What is dyslexia?

Dyslexia isn't about reversals

Dyslexia isn't about faulty eye movements

What is the Phenotype of Dyslexia?

- » Inability to sound out words
 - » plin
 - » taymouj
 - » fristanip
 - » cycleraptinatorage

What is the Phenotype of Dyslexia?

- » Inability to sound out words
- » Unexpected comprehension difficulties
- » Long term vocabulary challenges
- » Unexpected poor reading that is due to a problem in <u>language</u>, not in vision

- » Early identification and intervention is the key
- » Strategies learned benefit all students
- » Later intervention does not produce the same benefits

How might this phonological impairment impact a student?

- » Phonological awareness

- » Phonological recoding for lexical access (rapid naming)

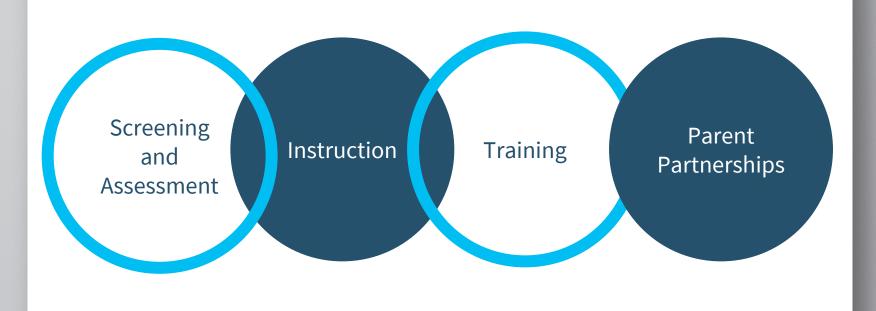

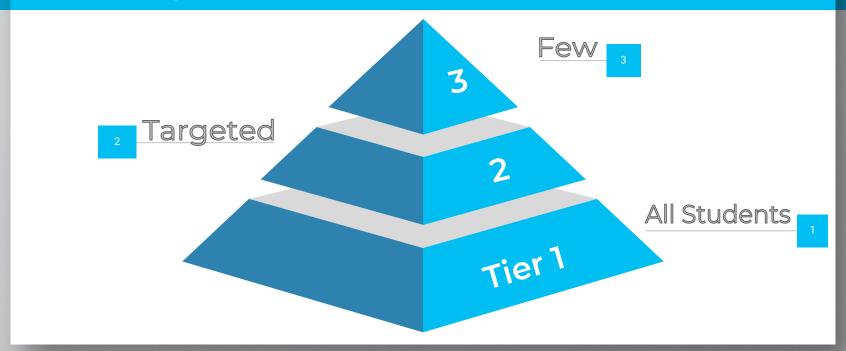
