IRISH COMEBACK FALLS SHORT AGAINST OLL

The Notre Dame Girls Varsity Basketball team fell 49-43 to Waterford Our Lady of the Lakes. The Lakers took a 26-12 lead into halftime before the Irish closed the gap to 35-32 after three quarters. Justin Gaynor led Notre Dame with 20 points, eight rebounds and two steals. Malorie Wilson added seven points and 15 rebounds while Kaitlyn Jansen had seven points and six rebounds.

NOTRE DAME GETS ROAD WIN AT MILFORD

The Notre Dame Boys Varsity Basketball team picked up a 85-75 win over Milford. Ethan Johnson led the Irish with 22 points, including six three-point baskets in the win. Jacob Bendtsen had 18 points and Jacob Anderson finished with 15 points for Notre Dame.

HOCKEY SHUTS OUT EAST LANSING

The Notre Dame Hockey team picked up a 7-0 shutout win over East Lansing. Vincent Anderson had four goals and two assists to lead the Irish while Jack Anderson added a goal and five assists. Antonio Popp had two goals and an assist, Brett Tice had two assists and Teddy Ecker stopped all 19 shots he faced to earn his second shutout of the season.

7/8 GIRLS MOVE TO 2-0 IN CYO LEAGUE PLAY

The 7/8 Girls Basketball team improved to 2-0 in CYO league play (4-2 overall) with a 32-29 win at Our Lady of the Lakes. Despite falling behind by five at the start of the game, Notre Dame rallied to take a 12-10 lead into halftime. The Lakers won the third quarter and took a 22-17 lead into the fourth. In the last six minutes, the Irish came to life on both ends of the floor, outscoring the Lakers 15 -7. Leading the way in the final stanza was Sophia Sermo, who scored eight points, two on crucial free throws in the final minute. Sermo finished with a team-high 16 points. Bree Blakeslee contributed a key basket and Grace Simon added a clutch free throw as Notre Dame took the lead back down the stretch. Mya Kattula scored eight points off the bench for the Irish.
