Funding Sources

89.4% Local

\$36 million

This funding comes from property taxes, tuition, and other local sources. This includes the \$10.6 million for the Building Fund, which is all local funding.

6.1% State

\$2.4 million

Most of this funding comes through the Oklahoma Department of Career & Technology Education, which allocates state funds to the local technology centers.

4.5% State

\$1.8 million

Almost two-thirds of federal funding passes through MNTC as financial aid payments to students. The remaining funds are provided in the form of grants for education and training programs provided for clients.
