#### Presentation on California Schools Dashboard and Indicators

Amy Kernan, Director of Assessment and Accountability, presented information to the Board, staff, and public to explain the California Dashboard and Local Indicators. The Dashboard provides a quick overview, with additional detail available, about overall performance and student group performance on multiple measures of student success. This will assist in identifying strengths, weaknesses and areas in need of improvement for local educational agencies and schools.

#### Presentation on Chronic Absenteeism

Dr. Odipo, Assistant Superintendent, Instructional Services presented information to the Board, staff and public on chronic absenteeism and the impacts missing school has on learning. The presentation included a review of data, an overview of the district's implementation plan, and site responsibilities.

#### **Proposal**

Staff proposes the Board of Education approve the attached Investment Report as per Board Policy No. 3002 – Investments.

#### **Background**

Senate Bill 564 added Government Code section 53646 requiring the chief fiscal officer of each local agency in California to annually render a statement of investment policy and to render quarterly reports to the governing board with respect to the agency's investments. A District Investment Policy was adopted at the October 22, 2002 regular Board meeting.

In addition to reviewing the wording in the bill, there has been an advisory issued from School Legal Services regarding implementation of the requirements in SB564.

Government Code Section 53646 (e) states: "If a local agency has placed all of its investments in...a county investment pool...the chief fiscal officer may supply to the governing body...the most recent statement or statements received by the local agency from these institutions...".

A memo from School Legal Services to districts says, "In most cases, districts in Orange County would be able to rely on the provisions of Section 53646 (e) and provide the most recent statements received by the local agency from the county treasurer. Only in cases where districts have invested surplus funds outside the county treasury, LAIF, or a bank or savings and loan will districts be required to prepare an individualized written report."

On July 3, 1995, the Office of the Treasury-Tax Collector established a separate bank and custody account entitled the Orange County Educational Investment Pool for public education funds. Available at the District Office for review is the June 2017 Treasurer's Management Report from the Orange County Treasurer's Office and the June 2017, bank statements for District funds held outside the County Treasury.

Government Section 53646 (b)(2) states: "the quarterly report shall state compliance of the portfolio to the statement of investment policy." Under section 3430(b), the investment policy specified that the District shall deposit in the Orange County Treasury, pursuant to Education Code section 41001, to be placed to the credit of the proper fund, all General funds, Adult Education funds, Cafeteria funds, Deferred Maintenance funds, General Obligation Bond funds, Capital Facilities funds, Developer Fees, School Facilities funds, Special Reserve funds, and Foundation Trust funds.

The District and the Orange County Treasury shall make investments of all such funds within the requirements of the "Prudent Investor Rule" in California Probate Code section 16045 et seq.

#### **Budget Impact**

District monies are deposited in compliance with Board Policy 3002 – Investments.

#### **Recommended Action**

Staff recommends the Board of Education approve the report on District investments and certify that the method of investments is in compliance with the District investment policy.

This form certifies current instructional materials adopted for mathematics and reading/language arts are State content standards aligned and may be approved in conjunction with the annual public hearing and resolution required under Education Code Section 60119.

The District appropriates and spends the funds designated for K-12 State adopted Instructional Materials. There is no additional budget impact for approval of this Resolution and Certification.

# RESOLUTION NO. 17-18 OF THE LAGUNA BEACH UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT GOVERNING BOARD DETERMINING STEPS TO ENSURE

#### AVAILABILITY OF TEXTBOOKS AND INSTRUCTIONAL MATERIALS FOR 2017-18

WHEREAS, Education Code Section 60119 establishes steps and procedures to ensure the availability of textbooks and instructional materials in order to be eligible to receive funds for that purpose, and;

WHEREAS, the procedures require that school districts take appropriate action to ensure the availability of textbooks and instructional materials on a yearly basis, and;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Education Code Sections 60119, the Board is required to hold a public hearing to encourage participation by parents, teachers, members of the community interested in the affairs of the school district, and bargaining unit leaders, and;

WHEREAS, the Board is required to provide 10 days' notice of the public hearing or hearings, and;

WHEREAS, the notice shall contain the time, place, and purpose of the hearing and be posted in three public places within the school district, and;

WHEREAS, the hearing shall be held at a time that will encourage the attendance of teachers and parents and guardians of pupils who attend the schools in the district and shall not take place during or immediately following school hours, and;

WHEREAS, the governing Board of a school district, as part of the required hearing, shall also make a written determination as to whether each pupil enrolled in a foreign language or health course has sufficient textbooks or instructional materials that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum frameworks adopted by the state board for those subjects, and;

WHEREAS, the governing Board shall also determine the availability of laboratory science equipment as applicable to science laboratory courses offered in grades 9 to 12, inclusive, and;

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on September 12, 2017, at a regular meeting of the Board of Education, which began at 6 o'clock p.m., which is on or before the eighth week of school and;

WHEREAS, the Board is required to make a determination, through a resolution, as to whether each pupil in each school in the district has, sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 and Education Code 33126 in each of the following subjects, as appropriate, that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the State Board:

