**Time & Location:**

The February 28th School Board Meeting was held at 6:00 p.m. in the Fir Grove Library, located at 1360 W. Harvard Blvd., Roseburg, followed by an Executive Session.

**SUPERINTENDENT:****Superintendent's**

**Report:** Dr. Washburn spoke about safety, reporting that Facilities Manager, Tracy Grauf, has been attending school evacuation and lock down drills with fire and law enforcement personnel, identifying areas where we can work to improve. Resulting actions include installation of No Trespass signage and window film, and removal of vegetation/trees. An SRO is now certified to deliver ALICE training. Building leaders will be encouraged to make the training available at least to staff, with encouragement to include students at the secondary level with elementary to follow with possible abbreviated training. Principal Weber plans to communicate with staff and RHS student families that this training is ready to be rolled out.

**Action Items:**

The Board approved the Consent Agenda that consisted of Minutes from the February 21, 2018 Board Meeting. Dr. Washburn announced resignations effective at the end of 2017-18 school year that included Codi Berggreen, PE Teacher at Jo Lane Middle School after three years in the District; Karissa Morrow, RHS Science Teacher,

after nine years in the District; and RHS Language Arts Teacher, Jenny Friedman-Gaskins, after two years in the District.

The Board has approved both Resolution 17-18-15, declaring the week of March 5-9 as Classified Employee Appreciation Week, and Resolution 17-18-16: to approve the 2018-19 Douglas ESD Local Service Plan.

The Board approved the recommendations to approve renewal of Probationary Administrator Contracts; Contract Administrators Three-Year Extensions 2018-2019, 2019-20, 2020-2021; Renewal of Probationary Teacher Contracts—First Year to Second; Second Year to Third; and Third Year to Contract; Contract Teachers, Two-Year Extensions 2018-2019, 2019-2020; Contract Extension for Licensed Staff Returning From Unpaid Leave of Absence; along with Teachers not Returning due to Resignations/Retirements and the Expiration of Temporary Positions.

Policy IGBAK: Special Education - Public Availability of State Application, was approved for Second Reading and Adoption.

RHS Vice-Principal Adam Blue and ISS Teacher Heath Howington reported details about this year's new In-School Suspension Program which appears to be having positive outcomes for RHS Students in balancing academic support and discipline.

The Board also approved the request to pursue a Ford Foundation grant in support of a K-1 Transition Program, as introduced by Winchester CDS Teacher, Ann Carey and District Student Services Director, Richard Burton.

**RHS Student Leadership**

RHS Student Leadership students Josie Campbell and Rourke Martin presented current student activities. Josie reported that posters are being created in support of students affected by the Florida school tragedy. Students are looking forward to the April 13th Mr. RHS "Superhero" fundraiser in the Rose Theatre. The new orange school safety signs have been installed. Student attendance remains a focus of attention and students are eligible to win a laptop or Kindle Fire. Staff members continue to nominate students for PRIDE recognition awards. Rourke shared that spring sports are starting, including golf, tennis, track, baseball, softball and lacrosse. For the first time, the RHS unified basketball team is one of only four teams qualifying for the upcoming March 9-10th state championships.
