GOAL:

Increase the levels of college and career readiness among students which will support their successful transition from secondary education to post-secondary education and, ultimately, to career.

Focus on alignment with regional workforce priorities and a collaborative approach between systems.

| Advancing Career Counseling | Career Counseling Coordinator at each OC LEA to manage district program activities for K12 SWP, including alignment of counseling efforts with CCs, early college credit attainment, industry certifications, and work-based learning. |
| Building CTE Dual Enrollment | Section reimbursement for first 2 years of CTE dual enrollment offerings to grow pathway sequences between High Schools and Community Colleges. |
| Enhancing Career Education Pedagogies | Career-based learning opportunities for K-12 teachers in key research-based strategies that support student competencies, including Human Centered Design Thinking, UDL, and PBL. Materials and equipment for K-8 maker and career labs. |
| Heightening Work-Based Learning | Work with industry/business partners to create and connect secondary students to specific technical and employability skills identified by industry/company. |
