<u>Report</u>: Superintendent Washburn announced that Board Chair Cotton and Director Garcia were both excused this evening. We will therefore postpone Part 2 of the November survey staff responses— until the full board is present.

Mr. Washburn reported that a software update on the telephone system was not successful, and technicians will continue efforts to restore the system to an acceptable operating level.

Fullerton IV. Elementary School Library feedback from community and staff members. Mr. Washburn reviewed both enrollment and attendance, and numbers appear to be stabilizing. Chronic attendance (students missing more than 10% of school days) remains too high at 29.89%, but is less than last year (35.06%) seeming to indicate that efforts at our schools are having an impact.

Action Items: The School Board approved the Consent Agenda that consisted of minutes from the January 27th Regular Board Meeting. A resignation for the purpose of retirement effective June 10, 2016, was accepted from RHS TAP Room Teacher, Stephanie Neyhart following 26 years in the District. A resignation was also accepted from Hucrest Elementary Teacher, Jana Gore, following nine years in the District.

In adopting Resolution 15-16-13, the Board approved the Douglas ESD 2016-17 Local Service Plan.

Revised Policy GCDA/ GDDA: Criminal Records Checks, was approved for Second Reading and Adoption. Policy INDB: Flag Displays and Salutes, was approved for First Reading.

The Board approved the 2014-2015 Audited Financial Statements as prepared by the auditing firm of Kosmatka, Donnelly, and Piels Company. **RHS Student Leadership Report:** Student leadership representatives Lyle "Cooper" Lee, Sydney Holborow and Samantha "Sam" Vath updated the audience on sports, including current basketball, swimming and wrestling results. Spring sport sign ups for track, la crosse, baseball, softball and tennis are coming up.
