*Academic Games – Mr. Brad Kavo

Students participate in six local tournaments where they compete in social studies, language arts, and mathematics games. Qualifiers may also compete at the national tournament.

*Art Club – Mrs. Jennifer Rodriguez

This club welcomes all students, whether or not you are an art student, to come and work on new or existing art projects with fellow creative classmates.

*Band - Concert, Jazz, Marching - Mr. Jason Cheskawich, Marching Band, Concert Band, & Jazz Bands, Wind Ensemble, and various small ensembles.

Members must be skilled in playing an instrument. *Concert Band and Wind Ensemble* are credited and scheduled courses.

Blender Club – Mrs. Heather Pessy

The goals are to get the members excited about the Free and Open Source (FOSS) software, Blender, a professional and cross-platform, platform for 3D graphics, animation, Match Moving, VFX, and much more.

Cafeteria Advisory Council - Mr. Nolen Fetchko and Mr. John Saban

The council will meet with the Mt. Lebanon School District Food Service Director to provide feedback and offer menu suggestions.

*Chamber Choir – Mr. Ethan LaPlaca

Chamber Choir is a co-ed auditioned ensemble for Juniors and Seniors only. Students must be enrolled in Concert Choir to audition. Classical, chamber style repertoire is the primary focus. Rehearsals and performance opportunities outside of school are a requirement of this ensemble.

The school newspaper is published monthly. To participate, students must be enrolled in the Journalism production class (Journalism 1 is a prerequisite). Journalism production is a credited scheduled course.

<u>Science Olympiad Club</u> - Mrs. Pam Harris (<u>pharris@mtlsd.net</u>)

Science Olympiad is a team competition in which students collaboratively participate in 23 events across various STEM disciplines, including earth and space science, biology, chemistry, physics, forensics, engineering, and experimental design. Some events are written tests, while other involved building Rube Goldberg devices or balsa planes or 3D models of proteins, and others are hands-on lab tasks. Qualifying students will have a chance to compete at the regional, state, and national levels.

*Ski Club – Mr. Rob Bergstresser and Mr. Andrew Kuskil

During the winter months, skiers and snowboarders attend one day of the weekend trips to local ski resorts and one long weekend trip to an out of state resort.

*Spanish Club – Mrs. Sue Quintero

This club is for students interested in Spanish culture and in speaking the language.