- (i) Mathematics,
- (ii) Science,
- (iii) History-social science,
- (iv) English/language arts, including the English language development component of ar adopted program,
  - (v) Visual and performing arts. (Not listed in 60605 or 33126)

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the governing Board makes the determination that each pupil of the district, has available sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 and Education Code Section 33126 in each subject listed above, consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum framework adopted by the State Board and adopted by this Board in accordance with the procedures as established.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that for the 2017-18 school year, the Laguna Beach Unified School District, has provided each pupil with sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are aligned to the content standards adopted pursuant to Education Code Section 60605 and Education Code Section 33126 in each subject listed above, consistent with the content and consistent with the cycles and content of the curriculum framework adopted by the State Board for those subjects.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that for the 2017-18 school year, the School District has provided sufficient textbooks or instructional materials, or both, that are consistent with the content and cycles of the curriculum frameworks adopted by the state board, to each pupil enrolled in a foreign language or health course, and that sufficient laboratory science equipment applicable to science laboratory courses offered in grades 9 to 12, inclusive, is available to pupils.

Approval: Memorandum of Understanding between Capistrano Unified School District and Laguna Beach Unified School District for Special Education Services

#### **Proposal**

Staff recommends the Board of Education approve the memorandum of understanding between Capistrano Unified School District and Laguna Beach Unified School District for Special Education Services.

#### **Background**

The Laguna Beach Unified School District Special Education Department has been consistently working with SELPA staff and Saddleback Valley Unified School District on behalf of students ages 18 to 21 requiring Adult Transition Services. These students are on a Certificate of Educational Completion track and often attend Laguna Beach High School through their senior year. Over the last 2 years, the Special Education Director has been working with Saddleback Valley staff in an effort to enhance their Adult Transition Program by creating additional options for students who are able to attend community college with support for one or two classes. Despite improvement in the program, the SVUSD options are still limited. The Capistrano Unified School District Transition Program provides such options therefore District staff reached out to CUSD to determine their willingness to collaborate. CUSD agreed to partner with LBUSD and permit District students to attend their program should the IEP team believe that CUSD is the most appropriate program. This additional option allows the District to offer defensible Adult Transition services to all of our students. The costs associated with a CUSD placement is the same as the cost for placing a student at SVUSD.

#### **Budget Impact**

Program cost per month, per student, is \$1740.00. Additional costs will be accrued should student require specialized services including but not limited to Speech & Language, Audiological services or Orientation & Mobility services.

#### **Recommended Action**

Staff recommends the Board of Education approve the Memorandum of Understanding between Capistrano Unified School District and Laguna Beach Unified School District for Special Education Services.

### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN CAPISTRANO UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT AND LAGUNA BEACH UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES

This Agreement is made by and between the Capistrano Unified School District (CUSD also referred to herein as the Provider District) and the Laguna Beach Unified School District (LBUSD also referred to herein as the Sending District). CUSD and LBUSD are also referred to individually as Party, and collectively as Parties. This Agreement is based upon the following factual recitals:

#### **RECITALS**

WHEREAS, Education Code §§ 56195.1 and 56195.5 authorize school districts and special education local plan areas (SELPAs) to enter into agreements to provide for the education of special education students who may reside in other districts or counties;

WHEREAS, Education Code § 56041 provides that, except for those students meeting residency requirements for school attendance specified in Education Code section 48204(a), the district of residence responsible for providing special education and related services to students between the ages of 18-22 years, inclusive, shall be the last district of residence in effect prior to the student attaining the age of majority for non-conserved pupils, as long as and until the parent or parents relocate to a new district of residence, at which time the new district of residence shall become the responsible local educational agency;

WHEREAS, Education Code section 56028 defines a "parent" as a guardian generally authorized to act as the child's parent or authorized to make educational decisions for the child, including a court appointed responsible adult and further provides that the court appointed responsible adult shall be determined to be the "parent" for purposes of determining residency under Education Code section 48200 et. seq.;

WHEREAS, Student is an 18 year old non-conserved adult student (Student) eligible for special education and related services under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA);

WHEREAS, Student's parent resides within the boundaries of LBUSD which the Parties believe to be Student's district of residence;

WHEREAS, Student currently resides in parent's home and Student desires to attend school within the boundaries of CUSD;

WHEREAS, the Parties wish to enter into this Agreement regarding the provision of special education and related services for Student.

NOW, THEREFORE, CUSD and LBUSD agree as follows:

#### 1. Recitals

The recitals stated above are incorporated into this Agreement.

#### 2. Term of Agreement

This Agreement is effective for the period beginning June 26, 2017 through June 30, 2018.

#### 3. Educational Placement and Services

The Parties agree that Student will be enrolled in an adult transition program within CUSD. CUSD agrees to implement Student's Individualized Education Program (IEP) developed by LBUSD, including all related services, and provide Student with a free appropriate public education during the time that Student is enrolled in a CUSD educational program.

