All W3A positions will work to connect Asian/Asian American Wellesley alumnae to each other through local programming. Director of National Programming (West Coast)

Work with the VP of Programming and the Director of Programming (East Coast) to coordinate local events. This will involve: monthly check ins with VP, occasional conference calls with VP and East Coast Director, delegating work to regional reps, checking in and following up with regional reps to make sure tasks are completed, providing programming suggestions to VP and regional reps based on local knowledge, understanding demographics of local alumnae.
