<u>Employment Recommendation</u> <u>for Superintendent:</u>

Chair Garcia shared that the Board has now completed the superintendent search process and is making a recommendation to hire Mr. Jared Cordon, the current Administrator for Early Learning & Elementary Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment from Beaverton School District. Board members were unanimous in voting affirmatively to hire Mr. Cordon effective July 1st. The Cordon family was unable to attend this evening, but are looking forward to the move. Mr. Cordon is anticipating a bright, successful future for all Roseburg students, staff and community members.
