How To Make A DIY Mini Winter Snow Hat

Supplies: scissors, paper towel roll, or toilet paper roll, ruler, yarn, mini rubber band (optional), tissue paper

Instructions:

1. Cut paper towel roll or, toilet paper roll (one inch in width)
2. Cut about 37, twelve inch pieces of yarn
3. Next, cover the one inch paper towel or toilet paper roll with yarn (1 piece at a time)
 - a. Take a piece of yarn and fold it in half
 - b. Put it through the roll
 - c. Take the bottom and slide it through the loop and pull
4. Repeat step # 3 until you cover the whole roll
5. Gather the tips of the yarn together on top with a mini rubber band or strand of yarn and trim the excess to create a pom-pom.
6. Stuff the hat with tissue paper to keep its shape
7. Enjoy your mini winter snow hat!

Counting Thyme Book Review





The first step of making a snowman is to start by rolling a ball. Just remember the first ball is the largest ball for the snowman.


Next, you have to roll a medium size ball.

What To Do On Winter Break




There are lots of things to do during Winter Break, try to see what you want to do if you are bored.


Now here are some ideas from your fellow students.



Now let's build!


First, we will need to fold the post-it note so the corners are like a paper airplanes. Then, we will fold the corners up and then down, so it makes creases:

Note you are able to do this multicolor. I am doing blue and pink.




Finally, the hardest part, we have to slip one fold into another the put down the corners 7 times. It will look like this:

On September 13th, the amazing iPhone 11 was launched and released to the public. It's starting price is \$1,099 and I got a special look at it when I went to the Apple Store in Orland Square. Today, I will tell you what the iPhone 11 Pro Max is like, my first look, the software, and my personal impressions on this amazing phone.

First Looks:

When I got a look at it, I immediately realized that this phone has an incredibly sleek design, with a stainless steel and glass arrangement. It comes in all sorts of colors (space gray, silver, midnight green, and gold)!!! I also realized that there was a 3D retina scanner that uses your face as an ID and unlocks your phone with it! Well, you can say goodbye to the old home button, because in the latest Apple phones, there isn't any!!! When I unlocked the phone, I saw this awesome OLED (organic light-emitting diode) and Retina display screen that was beautiful in every single way!!! I recognized that this phone has 3 cameras. The ultra-wide, the wide, and the telephoto. These work together to shoot 4K UHD (Ultra High-Definition) video.

Chips, and the IOS:

Now, I will talk about the IOS 13 and the A13 bionic chip. I saw that IOS 13 has many cool apps and really awesome tricks. One example is that when you open the messages and go to the keyboard. When you look at the apps, you might see a Memoji. Remember Animoji? Well, in this awesome new phone, you can make an Animoji of yourself, which is basically a Memoji (shown above) This is technically not new. It has been in the iPhone XS, iPhone XS Max, and the iPhone XR, which were released last year. The cool thing about the A13 bionic is that it can perform 1 trillion operations per SECOND! This means that the A13 Bionic is extremely fast and it's the secret to fast processing of Retina display life like images, and Face ID.

My Personal Impressions on this phone:

So, in my opinion, I don't think much has changed since the past edition of iPhones, but this iPhone looks very promising. I think that the only things that have changed are that

1: The cameras have been really updated with 2 additional cameras

2: The display is much more functional.

3: It has a sleeker design compared to its predecessor

I don't really think that this iPhone is a big change if you already have iPhone X or later but you might want to test it out.

So, that's it for my FIRST tech review. I hope you enjoyed learning about this new iPhone and I can't wait to write another tech review for our early 2020 edition!!

A Winter Celebration!

Have you ever wondered how other people celebrate the winter months?

The History of celebrating Hanukkah, Kwanza, and Christmas

Today, we're going to learn about three holidays that people around the world celebrate, and you or one of your friends might celebrate one of them, too!

To begin, Jewish culture has a holiday like no other. Hanukkah is a holiday celebrating the rededication of a temple and the Jews rising up against the Greeks, and it lasts for eight days. A menorah is a nine-candled stand that Jews use to celebrate. Jewish families light one candle each night, using the center candle to light each of the others. According to the Talmud, one of Judaism's key texts, Judah Maccabee (a famous leader of the Jews) and some other Jews were taking part in the rededication of a temple, after the Greeks had desecrated it by sacrificing several pigs to Zeus inside its walls. Even though there was only enough olive oil to keep the lamps burning for a day, the flames still burned for another 8 days. This event led to the holiday we now know as Hanukkah.

Kwanza is an African-American holiday and did not originate in Africa, rather in 1966 by Dr. Maulana Karenga, who wanted to bring African-Americans together as a community. Kwanza revolves around seven main principles: Umoja (unity), Kujichagulia (self-determination), ujima (collective work and responsibility), ujamaa (cooperative economics), nia (purpose), kuumba (creativity), and Imani (faith). Kwanza also has seven symbols: Mazao (crops), Mkeka (place mat), Muhindi (corn), Mishumaa Saba and Kinara, the candles and candleholder that represent the seven principles, Kikombe Cha Umoja, the unity cup, and Zawadi, or gifts. Something you may not know about Kwanza is that since it is not a religious holiday, many people celebrate both Christmas *and* Kwanza. Kwanza is a holiday not of religion, but of family, community, and friendship.

Christmas is most likely the most famous holiday of the 3 we're talking about. You might know the story: Jesus was born in a stable full of animals, while wise men and shepherds gave him gifts and adored him forever and ever, etc. Now, we're just going to focus on *how* it became a holiday. At first, Easter was the main holiday for Christianity, and the birth of Jesus wasn't yet a holiday. Around the fourth century, church leaders decided to establish the birth of Jesus Christ as an official holiday. The question was, *when?* Pope Julius I chose December twenty fifth, mainly to adopt the traditions of a pagan festival. Christmas is commonly celebrated with an evergreen tree (real or fake) decorated with ribbon and ornaments. Since evergreen leaves never wither, the tree is used as a symbol of unending life with God.

As you can see, these are three of the many holidays people celebrate during December. I hope you walk away feeling refreshed and in the holiday spirit of giving and loving!


