ART CLUB

This club allows all 6th, 7th and 8th graders an opportunity to work together to create Art for the school community. Due to the nature of this club, space is limited to 30 students.

BAND

• <u>6th Grade Band</u>

This group is open to all current 6th Grade JAMS Band students. The 6th grade band was designed to help introduce students to the middle school band setting. It offers students the opportunity to come together as a large ensemble with students at their music level. This band also serves as a feeder to the 7th and 8th grade band. Many goals are set for this ensemble. Musically speaking, students are introduced to concepts of blend and balance. Socially, these students have the experience of belonging to a group, where they are motivated to do their personal best, and are expected to be outstanding "team members".

• <u>7th & 8th Grade Band</u>

This group is open to all current 7th & 8th Grade JAMS Band students. The 7th & 8th grade band plays literature of a higher caliber. These students are expected to work together to prepare music for upcoming festivals. This band focuses on preparing 8th graders for their high school experience. These students continue to work towards becoming a better band through exploring a higher level of musicianship. Through these before school sessions, the students have the experience of belonging to a group, where they are motivated to do their personal best, and are expected to be outstanding "team members".

• Jazz Band

Jazz Band is a select group. Current band students may audition for this 20 piece group. We work on understanding the music we call Jazz through performing and active listening. Students perform concerts throughout the Spring. Several students in this group are given the opportunity to be soloists in this venue. BOOK LOVERS CLUB

Book Lovers Club is a place where those who love to read can gather together in a stress free environment. BRAIN GAMES CLUB

Students will spend the first half of the club using problem-solving skills to creativity and collectively find a solution to a posed problem or puzzle. The second half of club time will be used for students to bring in their own school appropriate "brain games" to challenge other students. Students will participate in writing stories of their choice and competing in various writing contests! <u>CHOIR</u>

Students who belong to choir classes may also participate in Central Jersey, New Jersey, All-Eastern and National Honor Choirs upon the choir teacher's recommendation. The choir goes on a yearly trip to the NJMEA Middle School/Junior High Choral Festival in Rutgers or Rowan University and a show in New York City.

• 7th & 8th Grade Orchestra

Is open to all 7th & 8th grade orchestra students. Similar to the 6th Grade Orchestra, rehearsals for this group are scheduled bi-weekly, as well as for special dress dates prior to concerts. This ensemble performs more repertoire and repertoire that is intermediate to advanced levels. We perform at the Winter and Spring Concerts, the North Edison District Orchestra Festival, the CJMEA Festival and the annual orchestra field trip.

• The Chamber Orchestra

Is a balanced, auditioned ensemble that performs advanced level repertoire. This ensemble is open for audition by those students who are in an orchestra class and who perform with either the 6th or 7th & 8th Grade Orchestras. Auditions are blind and take place early in the school year. This ensemble rehearses weekly and has a goal of performing without a conductor. The Chamber Orchestra performs at all of the concerts listed above, as well as invitational and school / community service performances.

ROCK DRUMMER'S CLUB

This club is designed for intermediate drummers. Although beginners are welcome to attend, it is designed to enhanced the abilities and skills of a drum student that has already mastered the basics. We listen to established Rock bands and learn the drum patterns. As well, drum students can bring in music of their own to learn those patterns. SCIENCE CLUB

Science Club will provide students a highly engaging environment to improve and enhance their understanding of Science. STUDENT AMBASSADORS

The 8th Grade Ambassadors is a student group at JAMS comprised of select 8th graders who have demonstrated academic excellence, exemplary leadership skills and/or school spirit throughout their middle school years. They assist with the 6th Grade Orientation, Back to School Night, Parent-Teacher Conferences, providing new student tours throughout the school year and are generally helpful students to call upon to provide assistance to the school community, when needed. The Ambassadors embody JAMS' motto by demonstrating respect, responsibility and excellence all day, every day.

STUDENT COUNCIL

Student Council, led by Mr. Spernal (6th grade), Mrs. Orzechowski (7th grade), and Ms. Hickman (8th grade), is to be a student-led outlet and voice in our school community. Representatives are elected by their peers to represent their homerooms. Students should exhibit positive character traits and be willing to aid students and staff in various areas of our school community. Student Council representatives are divided into committees and attend both committee and full council meetings.

YEARBOOK

The yearbook committee will be open to all students who have an interest in the design process of the yearbook.
