





WELCOME TO ECFE!

Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE) is a program for all Minnesota families with children between the ages of birth to third grade. ECFE is based on the idea that the family provides a child's first and most significant learning environment and parents are a child's first and most important teachers. The goal of ECFE is to enhance the ability of all parents to provide the best possible environment for their child's learning and growth.

HOW ARE CLASSES AND ACTIVITIES OFFERED?

ECFE classes are Parent & Child classes which include three components. Parent and child interaction time focuses on activities and learning together. Children's programming is taught by a licensed early childhood educator and focuses on age appropriate activities for your child. Parent discussion time is led by a licensed parent educator and centers on a specific topic related to your child and their developmental stage. Interaction with other parents in an informal group discussion takes place in the parent education room for separating classes and in another area of the same room for non-separating classes.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF ECFE?

The program encourages positive parental interactions that affect how children develop and learn. Research has shown that ECFE programs involving parents with their children are more effective than programs focusing exclusively on children. ECFE also offers a toy lending library and resources on parenting and child development.

MN Statute 124D.13 states that ECFE Programs should emphasize programming for a child from birth to age three. Programming and services that are tailored to the needs of families and parents with children with the most risk factors in that age group. Due to a pre-k-3rd grade initiative ECFE can offer classes for children up to 3rd grade, but please note that the focus of the programming is for the birth to three age group. Also, as residents & taxpayers, Minnesota residents receive priority in enrollment; out of district or Wisconsin residents may enroll on a space available basis AFTER the initial enrollment process is complete.



ECFE REGISTRATION & CLASS REQUEST INFORMATION

- All families must complete the online registration for ECFE once per year. If you wish to continue in your current class or change classes at the end of the quarter you can do so by contacting the Early Childhood Secretary at (507) 494-0913.
- Deadline for Quarter 3 class determination is January 21st. Any registration received after this date will not be considered in the lottery for the classes that have already filled.
- All registrations received by the deadline will be placed in a random drawing if class sizes have reached capacity. This drawing gives all families an equal opportunity to participate in ECFE classes. Every effort will be made to honor your class request.
- Quarter 4 class requests and registrations will be due by April 1st to be considered in a lottery for the classes that have filled.
- Class requests for existing families must be made by contacting Jen in the Early Childhood Office at (507) 494-0913 or email jennifer.slinkman@winona.k12.mn.us.
- New families must complete the online ECFE registration by the above deadlines to request classes.
- Because classes can fill quickly, please list a 2nd choice so that we can ensure you have a spot in ECFE.
- Confirmation emails will be sent the week following the registration deadline.
- You must pay for your class by the SECOND WEEK of class to secure your spot.
- NO refunds will be made after the SECOND WEEK of class.

DO MY CHILDREN NEED THEIR SHOTS?

Yes, Minnesota law requires that children attending our classes be immunized. If a child's parent or guardian wishes to be exempt based on their beliefs, from one or more immunization requirements, the parent or child may submit a statement to this effect, signed by the submitting person and notarized. Immunizations can be uploaded upon registration or a copy can be

dropped off in the office.
