GHAITH BOWLS PERFECT GAME TO LEAD IRISH AT MERCY/UD INVITE

The Notre Dame Boys and Girls Bowling teams took part in the Mercy/UD Invite at Super Bowl lanes. The Boys team placed eight overall, finishing with the highest total pin count (3371) in school history and also bowling its highest baker game (312) in over four years. Anthony Ghaith led the way for the Irish, bowling the best game and series of his career en route to a second place finish. Ghaith bowled a perfect game of 300 to finish with a three-game series of 715, setting both a school record of high game and high series. On the Girls side, the Irish also placed eight as a team. Theresa Carrier tied for eighth place to medal in the top-10. Personal records were set by Kaity Heaman for high series, Mia Mojares for high game and high series, Palmer Wensley for high series, Zachary Hogan for high series and Harley Collins for high series. Therese also Allard shot a personal record high game of 189 as well.

IRISH GRAB WIN OVER LAPEER

The Notre Dame Girls Varsity Basketball team defeated Lapeer 37- 36. The Irish were led by Malorie Wilson's double-double of 17 points and 11 rebounds. Justina Gaynor had nine points for the Irish and Jenna Schultz added five points. The Irish move to 3-7 on the season and will host Chelsea on Friday.

GIRLS BASKETBALL PICKS UP WIN OVER LHN

The Notre Dame Girls Varsity Basketball team picked up a 44-32 win over Macomb Lutheran North heading into the Holiday break. Malorie Wilson led the Irish with 21 points in the win while Justina Gaynor added 15 for Notre Dame.
