

The defending MHSAA State Champion Notre Dame Girls Varsity Ski team earned wins in all three head-to-head races against Bloomfield Hills, Everest and Rochester Adams in the Giant Slalom (GS) in their first meet of the season. Notre Dame took 1st-2nd-3rd-4th places individually against Bloomfield and Everest and 2nd-3rd-4th-5th places against Rochester Adams. The dominating run order was led by Senior Meghan Kozole, Junior Keely McLeod, Freshman Sydney Schulte, and Junior Hailey Schindler. Also with strong finishes in their first Varsity GS races were Freshmen Claire Kirchner and Peyton Schindler, finishing in 10th and 15th respectively. The Irish also placed four in the top-10 at the Don Terrell Off-The-Wall-Invite, finishing second as a team. Kozole (4th), Schindler (5th), Schulte (7th) and junior captain Delaney Flavin (9th) led the way for Notre Dame.

SWIM GRABS DUAL MEET WIN OVER SOUTHFIELD; HOCKEY HOLDS ON FOR WIN AGAINST DIVINE CHILD

SWIMMERS GET WIN OVER SOUTHFIELD

The Notre Dame Boys Varsity Swimming team defeated Southfield A&T Tuesday by a score of 103-52. The Irish victory included first place finishes in all eleven events competed. Event winners included Anthony Dupuis (200 Free and 100 Backstroke), Griffin Gushman (100 Fly and 100 Breaststroke), Sam Burek (200 IM and 100 Free) and Lars Boehme (500 Free and 50 Free). Several personal best times were posted as well, including Faris Mahjoub dropping 5.6 seconds and Burek dropping 1.34 in the 100 Free. Dupuis had an improvement in the 200 Free, Oliver Kayi improved by 1.17 seconds in the 100 Breaststroke and Nick Mazzola dropped 4.08 seconds leading off the 400 Free Relay. The biggest drop of the night was by Miguel Martinez, who improved by an incredible 7.14 seconds in the 100 Backstroke. "It's great to have an evenly matched meet to see how the boys perform against equally sized teams. Most meets are difficult for us to gauge how we compare based on the fact that we are outnumbered and we have no divers, which makes winning difficult. These types of meets raise the teams awareness of just how good they actually are. Their hard work really pays off," said Coach McGreevy after the meet. The next dual meet is a home event against Harper Woods High School on Thursday.

HOCKEY HOLDS ON FOR WIN OVER DIVINE CHILD

The Notre Dame Hockey team earned a 2-1 win at Divine Child. After a scoreless opening period, Vincent Anderson had two second period goals, one at even strength and one shorthanded. The Falcons responded with a goal early in the third but could not beat Teddy Ecker (20 saves) for the equalizer. Jack Anderson, Brett Tice and Ecker added assists in the victory.
