High Performing schools

In October, Palos 118 was recognized as one of the top performing elementary school districts in Illinois. Awarded Exemplary and Commendable ratings from the state, our schools earned high marks for academic growth, grade level proficiency, student attendance and school climate. In November, Palos 118 received the first ever perfect score of any South Cook school district during a state compliance visit. To cap off a successful 2019, annual Health/ Life Safety Inspections completed at all three schools resulted in "no findings" for a second year in a row. We are so proud of these accomplishments! Palos 118 provides students an engaging, rigorous, and wellrounded educational experience at a reasonable cost compared to school districts statewide. In fact, we spend less than the state average when it comes to educating children and our students on average outperform their peers statewide. According to our 2019 Illinois Report Card, Palos 118's instructional cost per pupil was \$8,051 compared to the state average of \$8,172. Our total operational cost per student was below the state average in Fiscal Year 2019.

Great Investment

Top rated school districts attract young families to local communities and Palos 118 is no exception. Not only is our school district attractive to parents, so is our tax rate for homeowners. Palos 118's tax rate is the lowest of the six elementary school districts that feed into Consolidated High School District 230. Our AA+ bond rating and the ability to retire debt quickly allows us to provide students outstanding facilities and services at the lowest possible cost to residents.



Challenges AHEAD

Two years ago, the General Assembly passed a new school funding formula that severely limits the increase in state support for school districts like 118. In a nut shell, Springfield has frozen state support for our school district making us even more reliant on local funding to operate. Coupled with property tax caps that limit the annual increase in local taxes devoted to education, paying for our current programs and services while maintaining a balanced budget will be increasingly difficult in the years ahead.
