AP & HONORS COURSES

- You must have a discussion with your parent(s) and get initials from your current teachers when selecting an AP/H course.
- Minimum → semester commitment
- Possibility of obtaining **College Credit** through AP courses.
- **AP/Honors courses are rigorous**
- Want to appeal a recommendation? See your teacher.
This must be done by the end of the school year.

Junior Core Classes:

- English Language Arts 3
- US History
- Math*
- Science*

* Next course depends on current math and science course. Math will be pre-recommended.

****Are you behind on credits?**

If so, contact your counselor to create a credit recovery plan.

Other Information:

- All students must have a full schedule.
- NCAA Eligibility - p 20
 - Must register with NCAA Eligibility Center by end of Junior Year
 - It is VERY IMPORTANT that you sign up for courses that are approved by the NCAA! Make a note on your enrollment card if you may want to play college sports. You should also be discussing with your coach.
- To be eligible for sports or activities next year you must pass 5 classes with a letter grade this semester.

KANSAS SCHOLARS CURRICULUM

Eligibility for Kansas State Scholarship

Applicants will be designated as a State Scholar during their senior year of high school if they:

- Take the **ACT by the end of December** of senior year &
- **Complete the Kansas Scholars curriculum:**
 - 4 years of English
 - 4 years of math (Alg. 1, Geometry, Alg. 2, & 1 unit of advanced math)
 - 3 years of science (biology, chemistry, & physics)
 - 3 years of social studies
 - 2 years of world language

Designation is based on an index combining the ACT composite score & GPA.

- Applicants must complete the FAFSA. **Awards are based on financial need.**

College Campus Study (page 17)

Available to Juniors and Seniors

- Courses can be taken at local colleges and elective credit will be given on your high school transcript.
- Needs Counselor & Administrative approval.
- The costs are the responsibility of the student.*
- Students **MUST** enroll in a full schedule high school schedule now; courses will be dropped after you enroll in the college courses.

*Some community colleges are able to waive tuition for certain career technical courses via Excel CTE.

GRADUATION WORKSHEET-(Class of 2021)

- Log into Skyward and go to Graduation Requirements
 - 5.5 credits = sophomore
 - 11.5 credits = junior
 - 16.5 credits = senior
 - 23.5 credits = graduate
- This worksheet turns into your transcript which will be sent to colleges and/or employers.
- If you notice a problem, see your counselor to discuss.
- Caution-some repeat credits do not count twice
(for example- repeating a math course)

- **Enter Requests into Skyward Future Scheduling.**

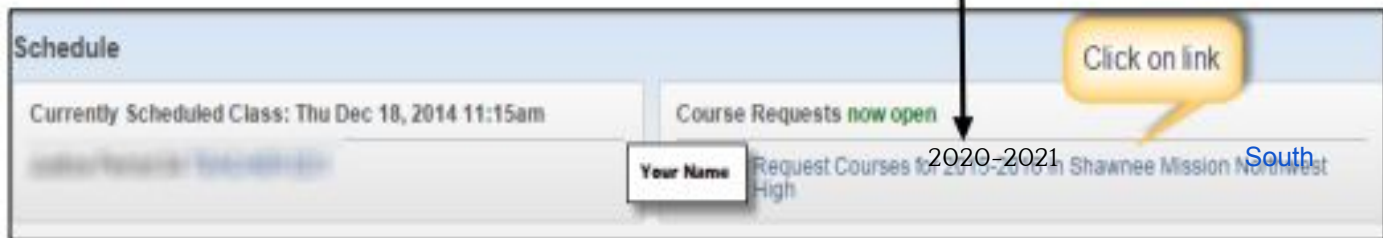
ONLINE COURSE REQUESTS USING STUDENT ACCESS IN SKYWARD
