The District is governed by a five-member Board of Education, members of which are elected on an at-large basis for four-year terms.

The Board of Education encourages citizens, including staff members and students, to attend board meetings, and it welcomes all views on subjects related to the school district. Questions related to the employees of the district will not be permitted; such questions should be referred to the superintendent at another time. It is requested that comments be limited to five minutes. Please contact the superintendent's office in advance to receive a copy of the board meeting agenda. Agendas will be also be available in the board room during each meeting.

Regular meetings are held at 6 p.m. (unless the hour is designated by the Board of Education) on the third Thursday of each month. All meetings are held in the Administration Building at 1820 Main Street unless changed by the Board of Education.

We will be results oriented. High expectations and clear goals will chart our course. Knowledge, data and research will provide direction for our decisions.


We resolve to take action and follow through with a sense of urgency when needs are identified as indicated by our data.

In advisory, there are 30 minutes available nearly every day where students can receive help from their math teachers. Just get a pass from a math teacher ahead of time.



School Of Choice Permits

If your student lives outside of the boundaries for MRHS, then be sure to complete a School of Choice Permit Application. The deadline to turn in the School of Choice application is February 28th for the 2020-2021 school year.

All returning students on a boundary waiver must complete a new form each year.



We strongly encourage 8th graders from our Jr. High Schools, who will be Freshmen for the 2020-2021 school year, to submit their School of Choice Application by January 22nd.

This will ensure applications are processed in time for the scheduling deadline of January 27, 2020.

Immunization

Students health records at Mesa Ridge HS are continually reviewed for compliance with state requirements. You may have received a notice of non your child's records to be -compliance if your child's records are not compliant with state requirements. If you have not provided a copy of your child's shot records to the school, then please do so as soon as possible.

The most common out of compliance immunizations are for chickenpox (varicella) and MMR (measles, mumps, and rubella). Colorado requires 2 doses of each of these

vaccines with the proper amount of time between doses, and given at the correct age. Please check sure that they are protected from these communicable diseases and compliant with CO State Requirements.

CO law requires all students, K-12, attending Colorado schools be vaccinated against certain diseases, unless an official personal or a medical exemption form is filed on the state website and a copy given to the school. Since 7/1/2016, new

are required annually, under Colorado Board of Health rule 6 CCR 1009-2. Outdated or alternate forms are not allowed. The personal exemption

forms expire June 30th each year

and must be renewed online. For the safety of unvaccinated students, students with an exemption form, (or no shot records on file at all with the school) may be kept out of school during a disease outbreak.

Students with medical exemptions signed by a MD, DO, NP or PA, need to submit this form only once, unless the student's information or school changes.

PHOTOGRAPHY

The new Photography courses are in full swing. Our first semester course; Fundamentals of Photography has been successfully articulated with PPCC. That means that students who pass the course with an A or B, for \$5 can use our course as college credit for the Intro Photography class at PPCC.

We are also continuing to expand the opportunities available to our students in the Photography program. The second year of the program is focused on learning how to use Adobe Photoshop and InDesign. In addition to the Adobe software programs we use, we are adding another software that will allow them to transform their photographs into fine art easily and quickly.

For our advanced students, we will be looking to add another course geared to Advanced Placement for Photography. It will present real world problems for students to solve, so that they gain a better understanding of the workplace. That course is currently in the development stages. It should be ready to go in the fall of 2021.

As always, we are striving to add to our collection of equipment. We have recently received a few more cameras, so now students may be allowed to check one out. This will help students not only keep up with their work, but allow them to have a wider variety of subject matter than what is at school.

Some of our Photography students from last year are benefitting from having a professional photographer come to Mesa to work with them. They are expanding their knowledge of Photoshop and even getting to experiment with full frame cameras. The you Mrs. Rachel Riley for that!