In the event CUSD determines it is no longer able to implement Student's IEP or to continue to provide Student's special education and related services, CUSD shall immediately notify LBUSD of its intent to terminate this MOU, by sending a letter to LBUSD's Director of Special Education and SELPA Operations and this MOU will be considered terminated 60 days following such notification. In the event LBUSD wishes to terminate this MOU, written notice must be provided to CUSD's Associate Superintendent, Student Support Services and 60 days following such notification this MOU will be considered terminated.

In the event Student moves out of LBUSD's boundaries, LBUSD shall immediately notify CUSD of Student's change in residence.

#### 4. Annual and Triennial IEP Meetings

CUSD shall notify LBUSD of Student's IEP meetings (Student/school request, annual, and triennial review IEP team meetings) by e-mail to LBUSD's Director of Special Education with at least two weeks' advance notice, and LBUSD will provide a representative to participate in the development of the IEP (telephonically or in person). For any change in services specified on the current IEP, a LBUSD representative who is authorized to approve or disapprove the allocation of specified LBUSD resources necessary for the implementation of the IEP shall be involved in the development of the IEP. LBUSD will complete assessments/evaluations required for Student's triennial assessment/IEP. CUSD will participate and collaborate in the assessment process. If Student requests assessment outside this triennial assessment, CUSD will inform LBUSD within two days of the request by notifying LBUSD's Director of Special Education via e-mail.

#### 5. Due Process Proceedings

If Student or her court appointed responsible adult contests the termination of services by initiating a due process proceeding with the Office of Administrative Hearing (OAH), CUSD will abide by the "stay-put" requirement of state and federal law unless the Student or his court appointed responsible adult agree otherwise or an interim alternative educational placement is deemed lawful and appropriate by LBUSD or OAH.

Upon request by LBUSD, CUSD will fully participate in special education due process proceedings including mediations and hearings, as requested by LBUSD. Full participation shall include, but in no way limited to, cooperating with LBUSD representatives to provide all documentation that pertains to CUSD's adult transition program and/or the implementation of Student's IEP.

#### 6. Payment for Educational Placement and Services

LBUSD agrees to fund Student's educational placement and services within CUSD. LBUSD agrees to pay CUSD as follows:

- a. <u>Placement and Services</u>: LBUSD will fund Student's placement in CUSD's Adult Transition Program in accordance with the funding formula included in Exhibit A.
- b. <u>Payment and Final Accounting</u>: A final accounting to determine the cost of attendance and billing costs to LBUSD will be made no later than September 15, 2018 for the 2017-2018 school year.
- c. <u>Attendance</u>: For the purpose of this MOU, Student will be considered enrolled for the entirety of the 2017-2018 school year. For each month Student is enrolled, payment will be due for all services. To withdraw Student from attendance, this Agreement must be terminated (per Section 3) or Student/District may provide written notice to CUSD by the 25<sup>th</sup> of the month that Student will not be attending the following month.

#### 7. No Waiver

The failure of CUSD in any one or more instances to insist upon strict performance of any of the terms of this Agreement or to exercise any option herein conferred shall not be construed as a waiver or relinquishment to any extent of the right to assert or rely upon such terms or option on any future occasion.

#### 8. Hold Harmless

To the extent permitted by law, and except for the gross negligent acts or omissions of employees, agents and officers of LBUSD, CUSD hereby agrees to hold harmless, indemnify and defend LBUSD and its governing board, officers, agents and employees from all claims, demands, liabilities, losses, damages, or expenses of any nature whatsoever arising from or connected with CUSD's performance of services during the term of this Agreement.

To the extent permitted by law, and except for the gross negligent acts or omissions of employees, agents and officers of CUSD, LBUSD hereby agrees to hold harmless, indemnify and defend CUSD and its governing board, officers, agents and employees from all claims, demands, liabilities, losses, damages, or expenses of any nature whatsoever arising from or connected with the performance of services other than for the operation of CUSD during the term of this Agreement.

#### 9. Independent Contractors

CUSD and LBUSD, in the performance of services pursuant to this Agreement, shall be and act as an independent contractor. Each party understands and agrees that it and all of its employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of either of the parties to this Agreement. Each party assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of its employees as they relate to the services to be provided under this Agreement.

#### 10. Complete Agreement

This Agreement is the complete Agreement of the Parties. Any amendments hereto shall be in writing and shall be dated and executed by both Parties.

#### 11. Applicable Law

This Agreement is governed by California state and federal law, and shall be interpreted as if jointly drafted by the Parties to this Agreement.

#### 12. Severability

If any provision of this Agreement is held to be invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions of this Agreement shall continue in full force and effect.

#### 13. Counterparts

This Agreement may be signed in counterparts. A copy or original of this document with all signature pages appended together shall be deemed a fully executed Agreement. Facsimile signatures shall be deemed as binding as original signatures.

