#### **Preparing for High School**

Eighth-grade students will be asked to choose an endorsement, similar to a college major as it is an "area of interest" that students may pursue in high school. The five endorsement areas are Arts and Humanities, Business and Industry, STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math), Public Service, and Multidisciplinary Studies. Students are able to earn more than one endorsement and change endorsement any time before their junior year. A pathway is a series of course options needed to earn a particular endorsement. There are several pathways within an endorsement.

We are pleased to announce the launch of the SBAI High School Mentoring Program for your student in the 2020 Spring semester.

#### Program Overview

The SBAI High School Mentoring Program matches our 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> graders with mentor professionals working in careers that align with student-identified interests. Career mentors are recruited, vetted and trained in collaboration with SBISD's Partnership and Volunteer Programs team.

#### Role of the Career Mentor

Career Mentors are volunteers who have expressed a desire to work with our students and to provide career exposure and post-secondary guidance. Your child will spend between 30 – 45 minutes with his/her mentor at school bi-weekly during school hours. Through the program, your child's mentor may support your child in such areas as building positive self-image, goal setting, and planning for the future.

#### Mentor Guidelines

Mentors have participated in the district's mentor training, have completed the Spring Branch ISD Volunteer Background Check, and have been cleared for service by the SBISD Police Department and Human Resources department. They also have agreed to abide by the SBISD Volunteer Ethics, Procedures and Guidelines.

Mentors may not provide individual mentoring activities outside of school or during non-school hours. Communication through electronic media is prohibited, except in some instances by parent/guardian consent as described on the Spring Board Mentor Parent/Student Agreement Form.

So that your child may participate, please sign and return the enclosed Parent/Student Agreement Form to school as soon as possible.

#### Cancellations/No Shows

Students have two attempts at CBEs/EAs. Cancellation or no shows that occur after exams have been ordered may constitute one attempt.

#### Single Subject Acceleration

Single subject acceleration is available only in mathematics, and is provided during the testing windows listed above. Student performance data must be included with the application. Students scoring an 80% or higher on the exams are eligible for acceleration. Students only through 8th grade math achieving the required score in October may accelerate immediately; those achieving the required score in March, June, or July may accelerate in August of the following school year.

#### **EXAMS FOR ACCELERATION (GRADES 1-8)**

Exams for Acceleration (EA) offers students in grades 1-8 the opportunity to advance one grade level by scoring 80% or higher in each of the four required subject areas. Students desiring to advance one grade level will need the signature of their parent/guardian as well as the building principal or designee. Testing is free for all enrolled SBISD students. Kindergarten students are not eligible for testing until the summer prior to the first grade year.

#### Courses required for acceleration:

- > Grade Level Social Studies
- > Grade Level Science
- > Grade Level Math
- > Grade Level Language Arts

Math and Social Studies exams will be administered first. Fall and spring exams are administered at the student's home campus; summer exams are administered at the SBISD administration building.

Study Guides for EA and CBE assessments may be found at the following link. Some exams require reading of novels (ELA), participation logs (PE), or portfolios (Art); those requirements are listed in the study guides. https://highschool.utexas.edu/cbe\_study\_quides.php

#### **CREDIT BY EXAM\***

Credit by Exam (CBE) offers students the opportunity to gain course credit in the subject area(s) being tested. CBEs may be taken with or without prior instruction, and testing is free for all enrolled SBISD students. Fall and spring exams are administered at the student's home campus; summer exams are administered at the SBISD administration building.

When high school course credit is earned through Credit by Exam, the course and the score of the test are posted to the student's transcript. However, the score will not impact the student's Grade Point Average.
