• Participation

You are expected to participate in all of our class activities.

• Concentration

Be attentive and not talk when teacher is instructing.

Rules---

- You always need to display your ID when you come to the classroom.
- Don't put your IPad on the desk until it is permitted.
- You need to charge your cell phone/IPad at home every day.

You cannot charge your cell phone/IPad in the classroom.

- You must turn off cell phone before entering the classroom.
- Drinks and food are not allowed.
- You need to be responsible for your own behavior.
- At all times no electronics will be allowed in the classroom.
- No personal grooming or make-up is allowed to take place in the classroom.
- Don't leave the classroom until teacher dismissal.
- Don't abuse or misuse furniture or supplies.
- Don't do any other subject in Chinese class.
- If you go to the restroom during class, you need to sign out and sign in when you return.

6. Test Retakes

- Students who fail a major test (below 70%) will be allowed to retake up to a 70% grade. This does not include semester examinations.
- Students are expected to make arrangements with the teacher to retake a test.
- Students are encouraged to participate in tutoring opportunities before retaking a test.
- All retakes must be completed prior to the end of each six week grading period.
