



If you did not pick up a book, they are available in the Gathering Space. Please join us for a discussion on the book which


will take place on Thursday, January 23 at 7:00pm in the Gathering Space.







FOLEY HOLDS LAS POSADA (The Journey to the Inn)

On December 15<sup>th</sup>, the Third Sunday of Advent, a group of about 40 pilgrims braved the cold weather and participated in Las Posada, an event co-sponsored by the Foley Knights and the Spanish Prayer Group. This traditional Mexican procession is a beautiful way for families to realize some of the hardship the Holy Family experienced when St. Joseph took our Blessed Mother to Bethlehem to register for the census that was required by law. It so happens, that Mary was ready to give birth to Our Savior and with the business of Bethlehem, Joseph was unable to find a room.

The service started in the gathering room of the church with prayer and reflection before processing in song to the Marian Altar. There the group again listened to scripture and reflection and recited a decade of the Rosary. The final and recited a decade of the Rosary. The final station was the St. Joseph Altar where the group again processed in song before reciting their prayers. Finally, the group processed to the Elementary Cafeteria. The "journey to the inn" was lit by luminaries as the candlelight procession was led by statues of Joseph and Mary. As the group arrived at the door of the school there was group arrived at the door of the school, there was an exchange of the "innkeepers" inside the building with "Joseph and Mary" outside in the cold.

When a place was found for them to lie their heads the door opened, and the statues were put in their respective spots in the Nativity with the pilgrims' candles surrounding the Holy Family. Refreshments were provided by Tim Horton's and the Religious Education Department. The families were invited to get warm and create an ornament craft. Later, **Cathy Frys** read the children a story *The Legend of the Poinsettia*. Families finished the evening with the children opening three pinatas in the gymnasium and lots of smiling faces with sweet treats.

Foley Family Director Dave Rich and his wife Dianne coordinated the event with DC Formation Director Dawn Dwyer, who received some inspiration from Maria Therese **Garcia** of the Divine Child Spanish Prayer Group. Thanks to **Matt Simpson** for lending his musical talent to the event, as well as the Foley Knights and their wives who attended and helped set up and break-down.

Although this is a Mexican tradition, it is a beautiful service and family event open to everyone of the parish. We hope to have more participants next year!



Do you long for a deeper relationship with God? Start your year off right exploring how to grow deeper in your relationship with God drawing from the wisdom of the saints. Mystic and Doctor of the Church, St. Teresa of Avila, in her famous book, *The Interior Castle*, tells us that such a relationship with God will only develop through prayer which she describes as "nothing else than an intimate sharing between friends. It means taking time frequently to be with Him whom we know loves us." Join us for Theology on Tap while Dr. Patricia Cooney Hathaway explores with us St. Teresa's teaching on prayer as moving through the stages of acquaintance, to friendship, and finally, transforming union with God as friend, companion and beloved. It is, as Jesus said to Mary of Bethany, "the one thing necessary."

Dr. Cooney is a Professor of Spirituality and Systematic Theology at Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit. She holds a Doctorate from Catholic University of America, and is a national speaker in areas of Theology, Spirituality, Human and Spiritual Development. She is the author of Weaving Faith and Experience: A Women's Perspective. She's married to her husband, Thomas Hathaway, with two children, Thomas and Victoria.

#### A Catholic, without prayer?

It is the same as a soldier without arms." So says St. Josemaría Escrivá. But prayer can be hard. Time is short and demands are many; where can we find the time to pray? St. Josemaría has an idea: "Why don't you try converting your whole life into the service of God — your work and your rest, your tears and your smiles?" Escrivá asks, then urges, "You can ... and you must!"

#### Sanctifying Work

Anything can become a prayer, according to St. Josemaría. "Look for holiness in the middle of the world," he says. That laundry, those dishes, that teetering tower of paperwork on your desk — these do not have to be obstacles to sanctification. Done with care and competence, daily tasks become the means of sanctification.

This doesn't mean we should disregard prayer in a more traditional sense. But prayer isn't something that happens outside of daily life. It is the thread that ties all we do together, into one life of service to God. Prayer doesn't stop when work begins.

Our work — fulfilling our daily responsibilities — becomes an expression of our faith. "You should maintain throughout the day a constant conversation with Our Lord, a conversation fed even by the things that happen in your professional work," Escrivá writes.

It is a mistake, he cautions, to reduce the Christian life to "a few pious practices."

"You and I are Christians, but at the same time ... we are citizens and workers with clear obligations, which we have to fulfill in an exemplary manner if we really want to become saints," he writes.


