Collaboration Grant Update

The Teaching and Learning update from Dani Jardine regarding the Collaboration Grant has been rescheduled for the January 23rd Board Meeting.

Action Items:

The Board approved the Consent Agenda including Minutes from December 12th, a hiring recommendation and Request for Leave of Absence as noted below:

Recommendation for Hire:

* Sara Hanberg, a Physical Education Teacher at both Fir Grove and Melrose Elementary Schools, a temporary position for the 2018-2019 school year.

Request for Unpaid Leave of Absence

* Roberta Rose, an Instructional Assistant at Joseph Lane Middle School, has requested an unpaid leave of absence from Feb. 1, 2019 through Jan. 1, 2020 for personal development.

Resolution 18-19-12: Accepting and Appropriating the 2018-2019 Collaboration Grant totaling \$757,192 was approved by the School Board. Chief Operations Officer, Cheryl Northam, noted that this award was unknown during the 2018-19 budget adoption.

2019-2020 Budget Calendar

The Board reviewed the proposed 2019-2020 Budget Committee Calendar. Cheryl Northam will make suggested modifications and bring the proposal back at the January 23, 2019 School Board Meeting for consideration.

I-5 Exit 124 Signal Upgrades and Bellows Street Realignment

The Board adopted Resolution 18-19-13, authorizing signing authority for Chief Operations Officer Cheryl Northam to transfer rights to ODOT with regard to the I-5: Exit 124 Signal Upgrades and Bellows Street Realignment. The District will be reimbursed \$79,900 for a small plot of land required for the West Harvard Avenue exit improvements.

Declaration of the Month of January as School Board Appreciation Month

Board of Education members each received a framed copy of the Governor's Proclamation Declaring January 2019 as School Board Appreciation Month, along with individual certificates of appreciation from the District in recognition of the number of years served by each Board member.

Board PLC Activity

COO Cheryl Northam led a Board learning activity focused on understanding the actual benefit costs involved in hiring licensed staff.
