed the selection down to 11 names. Now, families, students, staff and community members are invited to help [further narrow the choices](#) through Nov. 15.

During October, the Skyview and Canyon Creek expansion project also continued to progress. Carpeting, flooring, painting, and casework in the new multi-use building is nearly complete. The process of commissioning the building began in October, which tests each of the systems in the building to ensure they work properly. The lights, HVAC system and fire alarms were commissioned. Commissioning in this building is expected to be completed in November. Additionally, a punch list was compiled with items like paint touch ups, casework touch ups and other smaller details that the contractor is working through.

Interior work for the additions at Skyview and Canyon Creek is ongoing, including installation of sheetrock and painting. Landscaping at both campuses is also in process.

Over the last few months, the Northshore Concert Hall at Inglemoor continued through design development. In October, design development and the environmental review were completed.

As part of the environmental review, the project underwent the Washington Sustainable Schools Protocol. The project scored an 82, qualifying it as a Washington Sustainable School. Some of the parts of the project that contribute to this recognition include the materials for the interior and exterior pallets, the way steel, wood and glass is sourced for the project, the HVAC system and the use of environmental resources on the site.

The project is now moving into the construction document phase, which will outline exactly how the building will be constructed. This is when the project plans move to a high level of detail, including specifications for every wall that will be constructed, door hardware, and where light fixtures will be placed. Once construction documents are close to completion the team will begin the permitting process, which is expected to commence in January.

These projects were made possible by the generous support of Northshore voters who approved the 2018 bond.