#### 14. Authorized Signatures

The individuals signing this Agreement warrant that they are authorized to do so, and further, that they are authorized to make the promises in this Agreement on behalf of the respective Parties.

#### 15. Governing Board Approval

This Agreement is contingent upon approval by the Parties' respective Governing Boards.

#### **Proposal**

Staff proposes that the Board approve the District's Social Skills Facilitation Project with the Boys and Girls Club of Laguna Beach in the amount of \$32,400 serving students at El Morro, Top of the World Elementary, and Thurston Middle School.

#### **Background**

The District has been able to provide additional social skills opportunities for LBUSD elementary and middle school students during lunchtime for the past five years. The program provides students with opportunities to develop stronger connections with peers and adults on campus. Boys and Girls Club staff come daily to create various opportunities for kids to stay engaged. This project started as a pilot during the 2012-13 school year and funding was provided through Medi-Cal dollars. For the 2013-14 school year, the program was funded through the generosity of School Power and in 2014-15 and 2015-16, the District funded the project. The program continues to meet a need and meetings are held with sites and Boys & Girls club annually to discuss program improvements

#### **Budget Impact**

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is authorized by Section 53060 of the California Government Code to contract with and employ any persons for the furnishing of special services and advice in financial, economic, accounting, engineering, legal or administrative matters, if such persons are specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required; and

WHEREAS, DISTRICT is in need of such special services and advice; and

WHEREAS, CONTRACTOR is specially trained and experienced and competent to perform the special services required by the DISTRICT, and such services are needed on a limited basis;

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:

1. <u>Services to be provided by Contractor</u>:

Social Skills Facilitation Project

Six (6) providers at a rate of \$20.00 per hour

3 providers- 1 hour x 180 days = \$10,800

4 providers- 1.5 hours x 180 days = \$21,600

- 2. <u>Term.</u> CONTRACTOR shall commence providing services under this AGREEMENT on **09/05/17** and will diligently perform as required and complete performance by **6/21/18**.
- 3. <u>Compensation.</u> DISTRICT agrees to pay the CONTRACTOR for services satisfactorily rendered pursuant to this AGREEMENT a total fee not to exceed <u>Thirty Two thousand four hundred dollars (\$32,400.00)</u> DISTRICT shall pay CONTRACTOR according to the following terms and conditions: Upon receipt of invoices
- **4.** <u>Expenses.</u> DISTRICT shall not be liable to CONTRACTOR for any costs or expenses paid or incurred by CONTRACTOR in performing services for DISTRICT, except as follows: **None**
- 5. Independent Contractor. CONTRACTOR, in the performance of this AGREEMENT, shall be and act as an independent contractor. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that he/she and all of his/her employees shall not be considered officers, employees or agents of the DISTRICT, and are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided employees of the DISTRICT and/or to which DISTRICT's employees are normally entitled, including, but not limited to, State Unemployment Compensation or Worker's Compensation. CONTRACTOR assumes the full responsibility for the acts and/or omissions of his/her employees or agents as they relate to the services to be provided under this AGREEMENT. CONTRACTOR shall assume full responsibility for payment of all federal, state and local

taxes or contributions, including unemployment insurance, social security and income taxes with respect to CONTRACTOR's employees.

- 6. <u>Materials</u>. CONTRACTOR shall furnish, at his/her own expense, all labor, materials, equipment, supplies and other items necessary to complete the services to be provided pursuant to this AGREEMENT, except as follows: <u>None</u>. CONTRACTOR's services will be performed, findings obtained, reports and recommendations prepared in accordance with generally and currently accepted principles and practices of his/her profession.
- Originality of Services. CONTRACTOR agrees that all technologies, formulae, procedures, processes, methods, writings, ideas, dialogue, compositions, recordings, teleplays, and video productions prepared for, written for, submitted to the DISTRICT and/or used in connection with this AGREEMENT, shall be wholly original to CONTRACTOR and shall not be copied in whole or in part from any other source, except that submitted to CONTRACTOR by DISTRICT as a basis for such services.
- 8. <u>Copyright/Trademark/Patent</u>. CONTRACTOR understands and agrees that all matters produced under this AGREEMENT shall become the property of DISTRICT and cannot be used without DISTRICT's express written permission. DISTRICT shall have all right, title and interest in said matters, including the right to secure and maintain the copyright, trademark and/or patent of said matter in the name of the DISTRICT. CONTRACTOR consents to use of CONTRACTOR's name in conjunction with the sale, use, performance and distribution of the matters, for any purpose and in any medium.
- 9. <u>Termination</u>. DISTRICT may, at any time, with or without reason, terminate this AGREEMENT and compensate CONTRACTOR only for services satisfactorily rendered to the date of termination. *If this Contract price is a Not To Exceed fixed price, termination of contract will occur through proration of fees* Written notice by DISTRICT shall be sufficient to stop further performance of services by CONTRACTOR. Notice shall be deemed given when received by the CONTRACTOR or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

