Teaching & Learning Director, Robert Emerson, is ahead of schedule with his TAG plan. The Board expects a very positive accreditation report for both RHS and Rose Alternative High School. Lee is preparing his final report to the School Board in early June.

The Board approved Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) in the amount of \$1,697,839 for seismic rehabilitation for Hucrest School and \$736,864 for Melrose School.

The Board approved an addition to the student fees for the 2019-2020 school year with middle school updates.

A schedule for 2019-2020 School Board Meetings was approved by the Board with a modification for October dates.

The Board reviewed Policy KI/ KJ: Public Solicitation/ Advertising in District Facilities. Board members shared their perspectives, acknowledging that most 6A schools within the state have mechanisms in place to encourage patron largess. Additionally, the Board discussed the need to make opportunities available to students on an equitable level. The Board District encouraged administration to research donation and advertising policies used in other districts for the Board's consideration.

PLC Discussion

Phoenix Executive Director, Thomas McGregor and Principal, Brandy Osborn, shared insights with the Board regarding the philosophy of Restorative Justice. The Board actively participated in assessing appropriate RJ responses to various student behavior scenarios, increasing their understanding of the individualized restorative circle processes recommended for students and staff, and reinforcing that effective implementation of Restorative Justice takes time and ideally involves entire communities.

RHS Student Leadership:

Leadership representatives, Marin Gray, Isabelle Hervey and Chelsea Miller shared upcoming events including Living History Day (5/23); a visitation by Senator Wyden (5/25); Choir dinner fundraiser (5/25); Choir concert (5/29); final Band concert (5/30); students preparing for final exams; and the June 6th Baccalaureate. Senior girls enjoyed the annual Mother/ Daughter Tea, with contests and "how well do you know your mother?" games. Homegoing spirit week activities are underway and seniors will gather to watch the sunset together on June 3rd. The Sophomore team won the annual "Volley Buff" game, only to be defeated by the staff Isabelle Hervey and team. Mikayla Sanguins will share co-president duties next year. The RHS senior class will be celebrated this Friday during the Homegoing Assembly. Recent baseball, track, softball, tennis and golf competition results were reported.
