SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

- Dr. Beresford thanked Associate Superintendent Mr. Roger McMichael for presenting the proposed 2020 Budgets, the Capital Projects Plan and the Bus Replacement Plan to the School Board.
- Dr. Beresford reminded the community that September is National Suicide Awareness and Prevention Month. He stated that Mental Health Coordinator, Stephanie Whiteside, has created a video that is available in the Parent Resource center which provides information on alarming statistics, warning signs and strategies for prevention. She will also be hosting a QPR Suicide Prevention Training for parents on September 24th. A Mental Health and Community Resource Fair will be held at Carmel High School on September 12th. This free event is open to all CCS families in the district.
- Dr. Beresford shared information about the Summer Lunch Program that was held in partnership with the Carmel Youth Assistance Program. He stated that 230 students participated in the program, 28,490 meals were distributed throughout the summer, 4,900 pounds of food were donated through the Pack the Cruiser Event at Kroger in June and more than 19 different organizations came together to make this program a success for our students and families.
- Dr. Beresford shared with the Board that this week is Custodial and Maintenance Appreciation Week! He encouraged students, staff and community members to extend their appreciation to these important staff members.
- Dr. Beresford congratulated College Wood Elementary Teacher Jacy Schneider for being named a finalist for the 2019 Elementary Academic Coach of the Year by the Indiana Association of School Principals. Jacy coaches the M.A.T.H. Bowl Team, Science Bowl Team and Spell Bowl Team at College Wood Elementary. Last year, Jacy led the team to a state championship for both the M.A.T.H. Bowl and Science Bowl, and she led the Spell Bowl team to a Top 3 finish in the state.
- Dr. Beresford Congratulated CHS Champions Together for being named to ESPN's Special Olympics Unified Sports National Honor Roll! Only 34 teams across the nation were recognized with this honor. Dr. Beresford shared that he looks forward to hearing our athletes speak about the program at the next Board Meeting.
- Dr. Beresford shared with the Board that the CHS Cheer Team had a creative gender reveal surprise for their cheer coach. Mrs. Molly Reuille, a teacher at Prairie Trace Elementary, and her husband Wes, are expecting their first child next year. The CHS Cheer Team created an energetic cheer routine, announcing that the couple were expecting a baby girl! Dr. Beresford encouraged the community to view the video of the surprise announcement on the district's Facebook page.

- Dr. Beresford shared with the Board that he attended the first home football game of the season and watched the Greyounds win against the Noblesville Millers 37-0. He also congratulated the football team on reclaiming the Copper Kettle with a 20-14 victory over Center Grove last Friday night.
- Dr. Beresford reported that he has held three informational sessions with school staff members on the School Safety Referendum. He will be presenting to staff members at all schools. He also shared that the Carmel Clay Schools website now has information regarding dates, times and locations for the School Safety Referendum community meetings. Swimming World annually compiles the top times from all 50 high school state championship events to determine the rankings. He congratulated the Greyhounds on an outstanding accomplishment!