DISTRICT may terminate this AGREEMENT upon giving of written notice of intention to terminate for cause. Cause shall include: (a) material violation of this AGREEMENT by the CONTRACTOR; or (b) any act by CONTRACTOR exposing the DISTRICT to liability to others for personal injury or property damage; or CONTRACTOR is adjudged a bankrupt, CONTRACTOR makes a general assignment for the benefit of creditors or a receiver is appointed on account of CONTRACTOR's insolvency. Written notice by DISTRICT shall contain the reasons for such intention to terminate and unless within five (5) days after service of such notice the condition or violation shall cease, or satisfactory arrangements for the correction thereof be made, this AGREEMENT shall upon the expiration of the five (5) days cease and terminate. In the event of such termination, the DISTRICT may secure the required services from another contractor. If the cost to the DISTRICT exceeds the cost of providing the service pursuant to this AGREEMENT, the excess cost shall be charged to and collected from the CONTRACTOR. The foregoing provisions are in addition to and not a limitation of any other rights or

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remedies available to DISTRICT. Written notice by DISTRICT shall be deemed given when received by the other party, or no later than three days after the day of mailing, whichever is sooner.

- 10. <u>Hold Harmless</u>. CONTRACTOR agrees to and does hereby indemnify, hold harmless and defend the DISTRICT and its governing board, officers, employees and agents from every claim or demand made and every liability, loss, damage or expense, of any nature whatsoever, which may be incurred by reason of:
  - (a) Liability for damages for: (1) death or bodily injury to person; (2) injury to, loss or theft of property; or (3) any other loss, damage or expense arising out of (1) or (2) above, sustained by the CONTRACTOR or any person, firm or corporation employed by the CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, upon or in connection with the services called for in this AGREEMENT, however caused, except for liability for damages referred to above which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.
  - (b) Any injury to or death of any persons, including the DISTRICT or its officers, employees and agents, or damage to or loss of any property caused by any act, neglect, default, or omission of the CONTRACTOR, or any person, firm or corporation employed by the CONTRACTOR, either directly or by independent contract, arising out of, or in any way connected with, the services covered by this AGREEMENT, whether said injury or damage occurs either on or off DISTRICT's property, except for liability for damages which result from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the DISTRICT or its officers, employees or agents.
  - (c) Any liability for damages which may arise from the furnishing or use of any copyrighted or uncopyrighted matter or patented or unpatented invention under this AGREEMENT.
  - (d) Any acts or omissions by CONTRACTOR or any person or corporation employed by CONTRACTOR relating to services to be rendered under this Agreement.
- Insurance. CONTRACTOR agrees to carry a comprehensive general and automobile liability insurance with limits of One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage in a form mutually acceptable to both parties to protect CONTRACTOR and DISTRICT against liability or claims of liability which may arise out of this AGREEMENT. In addition, CONTRACTOR agrees to provide an endorsement to this policy stating, "Such insurance as is afforded by this policy shall be primary, and any insurance carried by DISTRICT shall be excess and noncontributory." CONTRACTOR agrees to carry malpractice and/or professional liability insurance in the amount One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000). Prior to the execution of this Agreement, CONTRACTOR shall provide DISTRICT with certificates of insurance evidencing all coverages and endorsements required hereunder including a thirty (30) day written notice of cancellation or reduction in coverage. CONTRACTOR agrees that not less than 30 days prior to the expiration of any coverage, CONTRACTOR

will provide evidence of renewal to DISTRICT. CONTRACTOR agrees to name DISTRICT and its officers, agents and employees as additional insureds under said policies. CONTRACTOR shall provide proof of current Worker's Compensation insurance for CONTRACTOR'S employees.

- 12. <u>Assignment</u>. The obligations of the CONTRACTOR pursuant to this AGREEMENT shall not be assigned by the CONTRACTOR without the prior written consent of District.
- 13. <u>Compliance With Applicable Laws</u>. The services completed herein must meet the approval of the DISTRICT and shall be subject to the DISTRICT's general right of inspection to secure the satisfactory completion thereof. CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances that are now or may in the future become applicable to CONTRACTOR, CONTRACTOR's business, equipment and personnel engaged in operations covered by this AGREEMENT or accruing out of the performance of such operations.
- 14. <u>Permits/Licenses</u>. CONTRACTOR and all CONTRACTOR's employees or agents shall secure and maintain in force such permits and licenses as are required by law in connection with the furnishing of services pursuant to this AGREEMENT.
- 15. <u>Employment With Public Agency</u>. CONTRACTOR, if an employee of another public agency, agrees that CONTRACTOR will not receive salary or remuneration, other than vacation pay, as an employee of another public agency for the actual time in which services are actually being performed pursuant to this AGREEMENT.
- 16. <u>Entire Agreement/Amendment</u>. This AGREEMENT and any exhibits attached hereto constitute the entire agreement among the parties to it and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous understanding or agreement with respect to the services contemplated, and may be amended only by a written amendment executed by both parties to the AGREEMENT.
- 17. <u>Affirmative Action Employment</u>. CONTRACTOR agrees that it will not engage in unlawful discrimination in employment of persons because of sexual orientation, race, color, religious creed, national origin, ancestry, physical handicap, medical condition, marital status, or sex of such persons.
- 18. <u>Non Waiver</u>. The failure of DISTRICT or CONTRACTOR to seek redress for violation of, or to insist upon, the strict performance of any term or condition of this AGREEMENT, shall not be deemed a waiver by that party of such term or condition, or prevent a subsequent similar act from again constituting a violation of such term or condition.
- 19. <u>Notice</u>. All notices or demands to be given under this AGREEMENT by either party to the other, shall be in writing and given either by: (a) personal service or (b) by U.S. Mail, mailed either by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, with postage prepaid. Service shall be considered given when received if personally served or if mailed on the third day after deposit in any U.S. Post Office. The address to which notices or demands may be given by either party may be changed by written notice given in accordance with the notice provisions of this section.

