# A MESSAGE

from the Superintendent

As we bring the year to close and the school year nears its semester break, we take stock of our schools' accomplishments. Eden Prairie Schools' educational quality continues to be among the best in Minnesota. Our class sizes in kindergarten and grade one are among the lowest. Eden Prairie Schools' academic achievement at all levels puts us consistently in the top three or four school districts in the west metro. Thirdgrade reading – a key benchmark in student learning – is strong, with nearly 82 percent of students at a proficient level on district assessments. The average ACT score of the graduating class of 2019 significantly exceeded the state average and places Eden Prairie in the top tier of achievement among all Minnesota public school districts.

Our academic achievement is the result of incredible community support. Our voters approved a referendum in

May by the largest margin of support for any Eden Prairie Schools referenda in 25 years. Funding from the referendum will help us achieve key parts of our academic vision, known as Designing Pathways. I am pleased to let you know that we have prepared budget information and the tax impact of the referendum on the average home will be nearly 60 percent less than we estimated in May. This translates to \$2.67 per month on a \$400,000 home compared to the estimate of \$6.50 per month.

The value of our school system continues to be unparalleled, given our students' exceptional academic outcomes. We're grateful for your support as we continue to inspire each student every day.

# REFERENDUM UPDATE

#### **Central Middle School**

Planning for construction at Central Middle School began the day after voters approved the May referendum. Projects are on track to receive bids from contractors next year, with ground-breaking in the spring. Central Middle School will be expanded to unite 6<sup>th</sup> grade students with their middle school peers. This will happen in the fall of 2021. A classroom wing, a gym and theater will be added to the school along with an expanded cafeteria. With our personalized learning approach, students learn in large groups, small groups, one-to-one conferences and independently. Classroom updates will be made and new furniture provided to about half of the school's classrooms to match these various styles.

#### **Classroom updates**


A portion of elementary and high school classrooms were updated over the summer. More classrooms will be updated over winter break and yet more next summer.

#### Security

This summer, additional security cameras were added to Eden Prairie Schools buildings across the district. Additional updates will continue for the next two years including improved communication systems and protective glass. Central Middle School will be expanded to unite 6<sup>th</sup> grade students with their middle school peers. This will happen in the fall of 2021.

# STUDY OF SCHOOL START AND END TIMES BEGINNING

As we look ahead to 2021, 6<sup>th</sup> grade students will be united with their middle level peers at Central Middle School. The district's preschool option also will be expanded by moving classrooms to each elementary school.

Because these decisions require redesign of our transportation program for the fall of 2021, the time is right to look at school start and end times. A process to study school start and end times will begin with



a public meeting on Feb. 6 at Eden Prairie City Center. Following this, a task force will be created to review public input, meet with district staff to study the issue deeply and to consider options. One or more recommendations may emerge from the task force, and those would be presented to the public for feedback in the fall of 2020. Then, the district will decide if there is a decision to be made for the fall of 2021. Follow the process at edenpr.org/starttimes.
