Here are the reasons for nominations

Karen Smith Baker '70

Kindness, humility, generosity, and grace are the qualities that define Gladys in my mind and heart. Her commitment to her faith knows no bounds. She lives and breathes the Sacred Heart values and standards.

Diane Skowron Evans '70

Genteel, yet fiercely loyal to her faith, family and friends. Her smile and twinkle in her eyes are her beloved trademarks. Gladys has experienced so much escaping from Cuba as a child, leaving a life behind; only to have to start anew in the US. Her constant companion and comfort has been being a Child of the Sacred Heart both in Cuba and in Chicago.

Carol Purcell Gillig '70

She is truly a devout, spiritual person. She is thoughtful, considerate and good natured who is always optimistic. She is gracious and truly ladylike who sets an example by not only her kind words but her actions.

Katherine Schneider Grantham '70

- from the AASH website: on St. Philippine Duchesne's voyage from France to the New World Cuba's shores were the first land she saw, and wrote St. Madeleine Sophie Barat that Cuba was an "earthly paradise."

-Gladys went from prominence and plenty in Cuba, to living in exile in Mexico for a year in hopes that Castro would not endure, to a refugee camp in Miami, without her parents, but with her two younger brothers via Operation Peter Pan of Catholic Charities at age nine. She had a doll and a few other items. Her father soon followed to Miami and moved them to Chicago where eventually the entire family was reunited but had to adapt to changed lives and a new language.

- the best of what being a member of the Sacred Heart family represents, since Gladys was at the convent of the SH in Cuba, is the consistency in Gladys's life that Sheridan Road offered in her educational experience and its faith tradition. Mother Fisher, in 1964, welcomed her and declared that "Gladys is ours." The mission of the RSCJs was fulfilled in Gladys as a "child of the Sacred Heart," as Madeleine Sophie said she would found the order for the sake of one child.

- Gladys humbly worked to fit into life at Sheridan Road as a middle schooler, always with a superb sense of humor and outlook on life that we cherish to this day, and graduated as high school Valedictorian of the class of 1970.

- it's fitting that she would end her career as principal of a Catholic School The Embers -she is defined by her generosity to all: her six children, 13 grandchildren, husband, Lou Davis, of 46 years and a grateful Sheridan Road community.