#### **Proposal**

Staff recommends the creation of an Instructional Assistant, Special Education position for 5.75 hours per day, 10 months per year.

#### Background

This position is required to support an incoming student who will be attending TOW. The District is required to provide a full day instructional assistant, in accordance with the student's IEP, to support the student at school. The District's current pool of instructional assistant positions is at maximum capacity to maintain services to other students.

#### **Budget Impact**

The annual cost of the position is approximately \$24,359 to \$31,450, depending upon the qualifications and experience of the employee selected. The employee would be eligible for health and welfare benefits at 50% share of cost, with a maximum potential cost of \$12,629 for the most expensive plan.

#### **Recommended Action**

Staff recommends the Board of Education approve the creation of an Instructional Assistant, Special Education position for 5.75 hours per day, 10 months per year.

Approval: Superintendent's Employment Contract Amendment #1

#### **Proposal**

The Board President will present the details of the Superintendent's contract amendment #1.

#### **Background**

The Board of Education completed its annual evaluation of Superintendent Viloria on June 29, 2017. In accordance with his contract, Dr. Viloria was evaluated on set performance objectives, which were established in August 2016 based on the goals and objectives of the Board. The Board of Education found Dr. Viloria to be an effective employee throughout the 2016-2017 school year; especially in the areas of 1) providing strong leadership, 2) developing community relationships, 3) business and fiscal oversight, and, 4) leadership development and mentoring. The Board concluded Dr. Viloria merits a positive evaluation in his job performance and recommends revisions to the superintendent's contract.

Recent California legislation requires Superintendent contracts to be ratified during the open session of a regularly scheduled Board Meeting.

Terms of an amendment to the Superintendent's contract were discussed in closed session before the regular meeting of the Board of Education on August 22, 2017. The terms outlined at that time are presented here for approval. Terms of the attached amendment include a salary adjustment, adjustment to monthly expense allowance, and a one-year extension of the contract term through June 30, 2020.

#### **Budget Impact**

The fiscal impact for the 2017-2018 school year is \$11,843 to be paid out of the general fund.

#### **Recommended Action**

It is recommended the Board of Education approve amendment #1 to the superintendent's contract.

# AMENDMENT TO THE EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT Between LAGUNA BEACH UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT and JASON VILORIA, ED.D.

#### I. Term

The Board hereby employs the Superintendent as Superintendent of Schools for a period of three (3) years beginning July 1, 20176, and terminating on June 30, 202019. Should the Superintendent receive a satisfactory evaluation pursuant to this Agreement, this Agreement will be extended for an additional year, so long as the term of the Agreement does not at any time exceed 3 years. An amendment for the extension of the term of this agreement shall be approved at a regularly scheduled Board Meeting.

#### II. Compensation and Expense Allowances

The Superintendent's minimum annual salary shall be two hundred forty-nine thousand three hundred fifty dollars (\$240,0009,350) for twelve (12) months (2425 days, exclusive of vacation) of full-time employment, under this Agreement (July 1, 20176 through June 30, 2020119), payable in twelve (12) equal installments on the last day of each calendar month-commencing July 31, 2016, and ending June 30, 2019. The Superintendent's annual salary for each subsequent year shall be payable in like manner. Commencing with the 2017-2018 school year, the Superintendent shall receive the same salary increase as other certificated management employees during the term of this Agreement. Any such upward adjustment shall be in the form of a mutually agreed upon written amendment and shall become a part of this Agreement. The Board reserves the right to increase the salary of the Superintendent at any time. In an effort to maintain equity with other certificated and administrative personnel, the Superintendent shall receive a salary increase each year of this agreement based on the average or median percentage

increase given on the administrative salary schedule for a step and column raise, as follows:

Step 2 (2017-18)	<u>\$249,350</u>
Step 3 (2018-19)	<u>\$255,126</u>
Step 4 (2019-20)	\$261,048

The Superintendent shall also receive any increases given to the administrative unit based on the results of negotiations. For the 2017-18 school year the Superintendent will also receive a one-time payment of one percent (1%) of base salary in the amount of \$2493.00 in accordance with the compensation package provided to the certificated management group. Any such upward adjustment shall be in the form of a mutually agreed upon written amendment and shall become a part of this Agreement. The Board reserves the right to increase the salary of the Superintendent at any time.

