<p>Dr. Courtney Amor, Orthopedic Surgeon</p> 	<p>Dr. Amor has lived in Houston, Texas since 2007. He completed his training in Orthopedic Surgery at Baylor College of Medicine. Prior to beginning practice, Dr. Amor elected to pursue an additional year of subspecialty training in disorders of the hand and upper extremity at Texas Children's Hospital and Shriners Hospital for Children, which gave him a special understanding of hand and upper extremity problems affecting children and babies. Dr. Amor specializes in treating disorders of the hand, wrist, elbow, and shoulder. This includes fractures, dislocations, tendon injuries, nerve injuries, arthritis, and sports injuries.
