What will the proposed bond projects cost?

The 2020 bond proposal is a **ZERO-TAX-RATE-INCREASE PROPOSAL.** This means that the **5.85 mills** the district is currently levying per household will <u>not</u> change. The bond would generate approximately **\$59,475,000** and allow the district to fund proposed projects while keeping general fund dollars in our classrooms.



Why is the District proposing a bond program now?



Favorable interest rates at this time mean the District could complete projects with a **ZERO-TAX-RATE INCREASE** over the current amount levied.