The Superintendent shall receive a monthly expense allowance of \$250 to assist the Superintendent for such expenses as a cell phone, internet, and other expenses that naturally are incurred as the Superintendent conducts the District's business. The Superintendent shall not be required to provide documentation for this allowance. The Superintendent shall receive reimbursement for ordinary and reasonable business expenses pursuant to appropriate procedures of the District, and within the same standards and level of accountability applicable to other certificated management employees of the District. The District also shall provide direct payments to a cellular and email/internet service provider.

The Superintendent shall receive health and welfare benefits and such other fringe benefits as are provided by the District to all other certificated management employees.

The Superintendent shall be required to render twelve months of full and regular service to the District during each annual period covered by this Agreement. The Superintendent shall be entitled to twenty-five (25) days of annual vacation with pay, exclusive of holidays defined in Section 37220 of the California Education Code, and any additional local holidays granted by the Board to twelve-month certificated management employees of the District.

The Superintendent is expected to use vacation days every year. The Superintendent shall accrue or accumulate up to<sub>2</sub> but no more than, fifty (50) vacation days at which point vacation will cease to accrue. Upon termination or expiration of the Agreement, the Superintendent shall be entitled to compensation for all unused and accrued vacation days up to the limit of fifty (50) days at the then current annual salary rate. The Superintendent shall also receive twelve (12) days paid sick leave per school year.

#### III. Severance Pay

Regardless of the term of this Agreement, if it is terminated without cause, the Superintendent shall be paid the maximum allowable cash settlement. The maximum allowable cash settlement shall be an amount equal to his monthly salary multiplied by the number of months remaining on the unexpired term of this Agreement. However, if the unexpired term is greater than twelve (12) months, the maximum cash settlement shall be an amount equal to the monthly salary of the Superintendent multiplied by twelve (12).

Notwithstanding the above, as required by Government Code section 53243.2, if this Agreement is terminated, regardless of the remaining term of the Agreement, any cash settlement related to the termination that Superintendent receives from the District shall be fully reimbursed to the District if the Superintendent is convicted of a crime involving an abuse of his office or position, as defined by Government Code section 53243.4.

#### IV. Duties

The Superintendent shall perform the duties of a public school district superintendent prescribed by the laws of the State of California. The Superintendent shall act as Secretary to the Board. In addition to the powers and duties set forth in Education Code Section 35035, the Superintendent shall have the powers and duties which are delegated to him by the Board. Superintendent's duties shall include, but not be limited to all the normal responsibilities of a public school superintendent as well as the execution of all directives of a majority of the members of the Board which are reasonably related to the superintendency. The Superintendent will serve as an effective educational leader in the District and will serve as the District's representative to the public.

The Superintendent shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the District. As such, the Superintendent shall have the primary responsibility for execution of Board Policies, whereas the Board shall retain the primary responsibility for governance of the District through the delegation of duties and responsibilities to the Superintendent as well as for formulating and adopting Board Policies.

The Superintendent shall have the exclusive right to make recommendations with regard to the employment of all other employees of the District.

#### V. Full-Time Employment

Commencing on July 1, 2016, The Superintendent agrees to devote his full time and efforts to the position of Superintendent of Schools for the District. With prior written approval, the Superintendent may undertake outside professional activities for remuneration including consulting, teaching, speaking, and writing provided that all such outside professional activities do not interfere with the Superintendent's ability to perform duties under this Agreement.

The Superintendent may attend professional conferences inside and outside of California, but the Superintendent shall obtain prior approval for special conferences inside and all conferences outside of California. Prior approval is not required for California curricular, legislative and finance/budgetary conferences and conferences held by the Association of California School Administrators, the California City Superintendents, the California School Boards Association, National Association of School Superintendents\*, Computer Using Educators\*, and the American Association of School Administrators (\*when held in California). The District shall pay all necessary and reasonable expenses related to such meetings including registration fees. In addition, Superintendent shall be reimbursed for use of his own automobile for District related travel outside of Orange County on a mileage basis in accordance with Board policy and/or administrative procedure.

The Superintendent shall endeavor to maintain and improve his professional competence by all available means. The Superintendent may subscribe to appropriate periodicals and journals, and may join and participate in appropriate professional organizations.

The District shall pay membership dues for the Superintendent in professional organizations and service organizations up to a maximum of eighteen hundred dollars (\$1,800) each school year of this Agreement. Payment by the District of any other membership dues is conditioned upon prior approval by the Board.

