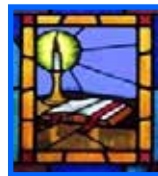

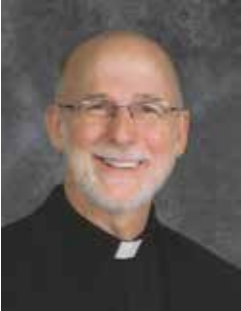

Dear Friends,

Last Sunday starting at about 2:30 PM, a group of parish volunteers worked together to take down the majority of our Christmas decorations in the church. As you can see from the photos on pages 6 & 7, a good time was had by all!

We may not always think of serving as being a fun way to spend one's free time. Nonetheless, this is so often the case. Serving with others as opposed to serving by ourselves brings not only joy but it strengthens relationships.

Working together with a common goal can be very rewarding. I saw this during the 2 ½ hours it took to put away the Christmas decorations. Sometimes, there was downtime and conversations that enabled people to get to know each other better. Conversations Sunday included such comments as "So where do you work?", "I didn't know you were related to so and so," or "I didn't know Fr. Bob knew how to climb a ladder." Ok, maybe I didn't quite hear that last comment correctly!

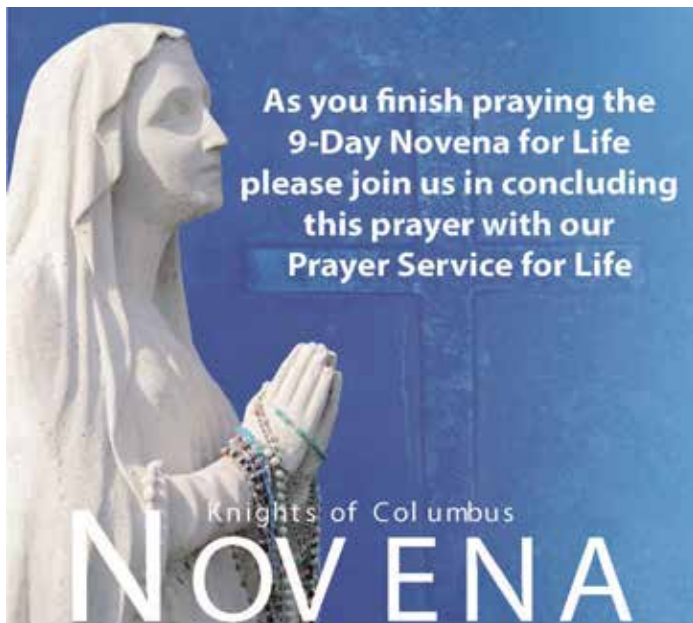

HOW DO TOOTSIE ROLLS HELP SUPPORT DIVINE CHILD SCHOOLS' INSTRUCTIONAL SUPPORT PROGRAM?

Remember last October? Foley Knights and our helpers were at the exit doors of the church wearing our yellow aprons and collecting money for our state Tootsie Roll Drive. Well thanks to your generous donations, we were able to donate \$1,000 to our Divine Child Schools' ISP.

That's right, I said "Divine Child Schools!" This year the Instructional Support Program that has been a great success in the high school is crossing the parking lot to expand into the grade school. The administrators and teachers are happy to give the students in the grade school the extra help necessary to achieve their own greatness.

The **Instructional Support Program (ISP)** provides academic, behavioral and social accommodations as well as interventions to students who have diagnosed learning differences. The ISP's staff provides three individualized support options for students in the program, all of which are centered around the desire to promote independence, self-advocacy and metacognition. The ISP provides support to over 70 students within the high school and dozens more that will have access to the program at the elementary school. Some of the students who benefit from the program are diagnosed with dyslexia, dysgraphia, autism, cerebral palsy and other impediments that complicate their ability to learn. The Program provides multiple avenues of support to ensure that all students at Divine Child have an opportunity to experience educational opportunities rooted in academic, spiritual and athletic excellence.

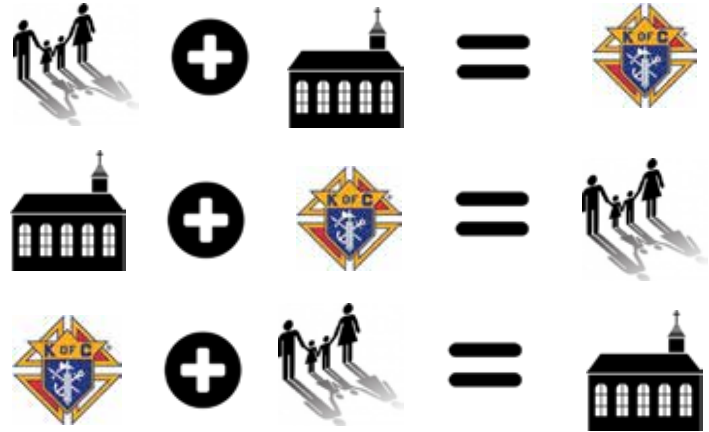
The Program recently received a matching grant of up to \$50,000 from a generous benefactor who has witnessed the benefits of this program. Bishop Foley Council is proud to have donated nearly \$6,000 for the Program since we began donating to ISP in 2017! Right to Life- LIFESPAN Fetus or Child?

Those who have studied anatomy and biology, and those who are experts in human physiology, know very well that there is no material difference between the newborn and fetus. It is noteworthy that pro-aborts refer to the child who is aborted as a fetus, but children who come forth prematurely from the maternal womb are called "premature children." The use of the term "fetus" is a distancing measure; it is much easier for a pro-abortion to say that a "fetus" is killed instead of a "child" or a "baby."

Even more disturbing, it appears that the line between late abortion and active euthanasia is becoming increasingly blurred. The British Royal College of Obstetricians recently asked that doctors be allowed to let seriously disabled newborns die. Let's use the term that makes a greater impact on people; a "child" or a "baby" is killed in an abortion. A newborn is a "child" or a "baby" regardless of challenges that he/she may have.

Sunday of the Word of God



Next week, on the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time, we will celebrate the Sunday of the **Word of God** for the first time. Last year Pope Francis instituted the Sunday of **Word of God**, “so as to appreciate the inexhaustible riches contained in that constant dialogue between the Lord and his people” (Misericordi et Misera, 7). The Scriptures are treasures filled with countless riches! From Genesis to Revelation, God speaks to us in human language. By speaking to us, God reveals His part in this great love story: “God is love, and whoever remains in love remains in God and God in him” (1 John 4:16).

In the Archdiocese of Detroit, we hear a lot about the power of the **Word of God**. We speak of the Gospel as something to be unleashed. We recognize that the **Word of God** has the potential to change hearts. When we proclaim the Word to others, they encounter the power of the Word and the person of the Word: Jesus Christ. But have you personally spent enough time hearing what Jesus is saying to you through the Word?

Pope Francis is asking everyone in the Church, every diocese, parish, family, and parishioner, to read and listen to the **Word of God** anew. In preparation for the celebration of the Sunday of the **Word of God**, consider your favorite Scripture passage. How has God used it to speak to you, change your heart, lead you, or bring you peace? Ask yourself how can I be open in these coming days to receive the gift of loving the **Word of God** more? How can I make my own these words from today’s psalm, “In the written scroll it is prescribed for me, to do your will, O my God, is my delight, and your law is within my heart” (Psalm 40:8-9)?
