What is Title I?

Title I is the largest

AVC

federal aid program for elementary, middle, and high schools. Funds are provided through Title I to districts around the country based on the number of low –income families in each district. School districts use Title I money for extra educational services to assist children in need of educational help. The focus of the Title I program is on helping all students meet the same high standards expected of all children.

National School Breakfast and Lunch Program

Forest Hills Global qualifies for the "Community Eligibility Provision" which allow schools that predominately serve low income children to offer nutritious meals at no cost to all students through the National School Lunch and Breakfast Programs. Therefore, students at Forest Hills Global do not have to complete a free/reduced meals application and all students receive free breakfast and free lunch every day.

How may Title I funds be used?

The Title I program offers a variety of services which may include:

- Additional teachers and support staff
- Extra time for instruction
- A variety of teaching methods and materials
- Smaller classes
- Additional training for staff
- Parent workshops to support learning at home

Schools qualify for funds based on economic need.