#### VI. Performance Objectives and Evaluation Procedures

1. On or before September 1, 2016, the Superintendent shall schedule a special meeting of the Board for the purpose of establishing the Superintendent's performance objectives for the first year under this Agreement (July 1, 2016, through June 30, 2017). Prior to August 31 of each following year the Board and the Superintendent shall meet to establish the Superintendent's performance objectives for the coming year and by November 30<sup>th</sup> the Superintendent shall provide the Board with a written plan to meet the identified performance objectives in a mutually agreed upon format.

The Superintendent's performance objectives shall be based on duties referenced in this Agreement, the goals and objectives of the Board, and such other criteria or indices of achievement which may be mutually agreed to by the Board and Superintendent.

2. The Board shall evaluate the Superintendent's job performance at least once per year during the term of this Agreement. This evaluation shall be in writing and given by June 30<sup>th</sup> of each year. However, the Superintendent after consultation with the Board President may schedule periodic evaluation conferences in closed session so that the Board may informally evaluate the Superintendent on a regular basis. It is anticipated that this should occur (34) times each year or as needed to enhance communication.

The Superintendent shall have the right to initiate a written reaction or response to any written evaluation. Such response shall become a permanent attachment to the evaluation placed in the Superintendent's personnel file. A conference shall be held between the Superintendent and the Board to discuss any written evaluation to be placed in his personnel file.

3. In the event the Board determines that the Superintendent's performance is unsatisfactory, the written evaluation shall indicate the reasons for the unsatisfactory evaluation, and shall make recommendations to give guidance and direction to the Superintendent so that he may improve his performance.

#### VII. Miscellaneous

This Agreement may be modified at any time by mutual agreement of the Board and Superintendent.

The Superintendent hereby represents that he is, on the date of this Agreement, a holder of a valid California school administrative credential and a valid California teaching credential. The Superintendent agrees to maintain such credentials throughout the term of this Agreement.

This Agreement is subject to all applicable laws of the State of California, rules and regulations of the State Board of Education of California, and all rules and regulations of the Board, including but not limited to Government Code Sections 53260 and 53261, incorporated herein.

All promises and covenants contained herein are severable, and in the event any of them shall be held invalid by court or competent jurisdiction, this Agreement shall be interpreted as if such invalid promises or covenants were not contained herein.

#### **Proposal**

Staff proposes the Board of Education approve Resolution #17-19: Increase 2016-2017 Gann Limit by \$741,150.82 and Adoption of the 2016-2017 and 2017-2018 District Appropriations Subject to GANN Limits. The public notice announcing the proposed increases, as well as the audited actuals for 2016-2017, were posted at the district office, each school site and on the district website on August 24, 2017.

#### **Background**

Each year the Board approves the GANN Limit calculation. The numbers that go into the calculation are based on specific formulas set by the State according to applicable constitutional and statutory law and supplied to the District by the California Department of Education.

For the 2016-2017 GANN Limit Calculation, there is an increase in the appropriations limit of \$741,150.82. The increase of the appropriations limit will permanently increase our appropriations limit and should have virtually no adverse effect due to our increase being absorbed in the State's own total GANN limit. Government code 7902.1(a) states:

If, beginning with the 1980-81 fiscal year or any fiscal year thereafter, the proceeds of taxes of a school district, community college district, or county superintendent of schools, exceed its appropriations limit determined pursuant to Section 7902 for that fiscal year, the governing body of the school district, community college district, or the county superintendent of schools, may increase its appropriations limit to an amount equal to its proceeds of taxes.

Approval by the Board of Education of Resolution #17-19: Increase of \$741,150.82 Appropriations Limit to the 2016-2017 GANN Limit will satisfy the requirement of Government Code Section 7902.1(a).

#### **Budget Impact**

No budget impact will result from approval of this Resolution.

#### **Recommended Action**

- AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Board does hereby declare that the appropriations in the Budget for the 2016-17 and 2017-18 fiscal years do not exceed the limitations imposed by Proposition 4;

#### **Proposal**

Staff proposes the Board of Education approve a temporary interfund transfer of \$6,000,000 from the Special Reserve for Non-Capital Outlay (17) to the General Fund (01).

#### **Background**

Pursuant to Education Code Section 42603, the governing board of any school district may direct that moneys held in any fund or account be temporarily transferred to another fund or account of the district for payment of obligations.

The months of October through December are the low cash balance months in the General Fund. Major payrolls begin September 30 and the first major cash receipt from property taxes arrives mid-December. The cash shortage in the General Fund during this period is estimated at \$6,000,000. Therefore, it is requested that funds be transferred from the Special Reserve for Non-Capital Outlay to the General Fund on or about September 13, 2017 with the plan to repay the temporary borrowing on or about December 20, 2017.

An information agenda item will be prepared in January noting the return transfer to Fund 17.

#### **Budget Impact**

There is no impact to the budget. The cash balance will increase the General Fund and decrease the Special Reserve for Non-Capital Outlay by \$6,000,000 for approximately three months.

#### **Recommended Action**

Staff recommends the Board of Education approve Resolution 17-20: Temporary interfund transfer of \$6,000,000 from the Special Reserve for Non-Capital Outlay (17) to the General Fund (01).
