Students in Advanced Concepts in our Engineering Signature Program showcased their design projects in a trade show format at the conclusion of the fall semester. Examples of some of the projects included a functioning prosthetic finger designed in Fusion 360, a renovation of a house using REVIT, and a standard vise for everyday use designed using Inventor.
