The Carmel Clay School Board unanimously approved to hire Dr. Tom Oestreich as the new Assistant Superintendent of Staff and Student Services.

Dr. Oestreich will be responsible for overseeing the recruitment, retention and talent development of all CCS employees. His role will include working with benefits, compensation and the general care and support of CCS staff. In addition, he will serve the student services department which includes school safety, mental health and all areas related to supporting student needs. He will assume the role on January 6, 2020. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

- Dr. Beresford gave thanks to all of our veterans for their service and wished them a Happy Veteran's Day. Dr. Beresford also shared that he had the opportunity to attend the City of Carmel Veteran's Day Program. Dr. Beresford gave kudos to CHS teacher and veteran, Pete O'Hara, for his inspiring speech, as well as to our Orchard Park Elementary student choir who sang patriotic songs. Dr. Beresford also thanked the City of Carmel for inviting him to participate alongside Mayor Brainard in the ceremony and was very proud of the elementary poster contest winners and essay contest winners.
- Dr. Beresford congratulated the Mohawk Trails staff who were recognized at the Indiana Statehouse last week for earning the prestigious title as a National Blue Ribbon School. Principal Jennifer Greene and Assistant Principal Sara Agee will attend the National Ceremony in Washington D.C., later this month.
- Dr. Beresford shared with the Board that he has challenged staff members to participate in the No Shave, No Stigma November Challenge to bring attention to men's mental health. The challenge is to grow a mustache throughout "Movember" and be a MO-Bro or join the Beresford Band of Bearded Bros. and go for the whole beard.
- Dr. Beresford shared with the Board that Carmel High School Student and Lucas Formula Racing Series driver, Jack Dorsey, donated a racing system he designed and built himself to Riley Hospital for Children. It's a video game that lets kids put their skills to the test on the track. It was made possible through Dorsey's charity, The Anchor Foundation. 10% of the money donated to his racing team goes to to help children's hospitals and the Make-A-Wish Foundation. Jack donated the racing system in honor of his mother who passed away from cancer.
- Dr. Beresford reported that he will be attending the Teacher of the Year Banquet to support Prairie Trace Elementary Kindergarten Teacher, Amanda Dillon, who was named Carmel Clay Schools' Teacher of the Year. He shared that she placed in the Top 10 of the Indiana State Teacher of the Year competition. Dr. Beresford said it will be a great opportunity to celebrate an outstanding educator!
- Dr. Beresford congratulated the Creekside Middle School Wildcats on winning the Hamilton County Spell Bowl! Clay Middle School and Carmel Middle School tied for 3rd place.
- Dr. Beresford attended the Girls and Boys Cross Country State Championships. He reported that both teams ran a fantastic race! The girls team placed 3rd and the boys team was state runner-up.

SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

- Dr. Beresford congratulated the Greyhound Cheer Team who placed 3rd at the state finals! The team will compete at nationals at the end of the month.
- Dr. Beresford attended the IHSAA Girls Soccer State Finals and watched the Greyhounds in action! He was proud of the grit and determination the girls displayed during the tough game. He congratulated them on a great season and for being state runner-up. He congratulated Senior Olivia Fray for earning the IHSAA Mental Attitude Award.
- Dr. Beresford attended the ISSA Marching Band Finals to watch the Marching Greyhounds! He loved watching their performance and was impressed with the band's talent on the field and sportsmanship off the field. It was a close competition with the Greyhounds placing second in the state. The Greyhounds will compete at the Bands of America competition this weekend.
- Dr. Beresford congratulated the CHS football team who defeated Westfield to become Sectional Champions! They will play at Homestead on Friday night.
- Dr. Beresford's "Bellringer" of the evening was the passage of the district's School Safety Referendum. Dr. Beresford reported that 68.55% of the community voted in favor of the School Safety Referendum. He thanked the Carmel community, including the Carmel SOS parent group, for informing taxpayers about how the school safety investments would benefit student and staff. The district will now be able to fund a full-time, highly trained School Resource Officer in every school building, additional mental health programming and supports in every school, and enhanced school safety training and professional development for students and staff. The district has already begun working alongside the Carmel Police Department on a plan to hire additional School Resource Officers. In addition, the district will be sending out a request for proposal for local mental health providers to secure a contract that will provide at least one mental health therapist in every school.
