Windsor School will be celebrating Red Ribbon Week the week of October 28th! School Counselors and members of the Student Council coordinated their efforts to promote substance awareness and living substance free. Our school health committee networked with Mt Ascutney Community Outreach (MAPP) and Turning Point to host a kickoff presentation for students in grades 7-12 and to create a K-6 Asset Development activity that challenges students to make new connections within the Windsor community and school.

Counselors, Nurses, Social-Emotional Interventionists and Administrators from across WSESU participated in a 2 day training on Emotional CPR for students (people) in crisis, using 3 simple steps: C = Connecting, P = emPowering, and R = Revitalizing. Emotional CPR is recognized internationally and is currently used in several public health organizations. 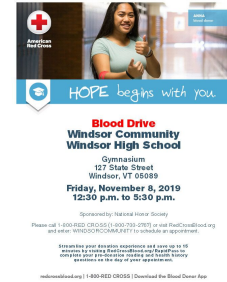
