The Board then took official action to:

Finals Week is nearly complete and the new semester will kick off next Monday. The Rose Theatre was the scene last Thursday of a jazz concert including bands from both middle schools, the RHS jazz ensemble and the UCC band.

A Robotics competition on the 19th resulted in two of our four teams advancing. A Big Top Carnival fundraiser is scheduled Feb. 2nd for the RHS Unified Partners Club.
