Flu vs. Colds: A Guide to Symptoms

Questions	Flu	Cold
Did the illness come on suddenly?	Yes	No
Does your child have a fever?	Yes	No (or mild)
Is your child's energy level very low?	Yes	No
Is your child's head achy?	Yes	No
Is your child's appetite less than normal?	Yes	No
Are your child's muscles achy?	Yes	No
Does your child have chills?	Yes	No

Children must be fever-free and/or vomit-free for 24 hours without medication to return to school. While ibuprofen or Tylenol may reduce a fever, it does not prevent children from spreading sickness.

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
